

### **John Brennan**

*Director | Central Intelligence Agency*

John Brennan was sworn in as Director of the Central Intelligence Agency (CIA) on March 8, 2013. As Director, he manages intelligence collection, analysis, covert action, counterintelligence, and liaison relationships with foreign intelligence services.

Before becoming Director, Mr. Brennan served at the White House for four years as Assistant to the President for Homeland Security and Counterterrorism. During that time, he advised the President on counterterrorism strategy and helped coordinate the US Government's approach to homeland security, including policies for responding to terrorism, cyber attacks, natural disasters, and pandemics.

Mr. Brennan began his service in government at CIA, where he worked from 1980-2005. He spent most of his early career in the Agency's main analytic arm, the Directorate of Analysis, specializing in the Near East and South Asia before directing counterterrorism analysis in the early 1990s. In 1994-95, he was the Agency's intelligence briefer to President Bill Clinton.

After an assignment as a Chief of Station in the Middle East, Mr. Brennan served from 1999-2001 as Chief of Staff to George Tenet, who was then Director of Central Intelligence. Mr. Brennan next worked as Deputy Executive Director of CIA until 2003, when he began leading a multi-agency effort to establish what would become the National Counterterrorism Center. In 2004, he became the Center's Interim Director. After retiring in 2005, Mr. Brennan worked in the private sector for three years.

Mr. Brennan graduated from Fordham University in 1977 with a Bachelor's degree in political science. While enrolled at Fordham, he studied abroad at the American University in Cairo in 1975-76. He later attended the University of Texas at Austin, where in 1980 he earned a Master's degree in government with a concentration in Middle Eastern studies.

Mr. Brennan was born on September 22, 1955 in Jersey City, New Jersey. He is married and has three children.



### **Robert Lougy**

*Acting Attorney General | State of New Jersey*

Robert Lougy was named Acting Attorney General of New Jersey on February 29, 2016. He most recently served as Chief of Staff to the Attorney General and First Assistant Attorney General.

Mr. Lougy has served in various capacities in New Jersey's Department of Law and Public Safety, including deputy director and acting director of the Division of Law. In each position, he supervised and litigated some of the State's highest-profile matters in both State and federal court.

Mr. Lougy graduated from Pennsylvania State University in 1994 and received his JD from Columbia Law School in 2002.



## **Kim Guadagno**

*Lieutenant Governor | State of New Jersey*

Kim Guadagno was elected New Jersey's first Lieutenant Governor in November 2009. She was reelected to a second term in November 2013. In addition to serving as Lt. Governor, Guadagno serves as New Jersey's 33rd Secretary of State.

Lt. Governor Guadagno leads the Christie Administration's efforts to improve New Jersey's economic vitality, encourage job growth, streamline government, and make businesses feel welcome in New Jersey. The Lt. Governor oversees the New Jersey Partnership for Action (PFA), the State's four-pronged comprehensive economic development strategy. The PFA is comprised of the Business Action Center, which provides the business community with a single point of contact; the New Jersey Economic Development Authority, which serves as the state's "bank for business;" Choose New Jersey, an independently funded and operated 501(c)(3) business-attraction and lead-generation organization that markets the State; and the Office of the Secretary of Higher Education. The Lt. Governor also chairs the Red Tape Review Commission, which is engaged in an ongoing review and reform of the State's regulatory processes.

Lt. Governor Guadagno began her career in public service as a federal prosecutor with the Organized Crime and Racketeering Strike Force in Brooklyn, New York. She later married and moved to Monmouth County, New Jersey. At that time, Guadagno became an Assistant United States Attorney in Newark. She was awarded the nation's highest honor for prosecutions of two separate corrupt public officials. After her federal service, Guadagno served as a ranking member of the New Jersey Attorney General's Office.

In 2001, Lt. Governor Guadagno left the public sector to practice law closer to home and became a teacher at Rutgers University School of Law-Newark. She was also appointed to the Monmouth Beach planning board and was elected as a Borough Commissioner in 2005.

