Advent at St. John's...

Advent is not an irrelevant, cultural dinosaur but is vital for our well-being. If we are able, during Advent, to relearn the skill of waiting, then it will have value not only for Advent and Christmas, but for the whole of our lives. Advent offers us a gift of such importance that it is life -transforming...In Advent we are invited into a deeper, truer encounter with ourselves, with the world, and, most of all, with God...Without it our Christian journey is impoverished. From The Meaning is in the Waiting by Paula Gooder.

This Advent, as the light is carried into the sanctuary each week by one of our children, we give our full attention to the Word that calls us to be awake, to repent, and to rejoice in the gift of our Lord Jesus, the Light of the World. A beautiful setting of *O Come, O Come, Emmanuel* for choir & congregation will leads us into our Advent waiting each week. The children's Advent Program will be presented on Sunday, December 12, at 10:00 a.m. in the sanctuary.

Christmas at St. John's...

Isaiah proclaims, "A child has been born for us, a son given to us" (Is. 9:6). Isaiah proclaims this son as light, savior, Wonderful Counselor, Prince of Peace. And the New Testament proclaims that this son, this child, is God's Word made flesh. The heavenly host sings, "Glory to God in the highest!" And we, in voices weary yet hope-full, join the chorus of praise.

Christmas Eve Worship Services include:

- 5:00 p.m. Children's Service. Planned specifically for the little ones' attention spans & bedtimes, this service includes a dramatic re-enactment of the nativity story, a procession to the manger, and the music of our own Kisasa Choisters.
- 8:30 p.m. Candlelight Communion Service. This service perhaps most clearly embodies the "incarnation" as we hear the Word and receive the sacrament of Holy Communion. Christmas hymns in new arrangements by Craig Phillips for brass and organ, along with Cantorei, lead our song at this service. Pre-service music begins at 8:00 p.m..
- 11:00 p.m. Candlelight Carol Service. Music and the Word are the means of grace
 at this service. The Cathedral Choir, with strings, winds, and organ wrap this service
 in a mantle of lyric praise.

Christmas Day - 10:00 a.m. Our Christmas Morning service is simple, yet profound. We gather for Word and Sacrament with beloved carols shaping the liturgy.



By the time you read this newsletter, Jean McKinney, St. John's beloved Parish Nurse of 25 years, will be an ordained priest in the Episcopal Church. After serving the Episcopal Church as a deacon for 17 years (along with serving as our Parish Nurse), Jean completed her requirements for ordination this past summer, and we celebrated her ordination at the Cathedral Church of St. Paul on Saturday, November 20th.

Jean's employment with St. John's will come to an end on December 31, 2010. and she will join the Cathedral staff team as an associate priest with a focus on pastoral visitation and wellness. She will preach at the Cathedral regularly from October through May, and continue to serve a small Episcopal/Presbyterian parish in Park Rapids, MN, during the summer.

Jean has shared her medical knowledge and experience, as well as her compassionate heart, with countless individuals and families at St. John's. She has wept with us, laughed with us, helped us understand diagnoses and treatments, grieved with us, organized support groups to get us back on our feet, and laid her hands on countless heads as she prayed for healing. She has driven people to appointments, assisted families making health care decisions, waited with us for death to claim a loved one, all the while reassuring the members and friends of St. John's of God's abundant love and God's desire that we be healed and whole.

We are more grateful than we can say for Jean's ministry among us. We are proud of her as she is ordained a priest, and we are in awe of her faithfulness to God's call to serve God's people.

Fields of Hope

Fields of Hope harvest went well.

About 60 persons went to the field on Saturday, October 16 for the

harvest. Combine rides seem to have been the hit with a close second being the goat that kept escaping. This was the fifth year for the donation of labor, equipment and most of the inputs. The sale of the crop netted \$6,400 for the Guatemalan food security project. Some additional cash will be added as there were rows of corn purchased to supplement the amount being sent. The Toconicapan project is helping the indigenous people of the area to farm more effectively on their hilly terrain. Very simple green houses have allowed them to have peppers and tomatoes for their families and to sell. This effort has been so successful that the farmers who have been helped are teaching neighboring villagers the same techniques. This is "foreign aid " that is very effective in helping to reduce hunger.

