



End of Belair line gets raw deal

Commuters demand say on schedule

LOCAL commuters want to have their say over residents waiting half an hour for services at the new Belair train timetable, before the "temporary" set-up becomes permanent.

Blackwood, Belair and Districts Community Association (BBDCA) chair Heather Beckmann is calling for a "full community consultation" with Adelaide Metro and the Minister for Transport so long-suffering commuters can raise their concerns.

Frustrated train travellers were pleased to see the trains were due to return on July 14. But that was the day commuters were hit with fare rises which take a single trip up to \$5, or \$3.29 if a metrocard is used.

It was also the day the trains didn't go back. Signal failures kept the trains delayed for a week after the expected date. A Department of Transport, Planning and Infrastructure spokesperson apologised for the inconvenience but said that "safety was the highest priority".

The new train timetable includes more services to the Belair line. But three trains in the morning and five in the evening will only go as far as Blackwood, leaving Glenalta, Pinera and Belair peak times.

Ms Beckmann said she could understand that the early end shaved minutes off the trip, "but it seemed a little unfair to those people at the end of the line. And it will be hard for those who have to make connections with other trains or buses at the other end."

Ms Beckmann said the BBDCA is particularly concerned for schoolchildren going to St John's and alighting at Belair, and those getting on at Belair to go to Blackwood High School.

The DPTI spokeswoman said the timetable would need to be readjusted in November, to account for a new station at Wayville.

She said the single line for the Belair train limited the ability to increase services, but "the new timetables have been designed taking into account patronage on bus and trains to enable optimal services" which means a 15-minute gap at peak times, as long as you only want to go as far as Blackwood.

She said "customers are able to use bus services from Glenalta, Pinera or Belair to transfer to high frequency train services at Blackwood."

And if you're interested, the reason for the sixmonth 'substitute bus' hike into the city has been for an upgrade of the signalling system, and a railway underpass at Goodwood, track upgrades from Goodwood to the city and a new station at Wayville, replacing the temporary Royal Adelaide Show station and the ageing Keswick station.

The line was closed for track work and replaced by buses in 2009, and Ms Beckmann said "past experience shows that it takes a long time to get back to the level of commuter use that existed before. But the more that we can use the trains, the more they will be viable."

She said the group had worried years ago that the final three stations would be shaved off the trip as had been done when the line used to go as far as Bridgewater in 1987.

But the storage sheds built at Belair would seem to indicate that it would remain the end of the line. Nevertheless the BBDCA will keep a "watching brief" on the trains and invites people who use public transport to comment on their use of the trains and their experience with the new timetable.

Funding gap mothballs new CCTV system

BLACKWOOD has a fantastic CCTV security system, but not enough money to run it properly.

The system was funded by a Federal Government Safer Suburbs grant to the tune of \$100,000, and it has been operating for 18

But it will cost about \$100,000 every year to keep it running, and so far, there is no money to

Blackwood Business Network president and Mitcham City councillor Jane Silbereisen said the original funding proposal had a future funding

One of those plans was a levy on Blackwood businesses to pay for the extra security.

Council surveyed local businesses owners, who were supposed to pass the survey on to tenants, and the answer was an overwhelming disinclination to pay higher rates to cover the security sys-

"That showed they did not support the levy and we have to stand by that," Cr Silbereisen said.

But she was confident that private responses suggested the support, particularly from tenants, was higher than the council's results showed.

The group is now going to set up an indepen-

age and oversee the security program.

"It will be looking at other funding options, including applying for grants," she said.

To maintain the system, they need to pay for people to maintain the equipment and monitor the footage, and other costs like insurance and broadband. There are 20 cameras and eight broadband sites. All of this adds up to about \$100,000 pa.

While the system has used many volunteer hours for support, "we need to employ someone for around five hours per week to manage and maintain equipment, and locate footage for police," Cr Silbereisen said.

But she said the system is working, and a report showed that the trends of vandalism and crime in the area were declining.

"The response from traders is that they appreciate the program and know it's reducing vandalism in the area," Cr Silbereisen said.

