HANDLERS GUIDELINES

Best Kept - Dogs should have a clean and well brushed coat, clean eyes and ears and should be well fed, but not overweight. The cats in this section should have a shiny well brushed coat with no loose fur or tangles and clean eyes and ears. Birds should be in a clean cage, containing fresh drinking water. The bird should have clean, clear eyes and clean feathers. All other pets should be in a clean and suitably sized container and should look well cared for.

Best Mannered Dog- Dogs are to be well behaved and suitably controlled by its owner.

Dog with the Wagglest Tall - Dog must be clean and obedient but, most importantly, it must wag its tail in a happy manner.

Prettlest Pet - The pet should be well kept and have a colourful and interesting coat, or fur, feathers or skin.

Most Obedient Dog - The judge will set simple tasks and be looking for the dog that happily obeys its owner.

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

- The entry form below may be <u>EITHER</u> submitted to the Secretary's Office BEFORE 30th October <u>OR</u> may be brought to the Pet Parade on the 31st October. Victorian Agricultural Shows Ltd and Sale and District Agricultural Society (together "the Suppliers") advise that participation in animal handling at an agricultural show contains elements of risk, both obvious and inherent. The handling of animals is a dangerous recreational activity as animals can act in a sudden and unpredictable way, especially when frightened or hurt.

- 1. By signing this waiver I acknowledged that:
 - participation in animal handling is a hazardous activity and may result in injury, loss, damage or death to me;
 - 1.2. participation in animal handling requires certain skills. I declare that I have sufficient skills to be able to safely and properly participate in the events;
 - 1.3. animals can act in a sudden and unpredictable ways, especially if frightened or hurt, or if exposed to loud or unfamiliar noises;
 - 1.4. animal showing events will be held in close proximity to rides and large groups of people, and that there may be loud and unfamiliar noises which can frighten animals;
 - 1.5. if the event is held outdoors, there are risks to me as a result of the weather conditions, including either extreme hot or cold weather, rain or wind:
 - 1.6. insects or other animals may cause animals to become frightened and act in an unpredictable way;
 - 1.7. there is inherent in events involving the handling of animals the risk of suffering injury including injuries caused by animals; and
 - 1.8. I use the facilities of Sale and District Agricultural Society entirely at my own risk, as I find them and with the prior acceptance of the risk of possible danger to me.
- 2. If I suffer harm while participating in an animal handling event, I will not hold the Suppliers, their employees or agents legally responsible for any injuries I suffer. I will not sue the Suppliers, their employees or agents for any claims, costs, damages or liability. I agree to release the Suppliers and their employees from legal responsibility for the services I have been provided.
- 3. I acknowledge and agree that my participation in the event and associated activities is a danger and may have inherent risks as a result of which personal injury (and sometimes death) may occur and I accept and assume all such risks of personal injury or death in anyway whatsoever arising from these activities and hereby waive my individual right to sue the Suppliers for all claims I or my representatives may have for such personal injury or death against the Suppliers in any way whatsoever arising from or in connection with these activities.
- 4. I will not consume any alcohol or illicit drugs while participating in the event and agree that such use may result in me being excluded from an event with no entitlement to any refund of money paid for entry to the Suppliers.

1/3 cup sherry or brandy

60g self raising flour

1/4 teaspoon grated nutmeg

1/2 teaspoon ground ginger

1/2 teaspoon ground cloves

250g butter

250g soft brown sugar

1/2 teaspoon lemon essence OR finely grated lemon rind

1/2 teaspoon almond essence

1/2 teaspoon vanilla essence

4 large eggs

METHOD: Mix together all the fruits and nuts and sprinkle with the sherry or brandy. Cover and leave for at least 1hr, but preferably overnight. Sift together the flours and spices. Cream together the butter and sugar with the essences. Add the eggs one at a time, beating well after each addition, and then alternately add the fruit and flour mixtures. Mix thoroughly. The mixture should be stiff enough to support a wooden spoon.
