



THE ART LEAGUE SCHOOL

Founded in 1968, the Art League School seeks to develop Houston-area artists through its quarterly studio art classes and workshops. Each year, over 1,000 adult students of diverse backgrounds, skill levels, and ages enroll in over 100 classes and workshops annually at the Art League School. Led by professional artist instructors, classes and workshops take place in three fully equipped studio spaces where students work in painting, drawing, watercolor, printmaking, mixed media, collage, jewelry, and other media. To ensure individual attention and to accommodate varying skill levels, courses are maintained with a limited number of students. There are no prerequisites for enrollment and courses are offered at an affordable cost to allow broad access to anyone interested. Students also have access to exhibitions, lectures, public programs, and artist talks offered throughout the year to further their training as artists.

Membership discounts do not apply to workshops. Memberships start at \$35 for individuals upon registering for a course.

CHOLLA MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

Art League Houston tries to keep the cost of our programs as affordable as possible — but if you need help, we have scholarship assistance available each quarter. In honor of longtime Art League Houston instructor, Cholla, Art League now offers limited tuition assistance for classes and workshops to adult students who demonstrate financial need and an interest in visual art. Tuition assistance ranges from 25-90%. Scholarships are for one class or workshop per applicant per quarter with a maximum of two scholarships per year. A separate scholarship form must be submitted for each applicant and for each quarter. The application to apply for tuition assistance for the upcoming Winter 2015 will open in late October 2014. 



REGISTRATION CALENDAR

All classes are limited to 12 students, unless otherwise noted. Classes are for students 17 and older, unless instructor consent is given. **All classes have a recommended list of materials which students are responsible for purchasing.** Materials lists will be distributed to students upon registration. CERAMICS

TINY PLAYFUL CLAY: WHEELS, BEASTS, AND FACES (C-1)

Jessica Kreutter; Beginner / All Levels Tuesday, 9:30 AM – 12:30 PM January 13 – March 17 (10 weeks) \$310 members / \$345 non-members + \$55 lab fee

We will delve into the very basics of clay sculpture to make three projects using a combination of pinch, coil, and slab techniques. Projects, demos, and discussion will be directed at the beginning ceramic student interested in exploring hand building and whimsical forms. The instructor will lead the class in three projects- coil busts, pinch pot wheeled cars, and slab-built beast cupsthough students may work on individual projects in clay. Projects will be shoe-box size or smaller and we will be using slip and glaze for bright playful color. The lab fee covers the off-site firing of pieces and additional supplies.

Please note: enrollment for this course is limited to 5 students.

PLAYING WITH STACKED FORMS (C-2)

Jessica Kreutter; Beginner / All Levels Tuesday, 1:00 – 4:00 PM January 13 – March 17 (10 weeks) \$310 members / \$345 non-members + \$55 lab fee

Learn how to build large clay sculpture with small forms. Using basic hand building techniques (pinch, coil, and slab), we will create sculptures for garden or home. Projects, demos, and discussion will be directed at the very beginning ceramic student interested in exploring clay sculpture. The instructor will lead the class in techniques to create multiple individual forms (6" or smaller) that can be stacked after firing. Multiple forms allow for experimentation in design and individual expression. Tell a narrative, create a figure, or just play with form, color, and design. We will be using under glaze and low fire glaze for bright playful color. The lab fee covers the off-site firing of pieces and additional supplies.

DRAWING

DRAWING FUNDAMENTALS (D-1)

Armando Rodriguez; Beginner Monday, 9:30 AM – 12:30 PM January 12 – March 16 (10 weeks) \$310 members / \$345 non-members

Before we can write, we learn to draw. Students will observe and translate three-dimensional forms into two-dimensional drawings, starting with exercises on simple line forms, and progressing to more complex organic forms. Students will build skill in composition and line quality through the use of tone, light, and shadow, and the development of visual awareness and discrimination.

CLASSICAL FIGURE DRAWING (D-2)

Polly Liu; Intermediate Monday, 12:30 – 3:30 PM January 12 – March 16 (10 weeks) \$310 members / \$345 non-members + \$model fee

In this class, students are introduced to French Atelier training to draw the human figure. The method of sight size, a fundamental scale system, is used to reproduce the figure accurately. Students work from a live model focusing on outline, proportion, shadow, shape, and value. The model fee is due the first day of class and varies according to class size.

Please note: enrollment for this course is limited to 6 students.



