

## 2015 Municipal Award Perkiomen Township

The Perkiomen Township Board of Supervisors recognizes the value of establishing a positive influence on the water that flows to the Perkiomen Creek across property owned by the Township. Developing and installing stormwater Best Management Practices on Township Property is seen as a way to accomplish this objective.



In addition, by employing BMP's as demonstration projects for Township residents and students of the Perkiomen Valley School District, **the township emphasizes the value of using stormwater BMPs in addressing the**



**issue of water quality.**

The Board plans to use the grants that have been awarded them to assist in fulfilling stormwater BMP's. In keeping with having a positive impact on the environment, in fall 2014 the Township completed the installation of trees and shrubs on its property located on Bridge Street along the Lodal Creek.
