WHAT IS THE MORE INITIATIVE?

This initiative is our expanded and unified vision over the next two years for the mission of Vintage Church. We are believing Jesus for MORE resources for our church, MORE environments for our city, and MORE impact for our world. In order to accomplish this ONE VISION, we are going to unite as ONE CHURCH around ONE FUND.

WHY DO WE NEED TO EXPAND VINTAGE CHURCH?

Our mission drives us. Jesus has called Vintage Church to Gospel Multiplication. We have, we are, and we will continue to live the Gospel, serve the city, and be the church in New Orleans and beyond. With so many people in our city and world that need Jesus, we are compelled to keep expanding Vintage Church. Our current resources, environments, and impact are limited and are running out of space. This new initiative will provide for MORE.

WHAT IS ONE FUND AND WHY ARE WE CHANGING TO ONE FUND GIVING? IS THIS A CAPITAL CAMPAIGN?

ONE Fund is a new-school capital campaign that more effectively equips and unites Vintage Church to accomplish who Jesus has called us to be today and tomorrow. With a God-sized goal of \$3 million, every dollar given will count as a part of our ONE VISION. Instead of dividing our time and resources into a side expansion project, we are uniting all of our time and resources. We can do more TOGETHER than we can do apart. We also don't believe that any part of our ministry is less important or valuable than any other part. When we separate "missions giving" from "supporting the church," it is easy to forget that supporting the church is supporting the mission. The church is Christ's "Plan A" for reaching our city and world with the Gospel.

WILL ONE FUND TAKE AWAY OUR GX FUND AND ANY OTHER SPECIAL FUNDS?

During this two-year period, every generous contribution to God's work through Vintage Church is a contribution to our MORE Initiative. Every aspect of our current ministry and every aspect of our future ministry will be funded through ONE Fund. There will be no separate funds. Therefore, every weekend becomes an opportunity to celebrate and contribute towards what God is doing in and through Vintage as we give for our church, our city, and our world.

WHAT ARE THE EXPANDED MINISTRY AND LEADERSHIP DETAILS FOR THE FOCUS OF <u>MORE</u> <u>RESOURCE FOR OUR CHURCH</u>?

We are raising our annual budget in order to provide more resources for our generations, outreach, and arts ministries. With regard to our generations, we are excited to see these ministries grow, and we will equip them with the resources needed to keep going to another level. We are also excited to expand generations into all the different ages and stages of life that are represented in our church. We are hoping to implement a full-time leader that will oversee our generations ministry. With regard to our outreach, we are excited to come alongside our current ministry partners in our city and around the world with more resources. With regard to our arts, the Vintage Arts Center will give us some new ministry opportunities that we will take to another level with these resources.

WHY IS IT IMPORTANT FOR THE MORE IMPACT FOR OUR WORLD FOCUS TO RECEIVE 10% OF THE MORE INITIATIVE?

Vintage Church has always dedicated 10% and above to ministry opportunities that extend beyond our church family and into our world. We want to continue in this priority. In order for us to accomplish this vision, we are uniting together to give to ONE Fund. As we believe in Scripture, this is just the beginning. The tithe is not a ceiling for us; it is a trampoline. Our united giving as Vintage Church is not about equal giving; it is about equal sacrifice. We are praying for generous sacrifices. Scripture proves that God's heart is moved more by someone who gives a \$1,000 contribution that is 15% of their income than someone else who gives \$10,000 that is 2% of their income. As Vintage Church is modeling this 10% sacrifice, we are also asking for everyone in our church to consider obediently giving at least 10% of their income and resources to the Lord. Let's sacrifice equally together!

WHAT IF BECOMING A FAITHFUL GIVER OR EXTRAVAGANT GIVER IS NOT POSSIBLE FOR ME?

We completely understand that there are financial demands and challenges in our lives. However, we also believe that Jesus has called us to manage His money well. Our church has provided some great resources that will equip you to manage God's money for God's glory. Please consider reaching out to us in this season. If you cannot give as a faithful or extravagant giver, we would love for you to unite with us by stepping up in your giving (see Vintage Church's Giving Ladder).

