Take Action: Protect Campus Activism

Call on the California Senate to amend or reject <u>SCR 35</u>, which perpetuates the conflation of anti-Semitism and protected free speech critical of Israel.

<u>Senate Concurrent Resolution 35</u> will be heard this Wednesday, April 29, by the Senate Education Committee. The resolution silences advocacy for Palestinian rights on California campuses by using a definition of anti-Semitism that includes criticism of Israel.

<u>Take Action:</u> call the senators listed below and address the following points:

- "We applaud the Senate's efforts to confront racism and bigotry on college campuses, including anti-Semitism. However,"
- "SCR 35 as currently written is unduly vague": it calls on the Senate to "condemn any act of anti-Semitism augmenting education programs" at publicly funded schools in California. It is unclear what this means, but we believe it is meant to have a chilling effect on protected speech. The Senate Education Committee should delete or clarify and define this clause in a way that ensures it will not chill free speech or academic freedom.
- "The resolution reinforces a false characterization of the problem of anti-Semitism on California's campuses." While there have been incidents of anti-Semitism on university campuses this resolution fails to clearly distinguish between anti-Semitism and criticism of Israel. This only muddies the waters and makes it more difficult to recognize and confront real anti-Semitism. The resolution should be amended to clearly state that the intent is not to chill protected political expression.
- "The resolution refers to an over-broad definition of anti-Semitism by the U.S. State Department." The State Department's full definition lists the widely-criticized "3 D's" of "anti-Semitism related to Israel": Delegitimization, Demonization, and applying a Double standard. This definition is not in use domestically in the United States because it would violate the First Amendment. We call on the Senate to replace the reference to the State Department definition of anti-Semitism with a standard dictionary definition.