In 2007, Lt. Governor Guadagno was elected as the first woman sheriff in Monmouth County's history. As Sheriff, she managed a 650-member law enforcement agency encompassing the county jail, the county 911 communications center, and a law enforcement department of 100 men and women.

Lt. Governor Guadagno was born in Waterloo, Iowa and is a cum laude graduate of Ursinus College in Collegeville, Pennsylvania. She received her JD, cum laude, from the American University Washington College of Law in Washington, DC.

Lt. Governor Guadagno and her husband reside in Monmouth Beach with their three sons.



## **Cory Booker**

*US Senator | State of New Jersey*

Since winning election to the US Senate in October 2013, Cory Booker has focused on creating new jobs, improving economic opportunity for all New Jerseyans, speeding the pace of Hurricane Sandy recovery, and addressing the economic squeeze facing middle-class families. Senator Booker serves on the Senate's Homeland Security and Government Affairs Committee, as well as on the Commerce, Science and Transportation, Small Business and Entrepreneurship, and Environment and Public Works Committees.

Senator Booker is also working on reforming the criminal justice system and empowering young people through access to apprenticeships.

Senator Booker was elected mayor of New Jersey's largest city, Newark, in 2006. While he was mayor, the city entered its biggest period of economic growth since the 1960s—the first new downtown hotels were constructed in 40 years and the first new office towers in 20 years were completed. During his tenure, moreover, overall crime declined and the quality of life for residents improved with more affordable housing, new green spaces and parks, increased educational opportunities, and more efficient city services.

Senator Booker earned Bachelor's and Master's degrees from Stanford University, where he also played football. Following Stanford, he attended Oxford University as a Rhodes Scholar where he ran a student tutoring and mentoring program in a disadvantaged community. Senator Booker earned his JD from Yale Law School, where he helped lead free legal clinics for residents in New Haven, Connecticut.



## **Ido Aharoni**

*Ambassador | Consul General of Israel in New York*

Ambassador Ido Aharoni is Consul General of Israel in New York, representing the State of Israel to communities throughout the tri-state area of New York, New Jersey, and Connecticut. He has been a member of Israel's Foreign Service since 1991. Ambassador Aharoni held positions in Los Angeles and New York during his tenure in Israel's diplomatic corps.

While serving as Consul for Media and Public Affairs in New York, he became familiar with nation-branding methods, which he later introduced to superiors in Jerusalem. His efforts in this area, which continue today, have brought a paradigm shift in Israel's public image by Israeli officials in Israel and in the United States.

## **Clint Watts**

*Senior Fellow | Foreign Policy Research Institute*

Clint Watts is the Robert A. Fox Fellow in the Foreign Policy Research Institute's Program on the Middle East, as well as a Senior Fellow with its Program on National Security. As President of Miburo Solutions, Mr. Watts' research focuses on analyzing transnational threat groups operating in local environments. Before starting Miburo, he served as a US Army infantry officer, an FBI Special Agent on the Joint Terrorism

Task Force, and Executive Officer of the Combating Terrorism Center at West Point. Mr. Watts will be speaking on the future of al-Qa'ida and ISIS, competition between the two groups, and implications for the US.



## **Lauren Steinberg**

*Terrorism Analyst | Anti-Defamation League, Center on Extremism*

Lauren Steinberg is a Terrorism Analyst for the Anti-Defamation League's (ADL) Center on Extremism, responsible for monitoring the threat and activities of Islamic extremist organizations and their adherents at home and abroad. Prior to her current position, Ms. Steinberg worked as an Assistant Director in the ADL's New York office and as a research assistant for the Terrorism Research Initiative, an international

research consortium dedicated to collaborative research on terrorism studies that publishes the journal *Perspectives on Terrorism*. Ms. Steinberg has a Master's degree from Columbia University in political science with a focus on international security and undergraduate degrees in political science and religion. She will discuss social media recruitment by international terrorist groups.