HOW LONG HAS VINTAGE BEEN WORKING ON THIS VISION? WHAT WERE THE OTHER OPTIONS AND HOW DID WE ARRIVE AT THIS EXPANDED VISION?

Honestly, we started working on this vision the moment that Jesus called our Lead Pastor to plant Vintage Church. This journey has taken our individuals, community groups, and gatherings into so many exciting directions and locations all over the city. There has never been an option of not working on an expanded vision. A church without an expanded vision is a dead church. The MORE

Initiative has been strategically worked on for the last two years. The first and third focuses of the MORE Initiative have always been a major part of our vision and will continue to be a major part of our vision. We are continuing to pray for MORE resources for our church and MORE impact for our world. In regards to MORE environments for our city, we considered a number of options. We considered selling our Jefferson property, finding another united location, and going all-in at Vintage Jefferson and leaving Orleans. After much prayer, research, working with strategic partner churches and church consultants, and discussion with our Vintage leadership, Jesus has called and affirmed the MORE Initiative as His next steps.



WHAT ARE THE DETAILS OF MORE ENVIRONMENTS FOR OUR CITY?

Vintage Orleans Vintage Arts Center details:

- This September, we are officially launching our Vintage Arts Center. Newly re-designed, the Arts Center will be even more outfitted as an ideal creative environment and event venue. It will be capable of hosting a diverse array of gatherings. recording sessions, displays, parties, and performances. Our desire is to bridge community, creativity, culture, and celebration.
- Vintage Jefferson Expansion & Renovation details:
 - •We are going to expand and renovate Vintage Jefferson due to the current limitations of the property. This will be phase 1 of a master plan that will eventually maximize our property into a Vintage Community Center for our church and our city. Phase 1 will be connected with the property master plan of the Vintage Community Center.

WHAT IS THE PLAN FOR THE WORK AND COMPLETION OF OUR NEW ENVIRONMENTS?

It is our plan that the Vintage Arts Center and the Vintage Jefferson Expansion and Renovation will take place this fall. In order to complete this, Vintage Church will seek to finance a construction loan. During the month of August, we will unite as ONE CHURCH on Sunday mornings in a controlled environment tent on the Vintage Jefferson property for the launch of the MORE Initiative. We will celebrate the beginning of the expansion and renovation of our Vintage Jefferson property in September. Our Vintage Arts team will be preparing the Vintage Arts Center through the month of August for an official launch of our ministry also in September. In the fall, our church will gather on Sunday mornings in a controlled environment tent and on Sunday nights at the Vintage Arts Center. It is our hope to move into our newly expanded and renovated property on Sunday mornings before the end of the year.

WHEN WILL WE BEGIN TO WORK ON PHASE 2 OF VINTAGE JEFFERSON AND THE PURSUIT OF OUR **NEW VINTAGE ORLEANS GATHERING LOCATION?**

With regard to the new Vintage Orleans gathering location, we are already researching and praying for this provision. We have gathered in many different locations all over Orleans parish and have a strong understanding of what is available and what will be best for our future. It would be our preference to own our new location. Depending on what God provides, we are open to the Vintage Arts Center remaining in the current location or moving into a new location. Begin praying for the Lord to provide.

With regard to the Vintage Community Center in Jefferson, we will only begin this expanded vision when our Vintage Church growth goals of finances, attendance, and ministry have been reached. Our expansion and renovation in phase 1 is going to equip us with the space needed to reach these goals. We are excited to also see God provide for this vision through our church. The Vintage Community Center will be an amazing ministry center that will equip us to be in the city and for the city.

WHY ARE WE MOVING INTO OUR NEW ENVIRONMENTS SO FAST? DOES VINTAGE HAVE ANY CURRENT DEBT AND WHAT IS OUR BELIEF ABOUT DEBT, BIBLICALLY AND PHILOSOPHICALLY?

For the entire history of Vintage Church, we have operated with a debt-free budget. As a church family, we have gathered in various locations in order to accommodate our growing attendance. However, as we have continued to grow it has become apparent that our current spaces will not accommodate our growing attendance, so now is the time to plan for expansion for our present and future needs.

