Entry Level programs are introductory activities that allow students to try a program and be introduced to interesting natural areas in the Red Wing area. A participant MUST complete the entry level programs before being allowed to participate in corresponding seasonal core programs.

This trip will be on the Superior Hiking Trail. Students will spend six days hiking the trail along the North Shore Highlands, a unique and rugged landscape, adjacent to the North Shore of Lake Superior. This trail provides rocky overlooks, inland lakes, ponds and cascading rivers and streams. We will leave from the Two Harbors cabin and practice low impact camping along the way.

Min Age: 8th Grade



New this year you will be shown where the thyroid glands are and show you how to avoid them and take them out – these are the glands the DNR are testing for CWD. 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
