Verse 1

1. ~~condemned~~ The Ephesian church was dead.
2. "As for you" is a connecting phrase.
3. Their deadness is past tense → "were"
4. There's a distinction between transgression & sins
5. The transgressions & sin is theirs

2. Followed is past tense.