THE DRAFTSMAN'S TOOLBOX – AN INTRO TO DRAWING (D-3)

Laura Spector; Beginner / All Levels Monday, 6:30 – 9:30 PM January 12 – March 16 (10 weeks) \$310 members / \$345 non-members + \$5 material fee

In this course, students will begin learning the tools artists use while drawing. Students will learn the basics of composition, negative and positive space, contour lines, perspective, value, foreshortening and beginning anatomical sketches while practicing a wide variety of techniques. Pencil, charcoal and ink will primarily be used in this class. Students will not focus on completing drawings during each class, instead they will have the opportunity to test out new methods while having questions answered. Homework will be assigned at the end of each class to help students reinforce their learning into practice.

CLASSICAL FIGURE DRAWING (D-4)

Polly Liu; Intermediate Tuesday, 9:00 AM - 12:00 PM January 13 – March 17 (10 weeks) \$310 members / \$345 non-members + \$model fee

In this class, students are introduced to French Atelier training to draw the human figure. The method of sight size, a fundamental scale system, is used to reproduce the figure accurately. Students work from a live model focusing on outline, proportion, shadow, shape, and value. The model fee is due the first day of class and varies according to class size.

Please note: enrollment for this course is limited to 6 students.

BASIC DRAWING 101 (D-5)

Myke Venable; Beginner / All Levels Saturday, 9:30 AM – 12:30 PM January 17 – March 21 (10 weeks) \$310 members / \$345 non-members

Using basic materials, students will explore the fundamentals of drawing. Through various hands-on activities and class discussions, this course will touch upon observation, shapes, volume, value, line and texture. This class is intended for students with little or no previous drawing experience.



INTERMEDIATE DRAWING (D-6)

Myke Venable; Intermediate Saturday, 1:00 – 4:00 PM January 17 – March 21 (10 weeks) \$310 members / \$345 non-members

This an intermediate course in drawing. Students will be expected to have some knowledge of shape, volume, value, line and texture. We will draw from still-life subjects with the use of graphite pencils, charcoal pencils, and sketch paper. It is the goal of the class to establish a strong foundation in drawing that will carry over to more advanced classes.

Please note: enrollment for this course is limited to 8 students.

LIVE FIGURE MODEL LAB FOR ART LEAGUE HOUSTON MEMBERS

The human figure has been the subject of art since the beginning of time. Every week, a live model is available for all Art League Houston members to freely sketch, draw, or paint. Students will be able to observe the model and explore different techniques of approaching the human form on paper or canvas. A proctor will be present. Classes are \$15 per session and meet weekly on Thursday and Saturday from 1:00 – 4:00pm. No preregistration required – this is a drop-in program. Art League memberships start at \$35!



JEWELRY

JEWELRY CONSTRUCTION: BEGINNING-ADVANCED (J-1)

Mary Rogers; Beginner / All Levels Monday, 6:30 – 9:30 PM January 12 – March 16 (10 weeks) \$310 members / \$345 non-members + \$35 lab fee

This class covers jewelry construction techniques including: piercing, drilling, soldering, riveting, forging, reticulation, and roller printing, as well as hydraulic forming. Advanced topics may include granulation, jewelry rendering, and blanking. In this class there is a strong emphasis on problem solving which helps students develop a personal design vocabulary, while the multi-level class allows new students to see a variety of advanced techniques and applications. Individualized instruction allows students to progress at their own pace. Lab fees cover acetylene, common use chemicals, and finishing supplies.

MIXED MEDIA

COLLAGE + ACRYLIC (MM-1)

Preetika Rajgariah; All Levels Monday, 9:30 AM – 12:30 PM January 19 – March 16 (9 weeks) \$285 members / \$320 non-members

In this course, students will be encouraged to take risks and push mediums to the next level. Students of all levels will explore new ideas in mixed media painting, incorporating acrylic painting and collage techniques, as well as considering the use of unconventional surfaces. We will explore layering experimental mediums, photo transfers, and collage in depth, striving for results that go beyond the obvious, and hope to leave people wondering how a painting was created. Each painter is encouraged to find his or her unique direction working abstractly and to develop a concept they feel strongly about. Everyone will benefit from the sharing of ideas and constructive criticism.

ENCAUSTIC WORKSHOP (MM-2)

Kelly Alison; All Levels Tuesday, 9:30 AM – 12:30 PM January 13 – February 3 (4 weeks) \$180 members / \$215 non-members + \$75 materials fee

This four week class will explore the basics as well as intermediate techniques of encaustic painting (painting with melted beeswax). Encaustic offers limitless possibilities through transferring of images onto a surface, scraping, mixing, applying, texturizing, sculpting, adding, and taking away. Students will love the beautiful and spontaneous results that this 2000 year old art will produce. Great for beginners and experience encaustic artists alike. The materials fee will cover all tools and supplies for this course.

