

# Helleborus Winter Thrillers™ 'Green Gambler'

The Winter Thriller™ Hellebores produce exceptionally beautiful, outfacing flowers that stand tall on sturdy stems. This selection features large apple green flowers spotted, veined or edged with maroon. Happiest in a shadier location with moist, well drained soil. Hardy to zone 5.

# Astrantia major 'Roma'

Large, silver-pink flower heads cupped in fine bracts. Very floriferous, long blooming variety. Clump-forming perennials with masses of palm-shaped leaves. Wiry stems rise above the foliage canopy, each tipped with a rounded flower head set in a cup of bracts. Excellent cut flowers. Hardy to zone 4.



## Heuchera Little Cutie 'Blondie'

The caramel foliage is so cute with the delightful, ever present flower spikes of mellow, creamy yellow. Just 5" tall, and 8" wide, 'Blondie' is a blooming machine. It's compact habit is perfect for container gardening or at the front of a perennial border. Hardy to zone 4.

#### Brunnera macro. 'Silver Heart'

Although the foliage is similar to 'Looking Glass', this new selection has much thicker, non-melting foliage and deep blue flowers. Blooms are deep cobalt blue and the foliage is as silver as a baracuda's skin. Guaranteed to brighten a shady spot. Hardy to zone 4.

## Iris 'Greenspot'

Unusual waxy white flowers with green spotting on the falls make this dwarf Iris ungiue. These short plants are under 12" tall and perfect for the front of the border or a smaller garden. Plant in a sunny location and apply fertilizer in spring for maximum bloom. Hardy to zone 3.



# Dianthus 'Edgehog'

Very unique, one-of-a-kind Dianthus with bluegreen foliage outlined with a creamy white margin. This 'Edgehog' is accessorized with a hot pink, semi-double bloom. Great cut flower, bring the wonderful scent indoors. Thrives in full sun and well-drained soils. Can be used as a ground cover, along paths or in rock gardens. Hardy to zone 3.

# Clematis Empress™

Clematis Empress has pink outer sepals and an exotic spiky centre. Can be used in a variety of situations e.g. containers, on archways/trellis or growing through other shrubs. Clematis are happiest in a sunny setting. This one will grow around 8' tall. Hardy to zone 4.



# **Geum 'Totally Tangerine'**

This large selection provides a bright display all summer long. It forms a low mound of fuzzy green leaves with very tall branching stems holding large bright apricot to tangerine blooms. Very floriferous and a robust grower. Terrific in containers. Attractive to butterflies. Hardy to zone 4.



# Dicentra 'Amour Rose'

Billowy mounds of bright rose pink flowers crowd over the lacy foliage to greet you in the garden, Vigorous and very hardy, 'Amore Rose' will please everyone with the abundant flowers and extended bloom time. So many flowers, so little effort! Hardy to zone 5

# Coreopsis 'Red Satin'

This is a brand new threadleaf Coreopsis from hybridizer Darrell Probst. Deep ruby-red flowers with orange centres cover the plant. This selection is sterile so blooms appear over a very long season from early to late summer. Red Satin is also proving hardier than previous red threadleaf varieties. Hardy to zone 5.

#### Astilbe 'Look at Me'

Astilbe 'Look At Me' (Arendsii Group) has been announced the best new plant at Plantarium 2013, the Dutch trade fair for hardy nursery stock. It combines an unusually compact growth habit, short and well-filled panicles in a fresh pink colour and an abundance of flowers. Hardy to zone 3



# Heuchera 'Zipper'

You will love Heuchera 'Zipper' with its bright and coloured, seriously ruffled leaves, 'Zipper' leaves are well coloured all year and change from orange in spring and fall to golden amber in summer and winter, always with magenta backs showing. Better heat and humidity tolerance, as well as good cold tolerance. Hardy to zone 4

## Clematis Rebecca™

The Chelsea feature for 2008 and named after Raymond Evison's eldest daughter. Clematis Rebecca has stunning large red flowers and flowers freely over a long season. Grows 6-8' tall and is hardy to zone 4.



#### Brunnera macro. 'Sea Heart'

The foliage on this new brunnera is as thick as cardboard and it holds up way better in the heat and humidity of summer. The blooms on this new selection are two-toned - pink and blue. This selection holds up better to heat and humidity and flowers two weeks earlier than Jack Frost. Hardy to zone 4.

#### Buddleja Buzz™ Purple Buddleja 'Buzz'<sup>TM</sup> is the world's first patio

buddleja! These attractive, compact plants are loved by bees and butterflies, but won't take over your garden. Buddleja 'Buzz'<sup>TM</sup> is easy to grow with a super long-flowering period. Perfectly proportioned for patio growing. Hardy to zone 5



#### Iris 'Brat'

Iris Brat has golden yellow ruffled standards and beard with maroon falls. Intermediate bearded Iris are more compact than older varieties. This selection is a repeat bloomer. Choose a sunny location and fertilize in spring for the best bloom. Hardy to zone 3.



