2002 Regional Transportation Plan Supplemental Program EIR

A Supplemental Program Environmental Impact Report was prepared for the 2002 Regional Transportation Plan (RTP) for Del Norte County and certified by the Local Transportation Commission (LTCO) on January 10^h, 2002. The California Environmental Quality Act guidelines state that Supplemental EIRs may be prepared if changes are proposed in the project, which will require major revisions of the previous EIR, or if substantial changes occur with respect to the circumstances under which the project is undertaken which will require major revisions of the previous EIR. The 2000 RTP Update does contain certain proposed transportation system improvements that were not addressed in the 1992 EIR. Therefore, a Supplemental EIR was prepared as a separate document and was circulated for a 45-day public review and comment period prior to certification.

The Local Transportation Commission for Del Norte County, the designated Regional Transportation Planning Agency, is also the lead agency for the RTP. The 2002 RTP serves the same purpose as the previous RTPs for Del Norte County, in that it is a regional transportation plan for a coordinated and balanced regional transportation system. The regional transportation system addresses; public transportation; non-motorized transportation (bicycle and pedestrian); aviation; highway/streets/road; goods movement (truck, and maritime); and tele-transportation facilities. The RTP includes a needs assessment, and policy, action and financial elements. It considers both the short-term and long-term needs, and provides policy guidance, regional action programs and priorities, and financing strategies.

Finding that the 2002 RTP was prepared primarily to comply with State RTP Guidelines, with potential environmental effects, LTCO has prepared a Supplemental Program EIR to the previously certified Program EIR based on the following findings.

The primary focus of the 2002 RTP Update is to comply with the CTC's RTP guidelines. Updated project lists, similar to those in the previous RTPs, have been provided by each member entity of LTCO. Proposed projects and funding cover similar transportation modes as in the previous RTP.

Public Review and Comment

The Supplemental Program EIR for the 2002 RTP was circulated through the State Clearinghouse and available at several locations in Del Norte County during the 45 day review period (September 25th to November 9th, 2001). The Draft 2002 RTP was made available for review to government agencies and the general public. Agency representatives who had contributed information for the RTP and EIR reviewed the documents to ensure that their input had been presented in a complete and accurate manner. They responded through memos, emails, letters, and hand-written comments. Members of the public attended four workshops held in various locations in Del Norte County during the month of October 2001, and provided verbal input. The following is a summary of EIR comments received, and responses.

Comments on the Draft Supplemental EIR

Commenter: Smith River Rancheria (Comment letter dated October 16, 2001, from Laura M. Mayo, Environmental Programs Director, to George Williamson AICP, Planwest):

Comment # 1 (Include additional information about the Tolowa people)

Response: Change language as follows:

Revisions to Supplemental EIR Chapter 3, Section 3.12:

Although the Tolowa are not a federally recognized tribe, they are among the residents of the Smith River Rancheria, located near the mouth of the Smith River. The Rancheria covers roughly 160 acres and is home to members of a number of northern California and southern Oregon Native American groups. The Smith River Rancheria has representatives in local government to voice the interests and concerns of the Tolowa population in Del Norte County and is currently in the process of drafting a master plan to he manage the cultural resources on its land.

The extant population of Tolowa people are represented by two federally recognized, sovereign Tribal Governments, that of Smith River Rancheria and Elk Valley Rancheria. Smith River Rancheria is located in northern Del Norte County, north of the town of Smith River; Elk Valley

Rancheria is located near Crescent City, the county seat of Del Norte County. According to representatives of the Smith River Rancheria, Smith River Rancheria has 900 enrolled Tolowa persons and 200 acres, and Elk Valley Rancheria has an enrollment of approximately 100 and a land base of 450 acres. Smith River and Elk Valley Rancherias are composed of Tolowa people only, and the ancestral territory of the Tolowa people extended from Wilson Creek in Del Norte County northward to the Sixes River in Oregon and east to the coast range. Both the Smith River Rancheria and Elk Valley Rancheria have constitutions and Tribal governments that are recognized by the Bureau of Indian Affairs of the United States.

Comment # 2 (Include additional information about the Smith River Rancheria)

Response: Change language as follows:

Additions to Supplemental EIR Chapter 3, Section 3.12:

The Service Area for the Smith River Rancheria, as defined by the Bureau of Indian Affairs, consists of several counties in two states: Curry, Josephine, and Coos County in Oregon, and Humboldt and Del Norte Counties in California. The majority of the Tribal members live within the service area. Tribal members of the Rancheria are involved in a variety of social and economic activities.

