CAPTAIN'S REPORT

Congratulations to the men's Wednesday and Saturday 18-Hole competition winners in the past month. Ray Willison was the winner of the \$1000 for a golfing holiday in Bali sponsored by Jaguar Cabling. Evan Hobley and Bede Harold (with a combined age of about 180!) won the Aggregate Stableford event on Wednesday 15th. Saturday winners included Ray Willison, Neville Meyers, Richard Bushell (reputedly the best 21 handicapper in the club and also the winner of the July monthly mug), John Durack and Richard Sounness.

Particularly for Social Plus members but also others wanting to play 9-Holes competitively, with more pressure perhaps than during a practise round on your own, there are 9-Hole competitions for men on Monday and Wednesday mornings. No experience necessary and you can book online or call the Pro Shop to get a starting time (which is roughly between 7.30 and 8.00 am). It is a great way to meet people and to start playing competitive golf. Winners, and those with scores of 18 or more, even get their name in the paper.

I recently watched someone trying to play from the lateral hazard (between the red markers and the boundary fence) on the 12th fairway. Consequently, a reminder that if you choose to play your ball from this lateral hazard, instead of taking a drop back onto the fairway with a 1-Stoke penalty, that Rule 13-4 applies. This states in part that before making a stroke at a ball that is in a hazard (whether a bunker or a water hazard) the player must not:

- Test the condition of the hazard or any similar hazard.
- b. Touch the ground in the hazard or water in the water hazard with his hand or a club: or
- Touch or move a loose impediment lying in or touching the hazard.

In other words, grounding your club or removing loose impediments in the lateral hazard before your stroke, the same as in a bunker, is not kosher! The penalty is two (2) strokes in Stroke Play, loss of hole in Match Play.

Please repair your divots on the fairways and your pug marks on the green. There is also no loss of face if you repair someone else's divot or pug mark and we thank you for doing so.

Tip from the Pro.....



TIP FROM THE PRO

Rules.... Relief from Immovable Obstructions - Rule 24-2b

Except when the ball is in a water hazard or a lateral water hazard, a player may take relief from interference by an immovable obstruction as follows:

Through the green: If the ball lies through the green (through the green is the whole area of the course except: The teeing ground and the putting green of the hole being played, and all hazards on the course) the player must lift the ball and drop it, without penalty, within one club-length of and not nearer the hole than the nearest point of relief. The nearest point of relief must not be in a hazard or on a putting green. When the ball is dropped within one club-length of the nearest point of relief, the ball must first strike a part of the course at a spot that avoids interference by the immovable obstruction and is not in a hazard or on a putting green.

Question.. The Note to the Definition of "Nearest Point of Relief" provides that the player should determine this point by using "the club with which he would have made his next stroke if the condition were not there to simulate the address position, direction of play and swing for such stroke" May the player use any club, address position, direction of play or swing in determining the nearest point of relief?

Answer.. No. in determining the nearest point of relief accurately it is recommended that the player use the club, address position, direction of play and swing (right or left handed) that he would have used had the obstruction or condition not been there. For example, the player has interference from an immovable obstruction and, were it not for the obstruction, he would have used a right handed stroke with a 4 iron to play the ball from its original position towards the green. To determine the nearest point of relief accurately, he should use a right handed stroke with a 4 iron and the direction of play should be towards the green.

COURSE UPDATE

Hi Members,

This is the first article for what will become a regular feature in the Woolly Bush. I intend to keep all members up to date on some of the main activities being undertaken through the workings of the Course Committee. The Course Committee consists of Narelle Caddy, Ron McTaggart, Steve Opalinski, Jason Fleming, Ian Redmond and myself as Chair.

Most of you will be aware that the Club has been looking at replacing the shed used for the storage and maintenance of all the equipment that Jason and his team use to maintain our course. At present, we are looking at two options — replacing the current shed or adding a new workshop shed on to the end of the present shed. While replacing the complete shed is the preferred option, we need to keep the other option on the table while funding sources are still being pursued. To that extent, the Club has recently submitted an application to the WA Dept. of Sport and Recreation for funding support for replacing the shed. The evaluation process will take some months and a final outcome will probably not be known until November. There is no guarantee that the outcome will be in our favour. The Course Committee will monitor the process and keep everyone informed of the outcome.

At its June meeting, the Management Committee approved the installation of an outside toilet at the southern end of the course next to the 15th tee. When informed of our intentions to install the toilet, the City of Albany advised the Club that this location was in fact not part of the Club's leased area. To change the lease area is a protracted process and could take up to 12 months. The Management Committee has since decided to locate the toilet to the right of the 4th green within the current leased area. The City has been informed of the new location and has sought further details of the toilet and septic system. Sven Tobiassen has put this information package together and it has been submitted to the City. Thanks Sven for all your help in taking this forward.

Jason and his team continue to keep our great course in excellent condition and we greatly appreciate their efforts. We can all play a part in supporting them by filling in divots and repairing plug marks on the greens. We also don't need to mark nearest the pin locations by scratching an arrow on the green!

Thanks also to my fellow Monday morning workers for their efforts in keeping the grass down between the fairways.