We affirm what the Bible teaches about debt, including not being enslaved to it and counting the cost of it. The form of debt we are planning for is best compared to a mortgage, whereby we will obtain a loan for a specific purpose. Acquiring debt during seasons of rapid growth and expansion, like the one we're in, is a tension we expect to continue and will need to manage for the next several years. We desire to accommodate a responsible, manageable level of debt, if necessary, in order to leverage the incredible opportunity we have to reach more people. Of course, planned repayment is part of being responsible. The larger the down payment, the smaller the loan, which we believe is good stewardship.

TABERNACLING WITH GOD UNDERSTANDING THE BLESSING OF GOD'S PRESENCE IN OUR MIDST

One of the most unique and incredible things about the God of the Bible is his desire to relate to his creation. In many religions, the god or gods are often distant and indifferent to their creation. This is not the case with the God of the Bible. In fact, God goes out of his way to be near his people. While God's presence was with humanity from the beginning, he chose to dwell with the people of Israel years later in a very particular way.

GOD PITCHES HIS TENT AMONG HIS PEOPLE

In Exodus 25:8, God tells Moses, the leader of the Israelites, "let them make me a sanctuary, that I may dwell in their midst." From Exodus 25 through 31, God then provides instructions on how to build this sanctuary. In Exodus 35-40, the people of Israel collect the necessary materials needed and construct God's sanctuary. Something incredible happens when God's sanctuary, known as the tabernacle, is completed. Exodus 40:34 proclaims, "Then the cloud covered the tent of the meeting, and the glory of the LORD filled the tabernacle." What a picture. To be honest, it is difficult to visualize or even put into words what the glory of the LORD might have looked like. Nonetheless, it surely was a sight the people of Israel would never forget.

While the spectacle of God's glory resting in the tabernacle must have been awe-inspiring, the tabernacle displayed an indescribable truth: the God of the universe, who created and sustains all things, now dwells among his people. What an incalculable truth! For so long, God had practically been silent to the people of Israel (see Exodus 2:23-25) and now he was not only speaking to his people, he was dwelling in their midst.

THE NEARNESS, YET REMOTENESS OF GOD'S PRESENCE

When theologians dialogue about God's presence, they often use two terms to describe God: transcendent and immanent. Transcendence refers to God's separateness or otherness, whereas God's immanence refers to his nearness and proximity to his creation. Depending on whether you were raised in the church and what tradition you were raised in, either God's transcendence or his immanence was highlighted. As Christians, we have a difficult time balancing both God's transcendence and immanence; however, the tabernacle provided an outlet where God could demonstrate both his transcendence and immanence.

God was immanent through the tabernacle in that his presence was literally in the midst of the people. When the people of Israel encamped somewhere, the tabernacle would be in the center of the camp, with the twelve tribes of Israel encircled around the tabernacle. At the same time, not just everyone could enter into the tabernacle. Only those set apart for the work of the tabernacle could enter into it. In fact, the tabernacle consisted of two primary rooms. In the first room, the holy place, any priest could walk in and worship in that room. However, a large curtain separated the holy place from the Holy of Holies. Inside the Holy of Holies rested the ark of the covenant, a gold-laden box that contained three things: the Ten Commandments, Aaron's budded staff, and manna (Hebrews 9:4). It was upon the ark of the covenant that God's presence rested, serving as his functional throne. Because the Holy of Holies contained God's presence, only the high priest could enter it, and he could only do this on the Day of Atonement (see Leviticus 16). All of this served to demonstrate that God is holy and must be separate from his creation.

GOD PUT ON FLESH & TABERNACLED AMONG US

The people of Israel no doubt believed God could not get any closer to them than he did in the tabernacle and later the temple. However, God surprised everyone when he came to the earth as Jesus. John 1:14 describes this best when it says, "And the Word became flesh and dwelt among us, and we have seen his glory, glory as of the only Son from the Father, full of grace and truth." When you read "dwelt among us" you should read "tabernacled among us." Interestingly, John the apostle ties Jesus' dwelling with humanity with God's dwelling with the people of Israel in the tabernacle.