Prepare for Worship

<u>Sunday, December 5,</u> <u>Second Sunday of Advent</u>

At the heart of our Advent preparation stands John the Baptist, who calls us to repent and make a new beginning. As the darkness increases, we turn toward the light of Christ's coming. For Christians, he is the root of Jesse, the righteous judge who welcomes all, especially the poor and meek of the earth. We wait with hope for that day when the wolf will dwell with the lamb, and there will be no more hurt or destruction. From the Lord's Table we are sent in the spirit of John the Baptist to proclaim that in Christ the kingdom of God has come near.

The readings are Isaiah 11:1-10; Psalm 72:1-7, 18-19; Romans 15:4-13; and Matthew 3:1-12. Throughout Advent at 8:45 and 11:00 a.m. our gathering song will be "An Advent Processional" by Donald Pearson with a great, thumping, Medieval dance feeling to it. The congregational refrain will remain the same, but the choir verses will change from week to week. The first hymn at 5:00 p.m. Saturday and 7:45 Sunday will be "O Come, O Come, Emmanuel," ELW 257. The other hymns will be ELW 249, "On Jordan's Bank the Baptist's Cry" and ELW 711, "O Day of Peace."

During communion the assembly will sing ELW 247, "Come Now, O Prince of Peace" and "ELW 254, "Come, Thou Long-Expected Jesus." At 8:45 a.m. Kisasa Choristers will sing "A Little Child Shall Lead Them," by Marilyn Biery for offering, and at 11:00 a.m. Cathedral Choir will sing "Lo, How a Rose E'er Blooming" in the famous setting by 20th century German composer Hugo Distler.

<u>Sunday, December 12,</u> <u>Third Sunday of Advent</u>

A note of joyful expectation marks today's worship. Isaiah announces that the desert shall rejoice and blossom. Jesus points to signs of God's reign: the blind see, the lame walk, lepers are cleansed, the deaf hear. We wait with patience for the coming of the Lord, even as we rejoice at his presence among us at this time: in word and holy supper, in church and in our homes, in silent reflection and in works of justice and love. We pray that God will open our eyes and ears to the wonders of Christ's Advent among us.

The readings are Isaiah 35:1-10; Psalm 146:5-10; James 5:7-10; and Matthew 11:2-11.

The hymns will be ELW 264, "Prepare the Royal Highway," and ELW 241, "O Lord, How Shall I Meet You." At 8:45 Cantorei and Cathedral Choir will sing "Go and Tell John" by Lloyd Pfautsch during the gospel and "O Thou That Tellest Good Tidings to Zion" from Messiah by G.F. Handel during communion with Erik Horak-Hult singing the counter tenor solo and the St. John's Chamber Orchestra accompanying. The offering and communion music at 11:00 a.m. will be by the Chamber Orchestra. The laying on of hands and anointing with oil for healing at all services is a perfect rite to respond to the vision from Isaiah and Jesus' response to John's disciples.

Sunday, December 19, Fourth Sunday of Advent

In the first reading the prophet Isaiah promises that a young woman will bear a son and name him Emmanuel. The gospel is Matthew's account of the annunciation and birth of the one named Emmanuel, God-with-us. One this final Sunday in Advent we prepare to celebrate the birth of the one born to save us from the power of sin and death.

The readings are Isaiah 7:10-16; Psalm 80:1-7, 17-19; Romans 1:1-7; and Matthew 1:18-25. The hymns will be ELW 258, "Unexpected and Mysterious," and ELW 259, "Fling Wide the Door." At 11:00 a.m. Cathedral Choir will sing Healey Willan's setting of "Hosanna to the Son of David," and "Come, Thou Long-Expected Jesus," by Matthew Armstrong.

The Christmas Eve Services are listed and detailed on the cover of this *Eagle Call*.