She said while the police had been the first port of call for greater security, "the Sturt police have to cover from Hindmarsh to Hallett Cove and up to Blackwood. The area does not have a café and entertainment culture and is not on a major route, so police are not regularly passing through. They have to deliberately come up here, dent security committee for the precinct to man-which makes us very vulnerable," she explained.

The group even requested re-opening the police

station at Blackwood. The BBN is caught between a rock and a hard place. Cr Silbereisen acknowledged that some businesses don't think they need it and shouldn't have to pay extra for it.

50 years of wear and tear, patchwork repairs prompt landmark upgrade plan

Memorial Hall refit call

THE Blackwood & District War Memorial Hall on Coromandel Parade is 50 years old and show-

The popular hall is used by more than 500 people a week, for dancing and martial arts lessons, clubs and societies, plays and presentations and craft and art markets.


It is run entirely by an independent committee of volunteers - it is not owned by Mitcham Council and has to pay rates - and secretary Ms Jan Westley says the hall is in need of maintenance.

She said major expenses include an upgrade to the plumbing, as it contains three different kinds of pipes, from concrete to PVC, and the floor of the main hall needs replacing. The floor alone is expected to cost \$30-50,000.

The car park has also recently been upgraded, a major expense for the committee but not a revenue raiser for the hall, as plenty of people use the car park - but the hall committee makes no money out of it directly as there are no parking

Ms Westley says the committee tries to keep hiring costs low to keep the hall accessible to as many community groups as possible.

Local service groups, Blackwood Rotary and Blackwood Lions have come to the party to help fund some of the much-needed works. Rotary



contributed \$4000 to the hall committee for the car park works in May.

Bernie Donohue, Lions Club member and coordinator of the Lions' Blackwood Hall restoration committee said the Lions gave \$5000 last month toward the car park and said the Lions "have taken it on as a major project.

"It's looking sad and tired and we want to raise it back to its former glory."

The Lions are also keen to revamp the front entrance and include a sculpture of a "peace

Walking tour book reveals historic village

WALKERS can gain a fascinating insight into Blackwood's history with the publication of the Blackwood Historical Walk booklet.

Produced by Mitcham Council's Heritage Research Centre, the brochure outlines the walk which takes you through Blackwood's streets, highlighting diverse architectural styles and explaining Blackwood's historical aspects.

"The walk explores Blackwood from Coromandel Railway Station, along beautiful residential tree-lined streets with diverse architectural styles as well as through the business district where evidence of the early village businesses can still be found," confirmed a council spokesperson.

As well as explaining about the buildings, the brochure outlines Blackwood's history, which was planned when a new rail line was proposed through the Adelaide Hills in 1879.

In a bid to attract more people to the area, new residents to Blackwood were given a free first class rail ticket to the city for three years. Coromandel Station was established later, sometime between 1922 and 1926. Initially it was called Brighton Parade and changed its name to Coromandel Station after a naming competition. There was no platform, and passengers had to wave the train down to stop it.

One of the brochure's main researchers was Blackwood resident, Pauline Coulls. She is an original descendant of the Hewett family, who settled here in the 1880s, and it was her great grandfather who built many of the buildings around Blackwood. Several of these are featured in the booklet.

Pauline explained she had worked with another local historian, Maggy Ragless (now deceased), gathering information for the popular Blackwood Backwards tours which ran a couple of years ago. "The brochure just sort of evolved from them," she said.

Having lived in the area for more than 80 years. Pauline has seen a few changes herself. "It was just a little village in the 1920s," Pauline recalls. "There was no hospital so I was born at home, and I even had my tonsils taken out in the kitchen!"

Costing \$3000 to print, Council confirmed the latest heritage walk throughout historical Blackwood in the hills is proving to be extremely popular with the local community.

Even if you don't partake in the walks, this booklet makes for an interesting read on the history of the Blackwood district.



Action group push to engage community knowledge for master plan

Blackwood district are being dusted off and revisited - and the community wants to be involved.

