Stained Glass Quilting Class Description

Join Sylvia Q. Davis in this 6-hour workshop to create a wall hanging reminiscent of stained glass windows. Select one of her designs or let her know a subject you would like to recreate in this format. You will start by copying the pattern and then learning how to apply the color patches to this appliqué project. Then you will apply

the "lead" to make the stained glass illusion come forth. Quilting is very simple. You should be at least 75% complete at the end of the workshop if you select one of the simpler designs.



2016 Quilt Judging News

CeCe Westerfield

Do you realize that a year from now our 2016 Quilt Show will be over? This next year will go quickly and we all know how time flies when we are having fun! I sincerely hope that all our Guild members (that's YOU) are planning to enter at least one quilt in our Show....we have over 260 members and it would be fantastic to be able to hang that many quilts. I have heard so many times, from so many people, that our quilt show is one of the best in our area. So, ladies, let's get those quilts ready!

There are some important changes to Quilt Judging that I want to make you aware of, the first being how you will enter your quilt. Entries will no longer be made online nor will we be using PayPal for payment. There will be an entry form on our new website which you can print and fill out. I will also have copies available at the Guild meetings. Payment can be made by cash or check (made out to CPQ). The entry fee for judged quilts is \$10.00 for the first quilt, \$5.00 for all subsequent entries. For example: one quilt = \$10.00; two quilts = \$15.00; three quilts = \$20.00. There is no fee for Display Only quilts. Entries will be due (postmarked by) January 3, 2016.



We are adding a category in Judged Quilts called True Miniature. These quilts must measure less than 24" on a side and must represent a full size quilt. It cannot be a single block. I've included a picture of a True Miniature quilt with this article.

The categories that historically have large numbers of entries (i.e. pieced and appliqué) will be expanded from two sizes to three sizes, which will be Large, Small and Wall. This will mean more ribbons to be won!

Our quilt judge will be Ann Turley. She has judged our Quilt Show in the past and we are looking forward to her return.

2016 Quilt Show Challenges

Don't forget about our two great Challenges for the upcoming Guild show!

First we have the Fiesta Challenge being sponsored by Thimble Towne. We still have a few fat 8th packs available for \$5.00. Remember that at least a small amount of each color must be used in the quilt. Your quilt must be no larger than 36" square. Think CELEBRATION. Your quilt is due to me no later than the October 2015 Guild meeting. We've already had our first quilt entered!! Your quilts will be judged in the following categories: Best Use of Color, Best Use of Theme, and Viewer's Choice voting.

Bolts to Binding is sponsoring our second challenge, Heart Beats. All quilts in this challenge must measure 32" square and be constructed of 100% cotton fabric, cotton thread, and if you use batting, it must be 100% cotton. There must be a heart somewhere in the quilt whether it is a heart shaped piece or a heart print fabric. You can use any color(s) you desire! Your quilt for the Heart Beats Challenge is due to me no later than the November 2015 Guild meeting. The winners will be selected totally on a Viewer's Choice vote. All Heart Beats quilts entered will not be returned to you but will be sent to local hospitals through our Loving Hands.






