





Follow the Clues

A small cat toy

A little trail of yarn

Little bits of cat food (or cat bair!)

An empty fish bowl

4. When students come in, announce that the item has been stolen and see if they can do better than Max at finding the clues to who stole it. When they've determined it's a cat, let them find the cat and with it, the missing item!



GARDEN COUNTING




There are 8 carrots in the garden.

How many carrots are left?






There are 6 berries in the garden.
