The towns of Salem and Windham are doing a feasibility study for joint sewerage to service; Route 111 Gateway and Wall Street areas of Windham, Cobbetts Pond, Shadow Lake and Canobie Lake, I-93 Westside (Salem), and sewage service to the Greater Lawrence Sanitary District. This is all in conjunction with the I-93 realignment initiative by the NH DOT. How will this impact Canobie Lake and our surrounding neighborhood? Should our association take a position? We welcome your input.
