THE YEAR IN REVIEW & BUSINESS MEETING:

If you see weeds that are of concern please take pictures of them and email the pictures to Amy Smagula at amy.smagula@des.nh.gov She will identify them for us!

The NH Department of Environmental Services encourages lake associations to have a volunteer Weed Watchers program. It's important for early detection of invasive weeds, if any, entering Canobie Lake. Our best chance of preventing spread is to catch it early.