While Jesus would later be murdered, resurrected, and ascend into heaven, his presence has still not left us. In John 16:7, Jesus promises, "I tell you the truth: it is to your advantage that I go away, for if I do not go away, the Helper will not come to you. But if I go, I will send him to you." Today, in Christ, you and I have the presence of God within us. God is closer to us than he has every been. Do not lose sight of that. The Israelites gave above and beyond to allow God's presence to be in their midst (Exodus 36:7). We have the presence of God within us, not because of anything we have done or accomplished, but because of what Jesus has done. Knowing we've done nothing to receive God's presence, perhaps we can rest in his presence today.

FROM TABERNACLE TO SPIRIT

HOW WE PARTICIPATE IN WORSHIPPING GOD

The word "worship" conjures up all sort of images, experiences, and ideas in our minds. For some of us, the idea of worship takes us back to previous experiences in church. We think about prior worship services we have experienced. This might include the different styles of worship we've encountered, including the singing of hymns with a piano and organ or the singing of new, contemporary worship songs with a praise band. Each of our experiences are different and culturally defined. If you go somewhere else in the world, you might experience a very different worship service.

The same can be said for the early Israelites. Previously, we discussed the importance of the tabernacle and how it was the home of God's presence. Because God's presence dwelt in the tabernacle, it became the center of worship for the people of Israel. However, their worship certainly looked different from ours today. When we think about worship, we must not get caught up in what it looks like. Rather, we should focus on the purpose of worship. The English word "worship" comes from the old English word "weorbscipe," meaning "denoting the worthiness of an individual to receive special honor in accordance with that worth."

WORSHIPPING THE GOD AMONG MANY GODS

Above all, the most foundational element to the Israelites' worship was the focus of their worship. In Exodus 20, God gives the Ten Commandments to Israel, and of the Ten Commandments, the first four all relate to the worship of God. In particular, God commands the people of Israel to worship him alone (Exodus 20:3) and not make an image to represent God (Exodus 20:4). In Exodus 32, we get a brief glimpse of God's attitude toward Israel when they break these commandments. In this episode, the Israelites choose to make a golden calf representing God. God's reaction is noted: "I have seen this people, and behold, it is a stiff-necked people. Now therefore let me alone, that my wrath my burn hot against them and I may consume them" (Exodus 32:9-10). Above all, for Israel, worship was to be centered around the One who deserved worship.

THAT'S NOT HOW WE DO IT

Worship for the Israelites centered around the tabernacle and the sacrificial system, much of which can be found in Leviticus 1-7. "The purpose of the sacrifices and offerings within the sanctuary system, therefore, was to provide a means of approaching the Lord in his place of manifest presence in Israel and to maintain that presence by preserving the purity and holiness of the sanctuary." Ultimately the people of Israel would bring sacrifices to the tabernacle, where the priests would then offer sacrifices to the Lord on behalf of the people. These sacrifices were brought for several reasons, two primary reasons being to atone for sin and worship God. While the people were not allowed to participate in carrying out the sacrifices to the priests at the tabernacle, they were worshipping the Lord. While different from the way we worship today, the purpose of the Israelites worship was still to bestow honor and glory to God.

JESUS CHANGED EVERYTHING

Just as the tabernacle was the center of worship for Israel in the desert, the temple would later become the center of worship in the Promised Land. In John 4, we read of an encounter Jesus had with a Samaritan woman. While controversial in its day, Jesus' encounter with the Samaritan was even more controversial for what he says. In John 4:21–24, Jesus declares,

Woman, believe me, the hour is coming when neither on this mountain nor in Jerusalem will you worship the Father. You worship what you do not know; we worship what we know, for salvation is from the Jews. But the hour is coming, and is now here, when the true worshipers will worship the Father in spirit and truth, for the Father is seeking such people to worship him. God is spirit, and those who worship him must worship in spirit and truth.