# Kniphofia uvaria 'Echo Rojo'

Exotic looking flowers in deep orange to red add a tropical flare to the landscape. Flowers in this series rebloom after the spring flush and continue to bloom into fall. Knipfhofia are drought tolerant once established.

Hardy to zone 6.

# Phlox Paparrazi™ 'Miley'

This is a new hybrid, appearing much like the subulata or Moss Phlox type, that forms a low mound or cushion smothered with flowers in late spring. The spreading foliage is light green and the fragrant flowers are violet. Good choice for edging or rock garden. Zone 5

#### Carex O. Evercolor 'Everest'

This evergreen Sedge is perfect as an accent in container gardens or used as a groundcover in a shadier garden. Tolerant of full sun in cooler climates. Sedges prefer even moisture and soil that is too dry may result in brown tips.

Hardy to zone 5.

# Veronica Long. 'Charlotte'

Brilliant white spires of dainty flowers that continue to open throughout summer, are complemented by narrow green leaves edged in white. Veronicas are happiest in full sun and well drained soil. Hardy to zone 4.



#### Hosta 'Gentle Giant'

Beautiful vase shaped Hosta with cupped, intensely blue leaves quickly grows to an impressive clump. This variety is slug resistant and has good sun tolerance for a blue variety. Lavender flowers on 4-5' tall stems. Hardy to zone 2.



#### Sedum 'Marina'

This is the bluest S. telephium you've ever seen. You will be very pleased with its lovely oblong blue grey leaves that tint purple in summer, its low mounding habit, and its vigorously forming crowns. Additionally it displays lovely rose pink flowers in late summer. Enjoy!

Hardy to zone 4

# Leucanthemum x 'Real Galaxy'

No sunny border would seem complete without the familiar presence of Shasta Daisies. This selection features multiple layers of pure white, narrow, fringed petals surrounding deep gold centres. Excellent tight clumping habit. Floriferous. Improved disease resistance. Excellent for cutting. Hardy to zone 5.



# Helleborus Winter Thrillers™ 'Grape Galaxy'

This vigorous grower has huge, single, grapepurple blooms that are heavily spotted with darker purple flecks. Bright green centres make a wonderful contrast. Site these where they will stay for many years, since the plants resent being disturbed. Hardy to zone 4.

# Heucherella 'Buttered Rum'

Caramel-dipped, deeply-cut maple leaves adorn this aptly named plant from spring to summer. In fall, the cool weather burnishes the leaves to a lovely rose red - a perfect complement to fall-planted containers. Grows into a medium sized mound that's perfect in the landscape. Hardy to zone 4

## Clematis Diamantina™

Launched at the Chelsea Flower Show 2010, clematis Diamantina is an exceptional, free-flowering clematis with 4-6 inch pom pom like blue double flowers, each lasting up to 4 weeks. Repeat flowering throughout summer. Grows from 6' to 10' tall and requires a support. Best in any sunny location. Hardy to zone 4.



## Salvia 'Sweet 16'

A notable improvement over Salvia Eveline due to its large flowers, brighter colour and branched flower stems. Sweet 16 puts on a fabulous show from late spring to early summer with tall wands of lavender pink flowers with a purple lip. Hardy to zone 3.

# Phlox pan. Early Start™ Pink

Summer Phlox is very popular for its midsummer display in the border. This compact selection blooms earlier than other traditional paniculata types and produces large clusters of fragrant, bright pink flowers with darker pink centres. Happiest in a sunny location. Zone 4



#### Heuchera 'Lime Ruffles'

Looks just like the name - a vigorous mound with very large and ruffled lime green leaves with a frosty white overlay. Bred using some Heuchera villosa and therefore it has larger leaves and should show more heat tolerance. Heucheras add all season colour to landscapes and containers. Hardy to zone 4

# Lilium 'Tiny Double You'

One of the Lily Looks<sup>TM</sup> series developed in the Netherlands. Bred originally for containers, these are versatile garden plants as well. The dwarf habit makes them useful near the front of any sunny border where they put on a great midsummer show. This selection is unique with large, upfacing DOUBLE orange flowers. Zone 2



## Sedum 'Touchdown Flame'

First you have flame red spring leaves, then you have the deep red stems, then you have summer leaves that are red-brown and olive-green with green backs, and then in late summer come the creamy yellow flowers. All of this combined with a compact, multicrown habit. Wow! Hardy to zone 4.

# Leucanthemum 'Goldfinch'

This is the yellowest flowering Shasta daisy ever! Long blooming and compact with semidouble flowers. All other "yellow" Leucanthemum pale in comparison! Charming semi-double flowers, very slowly and gracefully change from bright lemon yellow to an ivory white. A real gem! Hardy to zone 5

# Heuchera 'Black Taffeta'

Silky, black foliage chicly ruffled as if it was launched from a Parisian fashion house! Large, glossy leaves in perfect proportion to the plant. You've got to see this one in person to fully appreciate its charm and elegance. Heucheras are great in the garden or in mixed containers. Hardy to zone 4.
