From your Priest-in-Charge



My Dear Friends,

One thing that I've noticed at St. Michael's is that children are important to this community. We want to make a difference in the

world for them. We do that with our Tuesday Club, by sending our kids to a faith based summer camp, and by hosting a week long Bible Camp here for kids this July. I hear you agree it is important that we make a difference for all kids, those in our congregation and those in our neighborhood. To help us we have received two diocesan grants for the continuation of our Tuesday Club and for a week of bible camp.

The diocese has also noticed our outreach efforts -the Diocesan Youth Missioner, Eric Travis has chosen our parish to be the site of Episcopoaooza over Labor Day weekend. What is Episcopaloooza? Imagine our Kiddie Karnival on steroids! Everyone's invited: the whole diocese, our whole neighborhood. Games, food and fun for families – kids of all ages!

Another thing I've noticed, we are a spiritually healthy congregation. Think back over all the milestone events we have celebrated this past year. Our people want to share the joy of the sacraments with us. We've celebrated Baptisms, Funerals, Renewal of Marriage Vows, Confirmation, and we anointed the sick. We've blessed homes, and bicycles and Sunday school teachers and backpacks, and sent our tweens off to New Beginnings & Nightwatch with our blessings. We minister to each other, pray for each other, and hope to grow in this outreach.

But we live in the world. Our needs have a price. Our need for kids and our needs for the congregation. It costs time and money – talent and treasure. We need both to sustain and grow. You might not

have both in abundance but surely you have something to give. I want you to think about your giving – of course money, but also your gifts and talents, and your prayers and witness to what happens here at St. Michaels.

We have all 7 of our camp aged kids going to Stony Lake Episcopal/Lutheran Camp this summer. But we do not have the money to make this a reality yet. We need donations, we need fundraisers, we need more than we actually have at this moment.

It's no surprise that we have one year left of diocesan moneys to keep a priest in this parish. Your pledges are being met – each of you is doing a great job of supporting this church. You may not be able to stretch another buck out of your wallets. I don't honestly know. But I do know that at this level of giving, we will not be able to sustain in the near future what we are doing right now. By our reckoning at Vestry last month we believe we need to bring in another 8,000 dollars to meet our goal of this fiscal year, 2015.

This is not meant to be depressing. It's just part of the way we live in the world. But we are not of the world. We are an Easter people and at St. Michael's we are experiencing a time of resurrection. We are coming alive now. Maybe we feel like we're struggling out of tightly wrapped linens, our eyes are squinting at the bright light, and we're hobbling on leas weak from disuse. But feel it! Breathe in the fresh air. We are entering new life. Be a witness to the excitement. Christ is in us and protects us and sends us. Since we are on his mission, I am convinced that we will make a difference in our ministry and mission here. I know you share this faith with me! Amen!