The coming of Jesus changed everything, including worship. This Samaritan woman was confused because she thought Jesus was interested in debating where they should worship. The Jews said Jerusalem at the temple and the Samaritans said at Mt. Gerizim. Jesus says, "neither!" "The question of the correct place to worship would soon be irrelevant, for the times were about to change. Worship would no longer be localized in a "sacred place." Instead of location, Jesus says worship will be centered around spirit and truth, meaning by the Holy Spirit. Just as the presence of God moved from the tabernacle to the indwelling of the Spirit in believers, so too does worship move from the tabernacle (or temple) to those indwelt by the Holy Spirit. The Israelites were blessed because they were given the opportunity to worship the Lord at the tabernacle. Today, you and I are even more blessed because we are offered the opportunity to worship the Lord through his Spirit, not confined to any particular location. Because we are Spirit-filled people, today may each of us participate in worshipping our Lord in both Spirit and truth.

OFFERING OUR LIVES HOW THE TABERNACLE TEACHES US TO WORSHIP

Previously, we've discovered two truths about the tabernacle: (1) the presence of God dwelt in the tabernacle and (2) God was worshipped in the tabernacle. As a part of that worship, we also briefly discussed how God allowed his people to participate in worship. Building upon the idea of participatory worship, we're going to delve deeper into how the Israelites participated in worship and what their experience means for us today.

LIMITED PARTICIPATION

While the Israelites were able to worship the Lord by offering sacrifices to him, they were ultimately limited in their worship. According to his word, only the priests and Levites were allowed to directly offer sacrifices to the Lord. So, the people were left with the option of only bringing their sacrifices to the priests and Levites and not God himself. The priesthood flowed directly from the lineage of Aaron, who was the first high priest of Israel. Originally, God had selected the first-born of Israel to serve in a secondary priestly function; however, the Levites (i.e. those from the tribe of Levi) were chosen by God to replace the first-born when the Levites executed those who turned to idolatry in Exodus 32. Therefore those who were actively and directly involved in the worship of God were the priests and Levites.

In worshipping the Lord, the primary role of the priests and Levites was to serve as mediators between God and the people of Israel. "To be a priest was to operate in the danger zone of encroaching upon the divine realm for the purposes of representing the divine will to the community and representing the community before God." The priests represented the Lord amongst the people in several ways, including serving as overseers of the tabernacle and sacrificial system as well maintaining and restoring holiness and purification.

WHEN YOU HAVE PURPOSE

The people of Israel, however, were not without purpose. While a group of priests and Levites existed, God called all the people of Israel to the priesthood. In Exodus 19:6, God describes the people of Israel as "a kingdom of priests and a holy nation." If the priests and Levites already existed, why did the people of Israel need to be a "kingdom of priests?" Ultimately God was calling and challenging the people of Israel to be more than just a nation. As the priests were mediators for the people of Israel, so the people of Israel were to be mediators for the neighboring nations. When the pagan nations surrounding Israel saw Israel, they were to see the God of the universe. It was the role of Israel to lead the nations to the one, true God.

OFFERING SACRIFICES IN THE TWENTY-FIRST CENTURY

While the world has drastically changed, and we no longer offer physical sacrifices to God, you and I are still called to serve as priests offering sacrifices. 1 Peter 2:5 says, "you yourselves like living stones are being built up as a spiritual house to be a holy priesthood, to offer spiritual sacrifices acceptable to God through Jesus Christ." When Christ saves us, we become God's priesthood and therefore become mediators for the rest of our world. Like the priests and Israel of the Old Testament, our responsibility lies in pointing other people to God. Our sacrifices are no longer animals but, rather, are spiritual. Paul clarifies what "spiritual worship" is in Romans 12:1, when he writes, "present your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and acceptable to God, which is your spiritual act of worship." Rather than kill animals, we now live our lives for God, fully devoted to him and his mission. Today, more than in the tabernacle, you and I have the opportunity to worship God through the way we live our lives for God and for others. Will you worship God?



WHAT IS JESUS CALLING ME TO DO?

