Youngest daughter Celia and her family are shunned by a society that previously embraced them, torn apart by sorrow, and buffeted and changed by the storms of war.



Saira Shah shares a heartbreakingly honest and funny autobiographical novel about family, love and life in rural France. Anna and Tobias' daughter has been born with profound mental and physical disabilities. The family end up in a decrepit mouse-infested farmhouse where they become a magnet for the odd and damaged.



Liz Fenwick introduces a spelling-binding tale of romance and intrigue, set against the gorgeous Cornish coast. Recently betrayed Demi desperately needs her luck to change. 