## **Ehsan Zaffar**

*Senior Policy Advisor | Office for Civil Rights and Civil Liberties, US Department of Homeland Security*

Ehsan Zaffar is a Senior Policy Advisor at the Office for Civil Rights and Civil Liberties at the US Department of Homeland Security (DHS) in Washington, DC. He advises the Secretary and DHS components on the civil rights and civil liberties implications of existing and proposed national security policies, programs, and

procedures. Mr. Zaffar worked with diverse communities and young adults in the wake of the Boston Marathon bombings and the shooting in Charleston, South Carolina to build resilience and assist vulnerable communities under the auspices of the White House's National Strategy for Empowering Local Partners to Prevent Violent Extremism. He will discuss solutions to countering and mitigating violent extremism at a local level.

# ENCRYPTION:

## SECURITY AND PRIVACY CHALLENGES FOR LAW ENFORCEMENT AND THE COMMUNITY

---

*In the digital age of ubiquitous encryption, we are confronted with new challenges to achieve a balance between security and privacy.* Recent cases highlight the dual-use nature of this technology and implications for law enforcement and businesses. Understanding both sides of the encryption debate reveals opportunities for mitigating terrorists' use of encrypted communications without undermining cybersecurity.



### **Paul J. Fishman**

*US Attorney for the District of New Jersey | US Department of Justice*

Paul J. Fishman was nominated by President Barack Obama to be the US Attorney for the District of New Jersey in June 2009. He was confirmed by the US Senate on October 7, 2009 and sworn in on October 14, 2009.

As US Attorney, Mr. Fishman is responsible for overseeing all federal criminal investigations and prosecutions and the litigation of all civil matters in New Jersey in which the federal government has an interest. Mr. Fishman supervises a staff of approximately 145 attorneys and 115 support personnel in Newark, Camden, and Trenton. Mr. Fishman is a member of the Attorney General's Advisory Committee of US Attorneys (AGAC). He served as Vice-Chair of AGAC from 2009-11 and Chair from 2011-12.

Mr. Fishman has spent much of his professional career in public service. After graduating from law school, he clerked for the Honorable Edward R. Becker of the United States Court of Appeals for the Third Circuit. He was an Assistant United States Attorney from 1983-94, during which time he served as Deputy Chief of the Criminal Division, Chief of Narcotics, Chief of the Criminal Division, and First Assistant US Attorney. From 1994-97, he was a senior adviser to the Attorney General and Deputy Attorney General of the United States on law enforcement, policy, legislative, national security, and international matters, as well as on specific investigations and prosecutions. In addition to his public service, from 1998-2009, Mr. Fishman was a partner in the law firm Friedman Kaplan Seiler & Adelman, where he headed its white-collar practice and handled complex civil litigation. He graduated magna cum laude in 1978 from Princeton University and cum laude in 1982 from Harvard Law School, where he was Managing Editor of the Harvard Law Review. In 2011, he was awarded an Honorary Doctorate of Law by Seton Hall University Law School.



### **Dave Weinstein**

*Director of Cybersecurity | NJOHSP*

*Chief Information Security Officer | State of New Jersey*

Dave Weinstein is the Director of Cybersecurity for NJOHSP and the Chief Information Security Officer (CISO) for the State of New Jersey. Mr. Weinstein joined NJOHSP in August 2014 as the State's first Cybersecurity Advisor.

Prior to joining NJOHSP, Mr. Weinstein served at the United States Cyber Command in Fort Meade, Maryland, where his portfolio spanned cybersecurity operations, policy, and planning. Following his time with the US Department of Defense, he joined the private sector, where he consulted commercial clients on managing cyber risk.

# ACTIVE SHOOTER RESPONSE PANEL

---

*Active shooter incidents are increasing in frequency throughout the United States.* They tend to occur in relatively public places and involve multiple deaths, injuries, and victims often selected indiscriminately. The assembled panel will provide insights and lessons learned on initial response actions, coordinated messaging during and after the event, and long-term community recovery.