Last month, Mitcham Council narrowly rejected a proposal to revive the master plans which date back to the 1980s. There was also a major plan published in 1994, and revisited early this century.

However, Mitcham Council confirmed that councillors will be participating in a workshop to look at past master plans. "From this workshop they will determine a way forward," a spokesperson said.

The Blackwood Action Group (BAG) wants to get the community involved, and has written to Mitcham Council to ask that they consider how best to make the shopping and business precinct work for developers, traffic and pedestrians.

Andrew Tidswell, president of the BAG and an architect with an interest in urban planning and development, said there had been many master plans for Blackwood and people feel they had "been there and done that. They think, 'we have spent quite a lot of ratepayers' money, why would be bother to do that again'?"

Mr Tidswell said he would argue that that was a fault of the plans; they were too ambitious, but they contain a lot which would still be valid.

"My opinion would be that you should revisit the essence of the plans, which involve sensible principles and look at where you can make a difference," he said.

"They should pick out the essence of what Council can do, or what it can require developers to do, and at least develop a set of guidelines for the area."

He said Blackwood is one of three district centres identified in the Mitcham Council area and as such, council has a responsibility to ensure orderly development in the area.

The Blackwood shops present

many problems, though, as there are a number of owners, rather than a single owner or developer responsible for the one area.

BAG has also asked Council if the community can be involved in discussions early on - there are many people in the area with useful information, Andrew said.

"Very often, councils feel they have to come with a concrete proposal, and by then it is too late to make changes," he said.

Also in attendance were members from SA Police who informed the youth of the legalities associated with underage drinking and gave tips on how to organise and host a safe party.

The 'Firey Women' programs are free and specifically designed for rural women who are often left on properties to defend on their own while caring for others, and offer women the opportunity to learn about fire safety and preparation in a non threatening environment.



Property bushfire rating

A PROPOSAL which could've seen the majority of property owners in Blackwood faced with a mandatory Bushfire Rating of their property was rejected by Mitcham Council recently.

Instead of lobbying the State Government to investigate the legislation further, Council voted to write to the State Government requesting it to investigate and consult widely with the community on ways to increase community awareness of bushfire risks in bushfire risk areas.

Aimed at informing potential buyers of a property's bushfire risk, it was envisaged the Bushfire Risk certification would involve a checklist relating to water supply, gutters, fuel loads and vegetation clearances. In a report to Council, it stated the certification could be seen as a marketing tool to assist with property selection and sales in situations where the property in question offers a high standard of fire protection with reduced risks.

However, local real estate businesses weren't convinced the legislation would be a good thing and welcomed Council's decision.

Peter Alexandrou of Harris Real Estate said the legislation would've been another cost to the vendor. "From a practical side look around, this is a high risk area," he said. He also highlighted you'd need certified people to do it - adding another cost to the legislation. Plus it could take

put out

time to get the certification which would hold up sales, particularly for people who needed to sell

Principal at Harcourts Blackwood Peter Jeffrey added it's always been the buyer's responsibility to make their own enquiries about a property. "Bushfire risk is already included in a check list of what buyers should consider when purchasing a property," he highlighted. "It would've been more red tape and would've been

According to Council, there are approximately 12,000 properties within the City of Mitcham in Bushfire Risk Areas, the majority of which are situated in the Hills. It spends over \$650,000 annually on Bushfire Management/prevention and visits over 2200 properties each year, including visiting properties as part of the issuing of Burning Permits.

Rubbish burn ban BACKYARD burning is banned throughout the

Mitcham Council area, however, residents who live in 'high fire risk' areas can apply for a burning permit, subject to seasonal conditions, to burn green waste material for the purpose of fuel and fire hazard reduction.

To apply for a permit, you can go on-line at www.mitchamcouncil.sa.gov.au or visit the Council Customer Service Centre or call 8372 8888 to have the information and application sent out to you.

However, you must live in Council's high fire risk area; be conducting fuel and hazard reduction work; material to be burnt must only be green material; and material must be dry and ready to burn.


