Alliance for Artisan Enterprise membership is open to organizations that are actively involved in work that supports the global artisan sector, as recognized by the 1997 UNESCO and ITC definition of artisanal products:

Those produced by artisans, either completely by hand or with the help of hand-tools or even mechanical means, so long as the direct manual contribution of the artisan remains the most substantial component of the finished product.

Artisan Business	Artisan businesses work directly with artisans around the world to design, produce, and sell handcrafted products
Artisan Support Organization	Artisan support organizations provide business training, capacity building, consulting, and other services to artisan businesses and partners at different points in the supply chain
Corporation	Corporations provide large-scale market access for artisan businesses around the world
Foundation	Foundations provide grant and other support to artisan businesses and support organizations, and lead other initiatives
Government or Multilateral Agency	Government and multilateral agencies address local, national, and international barriers in the artisan sector
Individual	Individuals bring passion and expertise to the diverse forms of artisan enterprise

Member Responsibilities & Fees-

Members of the Alliance for Artisan Enterprise are expected to participate in Alliance activities and collaborate with other member organizations when possible. Each member of the Alliance for Artisan Enterprise contributes an annual \$100 member fee and provides contact information for at least one individual to share in the Alliance for Artisan Enterprise member directory.
