DRAFTING A BETTER


A NEW PROJECT IN SPAIN DRAWS AMBITIOUS ARCHITECTS TO BUILD THE COUNTRY HOUSES OF THE FUTURE.

THE REMOTE REGION OF MATARRAÑA, SPAIN, A TWOfor some very forward-thinking architecture—but it's where a dozen emerging studios (Didier Fausare reinventing the concept of the second home in sparsely populated wilderness. The project is inspired by the Case Study Houses, a postwar effort in which the likes of Richard Neutra and Charles Eames built a series of sleek residences in Los Angeles that aimed to remake the modern suburb. 
