## Dear Parent,

This week in SojournKids, we studied Luke 19:28-40 and John 12:12-19. We learned that:

- **Jesus is the Savior King.**
- **The people honored Jesus as King by obeying and praising him**
- **We should obey and praise Jesus.**

Jesus had just done one of his most amazing miracles. He had raised his friend Lazarus from the dead. The people were amazed and excited. They wanted to make him king.

So, he began to travel to Jerusalem, and he sent two disciples ahead of him. He told them that they would find a colt that no one had ever ridden. He asked them to untie it and bring it to him. If anyone asked, they should say, "The Lord needs it." The two disciples obeyed Jesus. When the owners of the colt asked why the disciples were untying it, the disciples said, "The Lord needs it." The disciples and the owners honored Jesus. They obeyed him, because he is the Lord and King.

Jesus rode on the colt into the city. The people waved palm branches, and they threw their coats on the road in front of him. The people praised Jesus. They said, "Hosanna! Savior King! Happy is the King! Peace in heaven and glory in the highest!" We should praise Jesus like these people did. If we do not praise him, the rocks will cry out that he his king, because he is the king of everything!

(Psalm 2:6-9; Matt 28:18-20; Eph 1:19-23; Col 1:13, 18; Rev 15:3-4)

**Why do you need Christ as a king?** *Because I am weak and helpless.*

(John 15:4-5; 2 Corinthians 12:9; Philippians 4:13; Colossians 1:11; Jude 24-25)
