## Church Planting in Chervona Sloboda 2<sup>nd</sup> Quarter 2013

## **April**

In Ukraine, this year there was virtually no spring: a very long winter until the middle of April and immediately came summer weather. Due to the rapid snowmelt, floods came. Ukrainians fought with the elements. Flood waters entered many houses and cellars. People suffered various illnesses. The church prayed a lot about these issues. The church, as it could, helped people with their problems. We prayed for each other.

Our church plans this summer to do an evangelistic project in June. We want to hold a joint camp with public school, because at this time the school will be holding a camp, and the kids will all be in this camp. We have already agreed on this with the school principal, and we are planning a joint program. Please pray for this project. In July, we want to hold a week of spirituality for the village. This year marks the 1025<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Baptism of Russia. We were founded upon the verse from the Bible: Proverbs 10:25. "As the whirlwind



passeth, so is the wicked no more: but the righteous is an everlasting foundation." We would like to inform people about the basis on which they should build their lives. This project will be a day dedicated to fishing, a fishing tournament. To do this, we have agreed with the administration of the village and have received permission to fish. But first, we did one good thing: we bought small fish and let them loose into the lake. When we bought the fish at a fish farm, the director learned that we are Christians, and he gave us 30 kg of fish for free. The rest we bought.

We hope that the fish will grow by the time of our project. For this outreach, we will be having Christian students to come. They will participate in this project. We got the go-ahead from the director of the distillery, from the mayor of the village, and from the director of the school. They are all very pleased that we are arranging such an outreach. Please pray for this project.

### June



This year, we decided to hold a camp for children along with the secondary school. At this time, when our mission conducts camps in Sloboda, a school camp would also be running, and all the kids would be involved at that camp. We had agreed with the school that the ladies who teach our church Sunday school would be included in the school camp every day for 2 hours and would conduct Bible lessons for children. Then, on the 17th and 18th of June, a group of Americans would come and for two days they would hold camp at the school. This agreement was from the school

principal. When it came time to connect our sisters with the school program, the principal rudely forbade them

to conduct Bible lessons. He said, "Your days are June 17-18." For us, that was a very strange reaction from the principal. I personally spoke with him. He made me feel very welcome and assured that our agreement remains in force. On June 17th, a group of Americans arrived at the school, but there were very few children— around 20 in all—despite the fact that during the school camp there had been about 50 children. Not only that, but on the 18th principal of the school sent the students on a field trip. Only about 10 children remained for camp. We are surprised by this turn of



events and the actions of the principal. Now we are preparing an evangelistic project that will take place July 21-27. We have agreed with the school that on school property there will be a big tent, and in it will be held every day different events (seminars, Christian movies and
