PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Dear YOSAC friends and families,

YOSAC has had an exciting season transitioning from our outstanding conductor of 27 years, Dr. Jason Klein, to our dynamic conductor for this year, Ms. Heidi Dahms, who led our orchestras through a very successful Veterans Day concert and a memorable concert featuring Mr. Philip Santos, violin instructor at CSUEB. Coming up is our final concert on Sunday, May 17, which will treat the audience to a number of movie themes. Please join us in saying farewell to Ms. Dahms and in supporting our musicians as we close out the season!

As current members of YOSAC already know, Ms. Dahms will not be returning next season and will pass the baton to Mr. (soon to be Dr.) Bill Harrington, parent of Sarah (Symphony Orchestra) and Rachel (String Orchestra) and a long time highly respected music educator and professional French horn player in the Bay Area. He graduated with a four-year full scholarship from the San Francisco Conservatory of Music and holds an M.A. in Music from California State University, East Bay along with a California Lifetime Teaching Credential in Music. He will be finishing his Doctorate in Music Education through Boston University by the end of this year.

As a music educator, Mr. Harrington is Past President of the California Orchestra Directors Association, Music Director at Patten Academy and Minister of Music at Christian Cathedral. He is also an Adjunct Lecturer at Columbia College (Coast Guard Island) and California State University East Bay, where he teaches music appreciation and American music. As a professional musician, he has performed on the French horn with virtually every professional orchestra in the greater Bay Area. He currently plays with the Modesto Symphony, the Brassworks of San Francisco Brass Quintet and Band, and most recently, with the Oakland Ballet and the Lamplighters Operetta Company. He is also Music Director and Conductor of the Patten Symphonette, a community orchestra composed of both professional and amateur musicians.

Mr. Harrington will hold auditions for all current YOSAC students as well as prospective students on Saturday, May 30, from 5-9 pm. This is his chance to assess the abilities of all current students as well as prospective students. An audition application is available online at YOSAC.org. Please encourage other young musicians you know to audition for the 2015-2016 season. Let's make our orchestra bigger and stronger by all of us spreading the word wherever we can!

I hope you will consider taking advantage of one or more of the great opportunities for making music in the summer: La Honda Music Camp, Jenny Lin Summer Music Camp, and the Young Musicians Chamber Music Program. You can find details farther on in this newsletter.
