Nehemiah 3

1. Tell about a time that you were part of a group or team that accomplished something significant. What made that group or team effective? How did you feel being part of that?
2. What was at risk if the people did not rebuild the walls of Jerusalem? How do you imagine they felt about the project? What is at risk if we leave the broken things in our world broken (pick one or two specific things to focus on)?
3. The norm in most churches is for 20% of the people to do 80% of the work (we may be doing a little better than this at CCC). Why do you think this has become the norm? What is keeping more people from being all in in the work of the church?
4. Why was it smart for Nehemiah to have families build the wall together near their own homes? Has your family has work together to build the Kingdom of God in some way? Talk about that experience and how it impacted your family. What would it look like for your family to work together around a holy discontent (your section of the wall)?
5. Based on your calendar and activities are you living with Nehemiah-like intentionality when it comes to the things of God's Kingdom (sharing the gospel, working to restore brokenness)? If so, tell about some way you have seen God at work. If not, why do you think you are missing intentionality in this area?
6. What about you? Are you all in or is there room for you to go deeper into serving God's Kingdom?
 - If you're living without a *holy discontent*, ask God to break your heart over the brokenness in our world.
 - If you're in the 80% doing some of the work, how can you increase your level of service?
 - If you're lacking intentionality around furthering God's Kingdom (sharing the gospel and restoring brokenness), what steps can you take to be more intentional this week?