FROM COMING TO BECOMING WHY WE'RE ALL TABERNACLES

When people study the Old and New Testaments, they often make sharp distinctions between the two groups of books. The God of the Old Testament is a harsh, angry God, whereas the God of the New Testament is a loving and forgiving God. Living for God in the Old Testament consists of following a set of rigid rules. In the New Testament, it's all about love. In the Old Testament, God is only concerned about Israel, and in the New Testament, God cares about all nations and people. Sadly, these dichotomies are poor representations of both the Old and New Testaments. While sometimes difficult to discern, no unreconcilable differences exist between the two testaments.

Over the past several weeks, we've been investigating the tabernacle in the Old Testament. This week, I want to look at the last claim I mentioned above: "In the Old Testament, God is only concerned about Israel, and in the New Testament, God cares about all nations and people." Is this claim true, and how does the tabernacle relate to God's heart for Israel and/or the nations?

BECOMING HOLY PRIESTS

The Old Testament is certainly clear about one truth: Israel is God's chosen people. We saw this last week when we looked at Exodus 19:5-6, where God proclaims to Moses, "Now therefore, if you will indeed obey my voice and keep my covenant, you shall be my treasured possession among all peoples, for all the earth is mine; and you shall be to me a kingdom of priests and a holy nation." Did you catch the exclusive language? God reminds Moses that despite the fact that all the earth is his, God has chosen to make Israel his people. When you read a statement like that it certainly seems as though God is only concerned about Israel. Perhaps, however, there's more beneath the surface than what we're seeing. When read again slowly, you can see a much fuller picture, a picture the tabernacle helps paint.

Because all of the earth is the Lord's, God rules over and has access to all of the earth. Because all of the earth is God's, he desires that all nations would come to know, love, and serve him. The people of Israel simply were the tool God chose to use to bring the nations to himself. Why were the Israelites a kingdom of priests and holy nation? Because, in being chosen by God, the presence of God dwelt in their midst. Therefore outside of God's sovereign selection, there was nothing special about the people of Israel. Still, hopefully you can once again see the significance of the tabernacle. The tabernacle afforded the Israelites with the possibility of God's presence dwelling in their midst, which in turn allowed Israel to be a holy nation of priests, which in turn was designed to attract and invite the nations into the presence of God.

BECOMING TABERNACLES

As followers of Christ, you and I have the same marching orders. Right before Jesus left the earth, he commanded his disciples (including us) to "Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, to the end of the age" (Matthew 28:19-20). We've all been commissioned to go unto the nations and make disciples. This means we evangelize (i.e. share the gospel) and disciple (i.e. baptize and teach God's commands).

There's something really unique about the above passage we often overlook. At the conclusion of this passage, Jesus reminds us of something important: "I am with you always." What an incredible truth to cling to. Still, we have to wonder, how is Jesus with us always? Do you remember what Jesus promised in John 16:7? Jesus comforted his disciples, saying, "I tell you the truth: it is to your advantage that I ago away, for if I do not go away, the Helper will not come to you. But if I go, I will send him to you." Think about this incredible truth. When Jesus left, he promised that we would receive the Spirit of God within us upon our salvation. If you know and love Jesus, the Holy Spirit, God himself, dwells in you. So, while the task of reaching the nations for God proved to be nearly impossible for the Israelites, you and I have the person of the Holy Spirit to equip and empower us for this incredible mission.

Finally, and most importantly, we no longer have to point to a physical location for someone to find the presence of God. Because the presence dwells in us, when people encounter us, they can encounter God. This is not to say that something within each of us is innately divine. Rather, it requires a miraculous event like Christ saving us for the Spirit of God to dwell within us. Still, what this means is that the people we encounter on a day-to-day basis have an opportunity to meet God through us. As Christians, we recognize that, at times, we struggle to live in the reality of how God sees us (in Jesus' righteousness). Nonetheless, we are commanded to be holy and to make disciples. Therefore, just like the Israelites, how we live our lives matters. Is your sin more blinding than the presence of God? When people meet you, do they have an opportunity to see God in you?

You and I have the presence of God. Let's serve as tabernacles, sharing God with others!