Comment #3 (Revise information about the Big Flat archaeological site)

Response: Change language as follows:

Revisions to Supplemental EIR Chapter 3, Section 3.12:

The Big Flat area on the south fork of the Smith River was <u>a habitation site of used by</u> the Tolowa. and their trading partners as a meeting ground. Although there appears to be no permanent Tolowa villages, there are temporary habitation sites that may be the camp sites of Tolowa and visiting traders.

Comment # 4 (Address potential disturbances due to earth-moving activities)

The LTCO will provide for this coordination and cooperation by maintaining Policy Advisory and Technical Advisory Committees, and Social Services Transportation Advisory Council.

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The Smith River Rancheria has reviewed the Draft Supplemental EIR prepared by your firm in conjunction with the Del Norte County 2002 Regional Transportation Plan Update. We would like to take this opportunity to correct some misstatements made in section 3.11, the Cultural Resources section.

The extant population of Tolowa people are represented by one of two federally recognized, sovereign Tribal Governments, that of Smith River Rancheria and Elk Valley Rancheria. Smith River Rancheria is located in northern Del Norte County, north of the town of Smith River; Elk Valley Rancheria is located within the limits of Crescent City, the county seat of Del Norte County. Smith River Rancheria has 900 enrolled Tolowa persons and 200 acres, and Elk Valley Rancheria has an enrollment of approximately 100 and a land base of 450 acres. Smith River and Elk Valley Rancherias are composed of Tolowa people only, and the ancestral territory of the Tolowa people extended from Wilson Creek in Del Norte County northward to the Sixes River in Oregon and east to the coast range. Both the Smith River Rancheria and Elk Valley Rancheria have constitutions and Tribal governments that are recognized by the Bureau of Indian Affairs of the United States.

The Service Area for the Smith River Rancheria, as defined by the Bureau of Indian Affairs, consists of six counties in two states: Curry, Josephine, and Coos County in Oregon, and Humboldt and Del Norte Counties in California. The majority of the Tribal members live within the service area. Tribal members of the Rancheria are involved in basically the same activities as you have listed for the Yuroks in your report. Additionally, the Tribe owns and operates its own Casino, the Lucky 7, as well as a Headstart program, a tribally owned and operated drinking water system, a United Indian Health Service medical and dental clinic, housing and meal service for the elderly, and a low-cost community housing program.

Additionally, please note that the town at Big Flat on the South Fork of the Smith River was, in fact, a permanent habitation site. Please refer to the ethnography prepared by Philip Drucker in

1937 titled <u>The Tolowa and their Southwest Oregon Kin</u> for more information on village sites of the Tolowa people in Del Norte County.

For any projects that would disturb the ground in areas known to contain culturally sensitive materials, it is the custom of the Tribe to request that a monitor be present to oversee invasive activities. We have, in the past, provided monitors to CALTRANS on several occasions, and appreciate advance notification and request for comment on any earth-disturbing project within our aboriginal territory.

Dear Susan:

The Draft 2002 Regional Transportation Plan must be accompanied by environmental documentation, to comply with the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA). The last Program EIR prepared for the Regional Transportation Plan was completed in 1992. Based on past RTP updates, we had anticipated preparing an Addendum to that EIR, however, the revisions in the Draft 2002 RTP are more than could be covered in an EIR Addendum.

In our original scope of work we had estimated costs for preparing an EIR Addendum, based on what had been done for the most recent RTP Updates. After preparing the Draft 2002 RTP, it is evident that a Supplemental EIR should be prepared. At your request I spoke with Caltrans Environmental Planner Debra Harmon last week and she concurred with the need to prepare a Supplemental EIR.

This will necessitate a 45 day public review period prior to RTP adoption by the Del Norte Local Transportation Commission Board. We have already begun work on this document ands should be able to be distribute it and conduct the review period prior to the December Board Meeting.

Completing the Supplemental EIR will require additional work beyond our current scope and contract. We estimate the additional cost of preparing the Draft Supplemental EIR will be \$3,320.00. This includes staff time for preparation (8 project manager hours and 60 project planner hours) plus printing and mailing costs. Fifteen copies of the Draft Supplemental EIR must be mailed to the State Clearinghouse to comply with CEQA review requirements. In addition to costs of preparing the draft, there will also be costs for responding to any comments received during the public review period. The costs will depend on the number of comments, which is not known at this time. We would anticipate that comments could be responded to, and a Final Supplemental EIR prepared, for an additional \$1,500.00.