## **Colonel Rick Fuentes - Moderator**

*Superintendent | New Jersey State Police*

Colonel Fuentes enlisted in the State Police in January 1978 as a member of the 93A Class. Throughout his career, he served as a general road duty Trooper in Central and Southern New Jersey and as an instructor at the Sea Girt Academy. He was also a supervisor with the FBI Joint Terrorism Task Force and the State Police Narcotics and Street Gang Units. Prior to being named Superintendent, Colonel Fuentes was assigned as the Chief of the Intelligence Bureau.

The recipient of numerous awards, Colonel Fuentes has been recognized by the US Justice Department and the Drug Enforcement Administration. In 1993, he was a co-recipient of the New Jersey State Police Trooper of the Year Award.

Colonel Fuentes earned a Bachelor of Science degree from Kean College in 1977, a Master's degree in Criminal Justice from John Jay College in 1992, and a PhD in Criminal Justice from City University of New York in 1998.

In 2006-09, Colonel Fuentes was General Chair of the State and Provincial Division of the International Association of Chiefs of Police. He is a member of the US Attorney General's Global Advisory Committee, a member of the Homeland Security and Law Enforcement Partners Group of the Office of the Director of National Intelligence, and an appointed member of Harvard University's Executive Session on Policing and Public Safety.



## **Jarrold Burguan**

*Chief of Police | San Bernardino Police Department*

Chief Burguan was 21 when he joined the San Bernardino Police Department in 1992. It was near the height of the crack epidemic, when gunfire echoed around the city and the homicide rate was double what it is today. He worked the night shift and went to night school, eventually earning an Associate's degree from San Bernardino Valley College, a Bachelor's degree in business, and a Master's degree in management from the University of Redlands.

Seven years after being promoted to sergeant, Chief Burguan was tasked with leading the patrol and traffic divisions, which he did successfully before being promoted to lieutenant in January 2009. As a lieutenant, he was a watch commander for patrol, district commander, and detective bureau commander before his promotion to captain.

Chief Burguan was promoted to assistant chief in 2013 and was responsible for the department's day-to-day operations, internal affairs, crime analysis, and finance. He is most notably known for his actions in facilitating the response to the terrorist attack in San Bernardino on December 2, 2015.



## **Cheryl Fiandaca**

*Former Public Information Bureau Chief | Boston Police Department*

Cheryl Fiandaca joined WHDH-TV/7 News as an Investigative Reporter in January 2014. Before this assignment, Ms. Fiandaca was the spokesperson for the Boston Police Department. Her tenure included the Boston Marathon bombings and its aftermath. Ms. Fiandaca was directly responsible for the release of information during the crisis and used social media to communicate directly with news organizations and the public.

Ms. Fiandaca is a Boston native. She has a BS from Suffolk University and a JD from New England Law. In 2001, Ms. Fiandaca earned a Peabody Award as a correspondent for her coverage of the September 11, 2001 terrorist attacks. She is an attorney licensed to practice in Massachusetts, New York, and the District of Columbia.



## **Deb Del Vecchio-Scully**

*Former Clinical Recovery Leader | Newtown Recovery and Resiliency*

Deb Del Vecchio-Scully, LPC, NCC, CMHS is a licensed professional and nationally certified counselor. She holds American Mental Health Counselors Association (AMHCA) Diplomat status as a Clinical Mental Health Specialist in Trauma Counseling. Ms. Del Vecchio-Scully has an MS from Southern Connecticut State University and was appointed to serve on the American Counseling Association Anti-Bullying/Interpersonal Violence Task Force in July 2015.

She is nationally known as a stress and trauma expert, having worked with survivors of the 9/11 terrorist attacks as well as adults and children impacted by the Sandy Hook Elementary School shooting. Ms. Del Vecchio-Scully now serves as Clinical Recovery Leader and Trauma Specialist of the Newtown Recovery and Resiliency Team.

Ms. Del Vecchio-Scully uses a trauma-informed approach with clients coping with medical illness and co-occurring psychological issues utilizing evidenced-based mindfulness, mind-body, and somatic release approaches. In addition to her clinical work, Ms. Del Vecchio-Scully is a clinical supervisor and consultant on all aspects of mental health and wellness, trauma, and well-being.

She also serves as Executive Director of the Connecticut Counseling Association.
