ART CLASSES + WORKSHOPS

Art courses for all ages are offered as either multi-day classes or one-day workshops. Art Classes and Workshops provide participants with a focused experience within a particular medium, process or concept. Participants work at their own level and pace with guided instruction for skill improvement.

Art Classes and Workshops are taught by local, experienced Artist-Instructors and are designed to encourage artistic development and self-expression. Small class sizes provide participants with individual attention; projects are designed to allow participants the freedom to explore their own potential and creativity.

Park Hours + Admission

Laumeier is open daily from 8:00 a.m. – 30 minutes past sunset. The Adam Aronson Fine Arts Center is open Thursday – Sunday from 10:00 a.m. – 4:00 p.m. during exhibitions only. Laumeier is free and open to the public year-round, with the exception of special events.

Directions to the Park

Laumeier is located near I-270 and I-44, 16 miles and 20 minutes from the Gateway Arch. From I-44 Eastbound or Westbound, exit at Lindbergh Boulevard (Exit 277B), drive 0.5 miles south to Rott Road (turn right) and proceed 0.5 miles west to the Park’s Main Entrance (on the left).
