

Winter Weather Event
25 November 2014 1300
State Agencies, Regions 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, and 7

National Weather Service (NWS) Sterling: [Sterling, VA](#)

A low pressure system is developing in the Gulf of Mexico with a track heading northeast along the Carolina coast in the morning before moving off the coast in the evening. A Winter Storm Warning is in effect from 3 a.m. until 6 p.m. on Wednesday. Precipitation, in the form of snow, will impact after midnight to 2 a.m. with accumulations expected to be 5-6 inches in the morning and significant snow accumulations in higher elevations. A mixture of rain and snow will change to all snow between 6 a.m. and 9 a.m. on Wednesday morning. The heaviest snow is expected between 9 a.m. and 2 p.m. in the form of a heavy wet snow falling at about one inch per hour. Areas expected to have the most impact are along and west of the Blue Ridge Mountains and along the I-81 corridor. This winter event may impact travel along I-81. On Thursday, there is a chance for a weak storm to bring some furriners, but nothing significant. Temperature will be in the upper 20s to lower 30s in higher elevations, and lower to middle 30s below 1500 feet.


A Winter Weather Advisory remains in effect from 9 p.m. this evening until 4 p.m. on Wednesday. Severe winter weather conditions are possible. The storm track is south to north and is expected to arrive after midnight to 6 a.m. This will bring wet snow mainly to the higher elevations later tonight with snow levels lowering by early Wednesday morning. Accumulations expected to be 3-7 inches in higher elevations with 2-4 inches below 2500 feet. Roads will be impacted by snow especially along the I-64 & I-81 corridors. There is a second system that is expected to arrive later on Thursday with very little snow and possible rain. Temperatures will fall to around freezing overnight and raining in the 30s on Wednesday.

For Southwest Virginia, snow is forecast to arrive Wednesday night with accumulations between 1-2 inches mixing with rain. Heavier accumulations are possible in higher elevations and are forecast to change to a mix of rain and snow on Wednesday night.

Precipitation is expected to be 1-2 inches of rain into Wednesday afternoon with no foreseeable advisories for the area. Minor tidal flooding is possible in Hampton Roads.
