2017 CALL TO ENTER

Planning has begun for the 2017 Works Art & Design Festival, which will take place on Churchill Square and at other venues. The current call for proposals includes exhibits, programs, events, and performances on the theme:

DIALOGUE

Dialogue is essential to understanding. Not all dialogue is expressed in words. Interaction changes the course of a project, and often more questions remain than answers. Dialogue is about opening the evolution of an artwork to outside and potentially differing influences before the process is declared complete.

Proposals may consider: socially engaged practices, collaborative artworks, artworks involving research, works that include multiple voices or represent a conversation, as well as work that seeks to understand through genuine outreach.

Artists are invited to propose projects in the following categories:

- Environmental Site Specific Artwork
- Curator of a Group Exhibit
- Community Programs and Special Events
- Individual and Small Group Exhibits

2017 applications are due on October 31st 5pm MST

SPECIAL CALL FOR CANADA 150

To mark the 150th anniversary of Canadian Confederation, The Works is calling for 3 projects that actively build community and tell the complex story of Canada's people and places. To ensure diverse representation, we encourage submissions from indigenous, recent immigrant, female and francophone Canadians. Selected artists must have experience involving community in the creation process. Projects will include accessible, active, and authentic engagement with the public. The finished work will be presented at The Works Art & Design Festival 2017. Watch for the full call at theworks.ab.ca.

Inspired by walking through a forest in dappled light, *Canopy* is a large-scale temporary installation, recycled and biodegradable. Reminiscent of a tree hut, *Canopy* is a space for contemplation, a place of refuge, and an area of rest for the body and especially for the soul.

A Circle in a Square

Alma Louise Visscher

Using the very familiar marker of a tall advertising flag, and replacing the flag with imagery referencing a cyanometer, (a method to measure the blueness of the sky), Visscher examines the connection between people and the environment. The installation both defines limits and references notions of vastness and ubiquity.

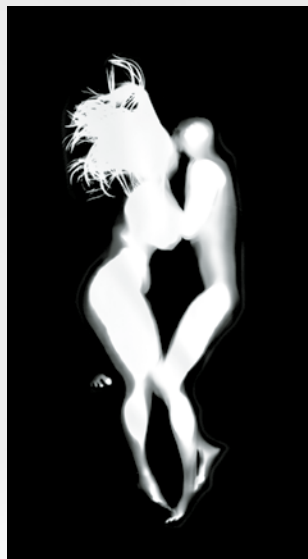

To encourage ongoing skills development, Works to Work allows participants to return summer after summer to progress from Assistant to Coordinator to Supervisor to Lead Supervisor levels.

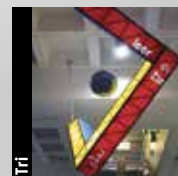

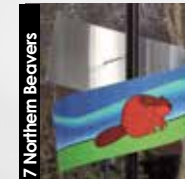
