- 3. Do we have to compromise biblical truth with a stance of love toward those we don't agree?
- 4. Is there someone in your life who is difficult to love? What have you found that helps maintain the relationship?
- 5. Do you have a relationship with someone of the LGBT community? How does that relationship work? Do you feel like if you have open conversations with them that you are agreeing with their choices?
- 6. Discuss Pastor Mark's biblical suggestions for how to love others when it is hard:
 - a. Build relational equity—the greatest of these is love
 - b. Avoid soundbites—Love is patient
 - c. Relate to the whole person—Love is kind
 - d. Keep humility high—Love does not boast; is not proud
 - e. Build bridges where possible—Love does not dishonor others
 - f. Lead with Jesus, not morality—Love does not keep a record of wrongs
 - g. Understand others underlying fear—Love always protects
