Signing Up for an Aim High Camp

Paper Registration:

- Step 1: Fill out the registration form at the back of this packet.
- Step 2: Turn in the form and pay at the front desk. (note: payment is due at the time of registration.)

Online Registration:

- Step 1: Visit: www.aimhighma.org/camps
- Step 2: Fill out all required fields & hit "submit and confirm registration"
- Step 3: You may select the option to pay with your card on file at Aim High (members only), pay in person at Aim High, or by sending a check in the mail within 7 business days. After 7 days, unpaid registrations will no longer be valid.

What to Expect from an Aim High Summer Camp

Quality Activities

- 8:1 Student to Teacher Ratio
- At least 3 full hours of Martial Arts Instruction (based on a full day of camp)
- At least 2 themed activities to engage thought and creativity (based on a full day of camp)
- Active themed games to keep children moving throughout the day

Friday Finales!

- Some weeks will end with an off-site field trip, while others will end with an exciting finale at Aim High.
- Offsite Field Trips will be for children ages 6+ (must be attending full day to attend field trip).
- Demonstrations and on-site Exploration Activities will be planned for children ages 3 5, and older children only attending for half the day.

Drop-off & Pick-up

- Aim High has extended its Drop-off & Pick-up times to accommodate parent needs!
- Campers may be dropped off beginning at 7:30am Aim High's doors will remain locked until that time.
- Campers must be picked up no later than 5:30pm—a fee of \$10 will apply if campers are picked up late.

Trips to the Park

- If weather permits, campers (all ages) may visit the park at Five Oaks Middle School during the week, walking along Twin Oaks Drive to get there.
- Please ensure your child brings the following items to camp each day: close toed shoes, sweatshirt or jacket, and sunscreen.

Miscellaneous Information

- Campers are more than welcome to bring their own books to read during camp.
- Please ensure your children are wearing comfortable athletic attire they will be engaging in martial arts lessons and other physical activities.
- Jewelry is not allowed, and long hair should be tied back.

Camp Policies

Registration & Payment – initial registration may be done in person or online and requires both the Aim High Camp Registration Form and payment within 7 business days. Full online registration is only available for families with a credit or debit card on file, and payment will be charged within 24 hours of submission. Adding additional days of camp may be done over the phone or via email, as long as there is a card on file to be charged at the time of the addition.

Refunds & Credits – Aim High has a no refund policy. Credits may only be approved by the Operations Director.

Make-up Days – Make-up days may be scheduled for illness, injury, or family emergency only. Please contact the Camp Manager to schedule a make-up.

Expected Behavior – Aim High expects all campers to show respect to fellow campers, staff, and the facility. If a camper chooses to show disrespect by disobeying camp rules and/or Aim High Staff, or by engaging in activities that insult or harm another camper, he or she may be asked to leave camp and/or not be allowed to attend camp in the future. Aim High Staff will use redirection and time outs when necessary.

Items of Value – Aim High is not responsible for valuables – please do not send money, electronics, jewelry, or other items of value to camp with your children. Aim High will not be held liable for theft or damage to property.

Medication – Aim High is not responsible for administering medication to your children. Please notify the camp manager if your child is required to take any medication during camp, and leave detailed instructions for your child to follow. If your child is unable to follow instructions for administering his or her own medication, you must arrange for yourself or another adult to come in and administer the medication.
