This thirdgeneration family-owned business now offers an enormous selection of unique and value-priced fabrics. Shop this spacious store for an indepth selection of bridal, costume, and fashion fabrics, including a full array of silks, wools, knits, cottons, broadcloth, bottom weights, corduroy, muslin, felt, and embellished fabrics. They have a great selection of water-proof and water-repellent fabrics for outerwear, and a smattering of other technical fabrics. In the annex area you'll find value-priced flat fold fabrics in quantities of five yards or less. Their home decorating department is filled with unique textiles, notions, pillows, tassels, trims, and embellishments.

Pendleton has produced woolen products for over 150 years, and the iconic wool jacquards inspired by Native American heritage date back more than a century. Today the sixth generation descendants of founder Thomas Kay are still running the operation, which still mills its woolens in Pendleton, Oregon and Washougal, Washington using time-honored manufacturing methods.

The store offers first quality Pendleton fabrics, yarns, remnants, and notions for sewing and crafting in vibrant colors and patterns. Over 200 fabrics on the roll include blanket weight fabric, coating, flannel, worsteds, gabardine, Pendleton Eco-Wise ® wool, herringbone, houndstooth, jacquard patterns, melton, menswear and novelty suiting, plaids, and tweeds. Printed towels, pillows, and other home décor items are

also available. Bins filled with "mill waste" are a special treat: "wooly worms" left over from making blankets, selvages, fabric strips, and yarns offered by the pound, ideal for crafts, creative trims, and embellishments. They even offer their vintage wooden bobbins!


