Lisa Brock's Peanut Butter & Jelly Bars

[You may have enjoyed these delicious treats at one of our sectionals — thanks Lisa! Why not bring a batch, or a favorite recipe of your own, to share at our next sectional?]

6 tbsp. unsalted butter (softened) 6 tbsp. peanut butter ¹/₂ c. packed brown sugar 1 large egg 1¹/₂ c. flour ¹/₂ tsp. salt ¹/₂ c. jelly or jam

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Line an 8- or 9-inch square baking pan with nonstick foil (or use regular foil and spray with non-stick spray).

Beat butter, peanut butter, and brown sugar in bowl with electric mixer until light and fluffy, about 2 min. Add egg and beat until combined. Mix in flour and salt at low speed until a dough forms.

Reserve 1 c. dough for topping. Press remaining dough into bottom of pan, forming an even layer. Spread jelly/jam on top. Coarsely crumble remaining dough over jelly layer. Bake until golden, 30-35 min. Cool completely on wire rack, then cut into bars.

Declarer Play Problem

Dummy: **▲**J93 ♥109876 ♦KQJ **♣**42 *Declarer*: **▲**AK10 ♥2 ♦2 **♣**AKQJ10976

You declare 6C after RHO has opened 3H in first seat. LHO leads a small spade and RHO follows small. **Plan the play.**


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Wish I'd Thought of That...

The following hand is from a March game at Alki Bridge Club:


My partner and I reached 6S on an optimistic auction, beginning with a 2C opening by West and a 2H overcall by North.



North led the \bigstar J,

and when dummy appeared it seemed that a heart and a diamond must be lost unless a squeeze could be found in the red suits.

Sitting West, I took the opening lead in hand and returned a heart. South overtook North's $\forall J$ with the $\forall Q$ and played a club. I took the \bigstar A and ran all my trumps and clubs. Knowing I was out of hearts, it seemed safe for South to discard his $\forall K5$, but now this position was reached at trick ten:



The lead of the $\bigstar10$ squeezed North. North had to discard a diamond, and the \blacklozengeA , \blacklozengeK , and $\blacklozenge7$ took the last three tricks, to make the contract (beer card!).

Much later, I realized that after South's club lead at trick three, I could have

reached the same position by force on a spectacular line of play: Take the A, ruff the K! Ruff a heart, ruff the Q! Ruff another heart (removing South's last heart), and run the trumps.

Ruffing the top clubs provides the entries needed to ruff out South's heart guards and make the slam legitimately as the cards lie (after trick three). I'm glad to have made it at all; but I wish I'd found this line at the table!

Solution to Declarer Play Problem

Here you are in a slam off two aces, and with a potential spade loser. However, it looks like LHO has a heart void and, you must assume, the A, in which case the opponents will not be able to cash their heart trick directly. Can you take advantage of this?

It seems like you got a free finesse at trick one, but if you win the \bigstar 10 in hand, you will not make it! If you draw trumps and play a diamond, LHO can take the \blacklozenge A on the first round and exit safely with a spade. You


