Happy Kern Catz Returns

In the last newsletter, I mentioned how we've been able to issue about \$1,000 in spay/neuter vouchers every month this past summer, thanks to your generosity. We're continuing to do so as our funds permit. Think of it — With your generous support, we've been making a significant impact in reducing the number of unwanted kittens in our county. Recently, we got some good news from Kern County Animal Services. Once more, the county is offering free spay/neuter assistance to cat colony caregivers, thanks to a grant from PetSmart Charities. This program, called **Happy Kern Cats**, is open to residents in the unincorporated areas of 93308 and 93306.

According to Shyanne Schull, director, "Kern County Animal Services is excited to once again be partnering with PetSmart Charities to offer free spay/neuter surgeries to help reduce the pet population. Our statistics continue to show that a large number of feral and free-roaming cats enter the shelter from these two zip codes. We intend to target these specific areas to help reduce the number of unwanted pets entering our shelter and help the plight of feral and free-roaming cats in Kern County."

This time around, County Animal Services is working with the low-cost spay/neuter clinic, Critters Without Litters, to get these so-called community cats altered. For information about participating in this program, call Animal Services at 661-868-7100. Unfortunately, the County does not have traps to lend to the public, but Critters Without Litters has traps to lend to people who plan to use their services. A \$75 deposit is required to ensure the return of a trap. There is no additional rental fee, and you have use of the trap for one week. Other local sources of animal-friendly trap rentals are Gardeners Supply and CLS Pet store.

Once you qualify for help through Happy Kern Cats, you can make appointments at Critters Without Litters to have feral and free-roaming cats altered Monday through Thursday. Appointments can be made just a day ahead of time. In the case of Monday appointments, please call the Friday before.

case of Monday appointments, please call the Friday before. If you fail to trap the cat, please call the clinic that morning to cancel your appointment. Cats must be brought to the clinic in proper traps. To be spayed or neutered, cats must be at least 12 weeks old and weigh at least three pounds. Multiple cats, one per trap, may be brought in at the same time.

Food Assistance Program

During September and October, The Cat People gave out 810 lbs. of dry cat food and 324 cans of wet food to local families having trouble feeding their cats & kittens regularly. Recently, we added five participants to this program. Now on the average, there are 50 families in need that get food assistance from us every month. Our thanks go out to Cyd Walker and Laura Stockton for donating cat food for this program.

In addition, we'd like to thank Traci McCann for her donation of comforters and pet care supplies. Our appreciation also goes out to Cheryl Roberts and to The Bakersfield Woman's Club for their donations of towels and blankets. These donations will be used to help care for the Hart Park cats and for our fostering efforts.

If you would like to donate food for the Park cats, we could use 16 pound bags of kibble and 22 oz cans of food (no fish, please!). The 16 pound size of kibble is easiest for our park feeders to manage, and the 22 oz can would be most economical for you to purchase. Just drop them off at the Gift Shop or at Petco on Rosedale Hwy any Saturday.

In case you don't know, that's what our "Sanctuary Fund" is dedicated to. We have had some very generous donors in the past and have accumulated a large amount of cash (which is in a restricted account) but we're not quite at the total. We estimate we will need about \$300,000. When we get to half of that amount we can start looking for matching grants -- so you see, we're almost but not quite there!

All of us on the Board, and all our volunteers and supporters, share our dream of a place where adoptable cats can roam free in indoor/outdoor quarters, and where we can run a really spiffy gift shop. In the meantime, please keep those donations coming. Any little bit helps. Our total to date is:


This little sweetie has been living at the Park for some time. As you can see, she eats well! She has been spayed and if we had room, we would take her in and put her up for adoption.