COLLAGE: ASSEMBLING ART (MM-3)

Armando Rodriguez; All Levels Wednesday, 9:30 AM – 12:30 PM January 14 – March 18 (10 weeks) \$310 members / \$345 non-members

Collage is an ancient art that was used by calligraphers in 10th century Japan, visible in gold-leafed panels in European cathedrals of the 15th and 16th century, and used in the 19th century. Picasso and Braque began to use the technique, and collage flourished as an artistic practice. In this class we will use the medium as a means of personal expression with a more advanced approach.

PAINTING

CLASSICAL FIGURE PAINTING IN OIL (P-1)

Polly Liu; Intermediate / Advanced Monday, 9:00 AM – 12:00 PM January 12 – March 16 (10 weeks) \$310 members / \$345 non-members + \$model fee

In this class, students begin painting in Grisaille – painting executed entirely around monochrome and usually in shades of gray or brown – to eliminate the problems of color and value and to concentrate on accuracy of drawing and the effects of light. The second part of the class utilizes a limited palette, allowing students to explore and understand the harmony and unity of light. The model fee is due the first day of class and varies according to class size.

CLASSICAL PORTRAIT PAINTING IN OIL (P-2)

Polly Liu; Intermediate / Advanced Tuesday, 12:30 – 3:30 PM January 13 – March 17 (10 weeks) \$310 members / \$345 non-members + \$model fee

In this class, students begin painting in Grisaille – painting executed entirely around monochrome and usually in shades of gray or brown – to eliminate the problems of color and value and to concentrate on accuracy of drawing and the effects of light. The second part of the class utilizes a limited palette, allowing students to explore and understand the harmony and unity of light. The model fee is due the first day of class and varies according to class size.

TOWARD THE ABSTRACT IN LANDSCAPE (P-3)

Steve Parker; All Levels Tuesday, 6:30 – 9:30 PM January 13 – March 17 (10 weeks) \$310 members / \$345 non-members

This course is a continuation of Landscape into Art, but with an emphasis on composing a painting from a non-representational or abstract rather than imitative or purely representational basis. There will be plenty of latitude to continue the methods already undertaken in the previous landscape classes as well. The instructor will demonstrate and discuss these approaches as used by current and past masters. This class is being offered for all levels, however, beginners will be encouraged to draw. The primary medium is oil, however, acrylic and water-based oil paint is accepted.

Please note: enrollment for this course is limited to 10 students.

DIRECT PAINTING (P-4)

Steve Parker; All Levels Wednesday, 9:30 AM – 12:30 PM January 14 – March 18 (10 weeks) \$310 members / \$345 non-members + \$10 materials fee

This class is based on direct observation and rendering of the effect of light on the subject. The instructor will demonstrate and discuss various techniques of interpreting the color and tonal relationships involved in this type of direct painting. Beginners will be encouraged to start with drawing and work into painting. The primary medium is oil, however, acrylic and water-based oil paint is accepted.

OIL PAINTING: THE EASY METHOD (P-5)

Wednesday, 1:00 – 4:00 PM January 14 – March 4 (8 weeks) \$260 members / \$295 non-members

In this modern method, we use oil over acrylic paint. The painting progresses first in layers of acrylic, followed by layers in oil. The simplicity of this method makes this class ideal for the beginner and a boost for the advanced student. Using this layering technique gives the student the leverage to create fine-tuned paintings. The finished paintings have a unique luminosity and a sense of depth.

Students will not focus on completing a painting during each class, instead they will have the opportunity to test out new methods while having questions answered. 


OIL PAINTING: THE EASY METHOD (P-7)

Ruben Coy; All Levels Wednesday, 6:30 – 9:30 PM January 14 – March 4 (8 weeks) \$260 members / \$295 non-members

In this modern method, we use oil over acrylic paint. The painting progresses first in layers of acrylic, followed by layers in oil. The simplicity of this method makes this class ideal for the beginner and a boost for the advanced student. Using this layering technique gives the student the leverage to create fine-tuned paintings. The finished paintings have a unique luminosity and a sense of depth.

ACRYLIC PORTRAIT BASICS (P-8)

Laura Spector; Beginner / All Levels Wednesday, 6:30 - 9:30 PM January 14 - March 18 (10 weeks) \$310 members / \$345 non-members + \$model fee

Students will learn the basics of rendering a portrait from creating accurate proportions to color-matching skin tones. Along the way, students will also learn the basics of creating a structurally stable painting while practicing a wide variety of techniques which can apply to all painting materials. Art history and color theory will be included in classroom discussions. Homework will be assigned to help students advance quickly in their practice. A model fee will be divided between all students.

Please note: enrollment for this course is limited to 8 students.

