What did you do on Mother's Day?

This year, we made 1000 birthing kits. And since each kit has the potential to save a mum and a bub, we helped save up to 2000 lives!

On Mother's day ASPIRE, with the help of Armidale Zonta Club, UNE SSAF and a bunch of fantastic students and staff made 1000 birthing kits. These kits will be sent to developing countries with high maternal mortality rates to make childbirth safer for mothers and babies alike. And at a mere \$3 each they cost less than your daily coffee! These kits help reduce the rate of death, injury and infection as a result of childbirth in developing countries like the Democratic Republic of Congo (where we sent them last year). This year marks the largest production of Birthing kits in ASPIRE's history and we'd like to thank all the students who volunteered their




