#### **Sheffield Cathedral wins top Heritage Award**

We are delighted that Sheffield Cathedral has been awarded the prestigious Sandford Award for Heritage Education 2015. This is an independently judged, quality assured assessment of education programmes at heritage sites, museums, and collections across Britain.

Past winners include Hampton Court Palace, Edinburgh Castle, Beamish, York Castle Museum and Blenheim Palace, so winning this award places Sheffield Cathedral's Heritage Learning on a par with these major heritage sites.

With Heritage Lottery Funding support as part of the Gateway Project, we now run a rich and varied programme of formal and informal heritage learning opportunities, welcoming and engaging many new visitors to the cathedral. This includes visits for school groups, holiday activities for children and families, Heritage Open Days, talks, tours and historical and cultural events. The programme is led by Janet Ridler, our Heritage Learning Officer, and supported by the work of Chris Carrington, Volunteer Co-Ordinator, and a dedicated team of volunteer education assistants, guides and welcomers.

Lead judge Christopher Green commented that: The local and national significance of Sheffield Cathedral's heritage learning provision is shown in its striking location and in the carefully conceived educational programmes. These programmes employ a wealth of academic, practical and role-play sessions in highly effective ways that inspire and inform. The Cathedral building exhibits many physical changes that reflect its rich heritage and history, but it retains its place as a sanctuary and centre for exploration and learning for all across its diverse community.

It is a fantastic achievement that the excellent quality of Sheffield Cathedral's Heritage Learning programme has led to this national recognition and places us at the forefront of Heritage Learning in the UK.

Leading thinkers, professionals and philanthropist meet in a timely summit to examine the global emerging trends in philanthropic funding. This event aims to inform the development of a new framework for building greater support for the visual arts beyond the major cultural capitals. Please note that because of the above Summit the Cathedral will close to visitors from 11.00. **Classical Sheffield Weekend**, 23 – 25 October 2015. Sheffield Cathedral is proud to be taking part in the Classical Sheffield Weekend Music Festival. This October Sheffield's choirs, ensembles, orchestras and instrumentalists come together in the first ever Classical Sheffield Festival of Music.

More than 600 singers and instrumentalists, from age 7 to 82, professional and amateur, will fill the city with music in the biggest and most varied celebration of classical music it has ever seen. There'll be 30 concerts, from a bite-sized 20 minutes



to 90 minutes long in seven venues: Sheffield Cathedral, City Hall and City Hall Ballroom, Crucible Studio, Blue Moon Cafe, Firth Hall, and a programme of pop-up music in Winter Garden.

Four symphony orchestras, seven chamber ensembles, twelve choirs, and two opera companies will perform works by more than 50 composers, including Mozart, Mussorgsky, Bernstein, Boulez, Tippett, Piazzolla, Beethoven, Stravinsky, Turnage, Bartok, Barber and Terry Riley as well as Indian classical music and classical-influenced jazz. The festival starts on Friday 23October with the Hallé Orchestra conducted by Sheffield-born RyanWigglesworth and ends with New York Counterpoint at Firth Hall on Sunday 25 October.

Most concert tickets are just £5 with those aged 18 and under going completely free. There are two days of free events in the Winter Garden and Blue Moon café. For more information, or to book your tickets, please visit www.classicalweekend.com.