COLOR THEORY FOR BEGINNERS (P-9)

Cary Reeder; Beginner / All Levels Thursday, 9:30 AM - 12:30 PM January 15 – March 5 (8 weeks) \$260 members / \$295 non-members

Through this course, students will gain an understanding of color theory and the practical manipulation of color in paint. The first half of the semester will involve hands-on exercises using acrylics focusing on the concepts of hue, value, and intensity. During the second half of the semester, students will learn additional concepts including color harmony, mood, and color interaction, and translate these concepts, plus those learned during the first half of the course, into simple acrylic paintings.

LANDSCAPE PAINTING (P-10)

Steve Parker; Intermediate / Advanced Thursday, 1:00 – 4:00 PM January 15 – March 19 (10 weeks) \$310 members / \$345 non-members

This class is recommended for intermediate and advanced students and/ or as a continuation of Landscape into Art. The instructor will demonstrate and discuss techniques used in landscape painting in the first class session. Painting and making studies on site is essential in creating a convincing and expressive landscape. The primary medium is oil, however, acrylic and water-based oil paint is accepted.

Please note: enrollment for this course is limited to 10 students.

ACRYLIC PORTRAIT BASICS (P-11)

Laura Spector; Intermediate
Thursday, 1:00 – 4:00 PM
January 15 – March 19 (10 weeks)
\$310 members / \$345 non-members
+\$model fee

Students will learn the basics of rendering a portrait from creating accurate proportions to color- matching skin tones. Along the way, students will also learn the basics of creating a structurally stable painting while practicing a wide variety of techniques which can apply to all painting materials. Art history and color theory will be included in classroom discussions. Homework will be assigned to help students advance quickly in their practice. This class is based on methods of atelier classes found in Florence and Paris. A model fee will be collected by the instructor and discussed in class.

ACRYLIC STILL LIFE PAINTING (P-12)

Lucinda Cobley; All Levels Thursday, 6:30 – 9:30 PM February 26 – March 19 (4 weeks) \$260 members / \$295 non-members + \$5 materials fee

Relationship between objects is key to a good still life set-up. In this intensive course, students will develop strong still life compositions by exploring the interplay of color, form, texture, and spatial arrangements of objects. Develop skills to obtain the most effective composition by bringing awareness to focal point, scale, and perspective within each painting. Experiment with glazing and impasto techniques using acrylic mediums and gels. There will be an emphasis on color mixing, color contrast, and preparing textures using a variety of everyday tools and materials. This class is suitable for the beginner and intermediate level.

LANDSCAPE INTO ART (P-13)

Steve Parker; All Levels Saturday, 9:30 AM – 12:30 PM January 17 – March 21 (10 weeks) \$310 members / \$345 non-members

Utilizing memory and personal experience, students are encouraged to render their own impressions of the subject. Individual elements of the landscape are explored and demonstrated. The instructor will offer techniques and specific methods in landscape painting. The class includes informal discussions ranging from painting methods to basic color theory. The primary medium is oil, however, acrylic and waterbased oil paint is accepted.

PASTEL

PASTEL FOR BEGINNERS TO ADVANCED (PS-1)

Linda Dellandre; All Levels Saturday, 9:30 AM – 1:30 PM February 14 & February 28 \$140 members / \$175 non-members

Pastel is a beautiful and permanent medium which combines drawing and painting. Students find it more immediately satisfying than oil or watercolor, once they have learned the techniques that avoid smearing, and muddy surfaces. Students will learn when to apply hard to soft pastels and when to use light pressure or heavy pressure. We will learn how to paint using mass, value, illumination, and shadows. Our goal is a good composition, correct value, with clean color and light. The workshop will allow two weeks between sessions for students to finish work on a piece or start a new one at home and bring it back for feedback.

WATERCOLOR

BEGINNING WATERCOLOR (W-1)

Preetika Rajgariah; Beginner / All Levels Monday, 9:30 AM – 12:30 PM January 19 – March 16 (9 weeks) \$285 members / \$320 non-members

Students will explore watercolor media with an emphasis on technique, color, composition, and self-expression. The instructor will demonstrate a variety of watercolor techniques that form the basis of every watercolorist's repertoire including: dry and wet washes, glazes, ways to create texture, and more. Students will paint from life, explore abstract painting, and may be asked to bring reference materials as well.



WATERCOLOR (W-2)

Caroline Graham; All Levels Monday, 1:00 – 4:00 PM January 12 – February 2 & February 23 – March 16 (8 weeks) \$260 members / \$295 non-members

Explore the vibrancy and transparency of this medium. The instructor will emphasize color, design, and contrast. Students will learn to layer and control the pigment and rescue the white paper while retaining the spontaneous, fresh-looking result.

Please note there will be no class February 9 and February 16.

WATERCOLOR (W-3)