Christmas Day, Saturday, December 25th, there will be one service at 10:00 a.m. It will be a simple communion liturgy with Christmas hymns for the service music. There will be no 5:00 p.m. Saturday service Christmas Day evening.

Sunday, December 26, First Sunday of Christmas – one service at 10:00 a.m.

As we celebrate the Twelve Days of Christmas, our gospel today confronts us with the death of innocent children at the hands of Herod. The birth of Christ does not remove the power of evil from our world, but its light gives us hope as

we walk with all the "holy innocents" of past generations and today who have suffered unjustly. In our gathering around word and meal, God continues to redeem us, lift us up, and carry us as in days of old.

The readings for this Sunday are Isaiah 63:7-9; Psalm 148; Hebrews 2:10-18; and Matthew 2:13-23. The hymns will be ELW 273, "All My Heart Again Rejoices," ELW 278, "Away in the Manger," and ELW 299, "Cold December Flies Away." The music for offering and communion will be some of the new or less familiar Christmas songs in ELW sung by a soloist but with the invitation for the congregation to join in as they feel comfortable doing so.

Let's continue our discussion about the mission and

ministries of St. John's. One of our (many) shining stars is Children's Ministry, coordinated by Sheryl Reed.

The fall season kicks off each year with Rally Sunday – usually the Sunday after Labor Day. A family-friendly activity is always planned as students are welcomed back after the summer break. At this time, families are invited to sign up for the Sunday School program held during the school year between the 8:45 and 11:00 a.m. Sunday services. Should you miss that particular event, students are welcome into the program at any time.

All children age three-sixth grade are invited to attend Sunday School. Teachers use the SPARK curriculum published by Augsburg Fortress. Our teaching is based on a strong biblical foundation dedicated to the mission to learn from the Bible how to live the Good News. We focus on presenting the Bible stories in a way to engage children appropriate for their age level.

Each week a Sunday School offering is collected. Children are encouraged to give a portion of their own money, whether it is from an allowance or extra money for helping around the house. It is never too early to help children practice the routine of joyfully and faithfully giving of what they have. Just as for adults, God gives – we share.

Sunday School classes participate in various service ventures; for example, writing letters to St. John's homebound parishioners, sponsoring an ELCA Global Mission Project missionary family in Tanzania, providing and preparing snacks for Habitat for Humanity, and donating used books to the Connection Café, among others.

In addition to the Sunday School program, other activities for children include:

 KIDZ@SJLC for three through five year olds meets during Beloved Community on Wednesday evenings. Connection of worship, education and our church year help children link faith to their daily lives through music, movement, crafts, stories and games. • Vacation Bible School is led each summer by the Lutheran Lakeside staff. The week is spent examining ways we use our gifts, words and actions to serve both God and others. Children participate in songs, group games, devotions, crafts and skits. Parents, grandparents and friends are invited to the closing program to watch as the campers showcase songs and theme verses they learned during the week.

Growing Together is the ministry team that coordinates educational Christian family activities that encourage families to grow in their faith. These efforts involve:

- Our Lutheran Heritage event held in February giving children and their families an opportunity to take part in a hands-on educational activities in which the question is answered, "What does it mean to be a Lutheran?" This event offers a series of interactive stations with activities for families to do together, and we add some tasty treats just for fun.
- Follow the Star Epiphany Family Event is held on Epiphany Sunday. Families go on a treasure hunt and participate in entertaining educational stations along the way that help students learn the story and meaning of the Epiphany.
- The Pentecost Family Event provides families the opportunity to do Pentecost-themed crafts, enjoy a flavorful snack then gather in the fountain courtyard as we use the wind to send our prayers out into the world...with bubbles!
- And, very timely, the Children's Advent Program rehearsals are used as a tool to help children learn more about the meaning behind our Advent hymns and songs which are then presented, along with Bible reading and reflections, at the Children's Advent Program in mid-December. A cookie reception follows.

The above highlights some of the activities provided by Children's Ministry outreach. If you have children who do not participate in any or all of these opportunities, please consider this an invitation to partake of this educational and enjoyable jewel. 
