SPRING CRIME PREVENTION SAFETY TIPS

Spring is here and summer is fast approaching and the Lansing Police Department wants to remind you of some tips to help keep you and your family safe.

- 1.) Keep your doors locked at all times. If you are working in the backyard, keep your front door and garage door closed and locked, and your backdoors locked if you are in the front yard. Always lock your doors if you are gone only for a few minutes.
- 2.) Install motion-activated lights in your front and backyards.
- 3.) Put all ladders and other tools back into a secure storage area after you use them. Ladders and other tools can be used by criminals to access your home
- 4.) Be aware of home improvement scams. If you did not solicit the contractor or salesman who shows up at your door unannounced, do not do business with them. If a utility representative comes to your house request identification
- 5.) Always remember to roll up your car windows, take any valuables out of your car, and lock your doors every time you exit your vehicle, even if it is parked in your own driveway.
- 6.) Summer is a perfect time to spend riding a bicycle. Make sure your bike is secured by locking it up when left unattended
- 7.) Be a good neighbor, this can be one of the best crime prevention tools. Watchful, attentive neighbors can spot potential criminals and alert the Police.

U.S. Passport

If you need to apply for or to renew a U.S. Passport, you can complete the application at the Lansing City Clerk's Office. With photography services on-site, accessible bathrooms, and convenient hours, you can "buy local" by applying for your passport and keep the \$25 service fee in your city. Credit cards are not accepted at this time and two separate payments are required when submitting an application, so please bring your checkbook, money orders or cashier checks.

Elections


The City Clerk's office is responsible for the orderly conduct of elections. If you are interested and eligible for an absentee ballot or need to change your voter registration, please contact the office. Every election, poll workers earn \$120 or more to work the entire Election Day.

Summer Time brings great weather and. . . Door to Door Sales, Ice Cream Trucks - Are they licensed?

To help protect our residents, the City requires background checks as part of the license approval process for door-to-door sales people (Peddlers License), ice cream truck drivers (Ice Cream Peddler License) and some of our other 20+ licenses. When they knock on your door, ask to see their city license.

Transactions may take one or more banking days from the date transaction was made to clear an account. ATM-processed transactions do not count towards qualifying debit card transactions. "Monthly Qualification Cycle" means the day after the end of the previous qualification cycle through the second to last business day of the current statement cycle. Interest and incentives will be paid on the last day of the month and are subject to IRS reporting. Transfers between accounts do not count as qualifying transactions. Accounts closed before the end of the qualification cycle forfeit that cycle's rewards. Limit one account per SSN.

Where Can I Get Information About an Emergency?

Emergency Alert System (EAS) -EAS messages are the messages that you get on TV and Radio in an emergency. Those messages come directly from Emergency Management or the National Weather Service.

CodeRED Emergency Alerts - CodeRED is an emergency alert system that will call your home phone when there is an emergency in your area. Landlines are automatically registered with CodeRED. If you don't have a landline, or if you want to register your cell phone, you can do so at: www.lansingmi.gov/codered.

Nixle - Nixle is a free service that lets police and fire departments send alert messages by email or texting. You can subscribe to Nixle by visiting Nixle.com. (There is no charge for Nixle, but your cell phone company's messaging rates may apply.)

NOAA Weather Radios -The EAS also sends messages to NOAA weather radios—radios that give emergency weather information directly from the National Weather Service. These radios can turn themselves on when a weather warning is issued. Weather radios are available at most stores that sell radios.

Outdoor Warning Sirens -There are more than 50 outdoor warning sirens in Ingham County. The sirens are only meant to warn people who are outdoors. You hear the sirens most often when there is a tornado warning, but they would also be used to warn of strong winds, or other times when it is not safe to stay outside. When you hear the sirens, take cover and tune in. Go inside immediately and turn on the radio or television for more information. Don't forget, most sirens are tested at 1:00 p.m. on the first Saturday of every month.



RACER Trust to Hold Meeting July 8 on Remediation Proposal for Former GM Sites

The meeting will be held on Tuesday, July 8 at 5:30 p.m. at the Letts Community Center, 1220 W Kalamazoo St., in Lansing.

The RACER Trust has been performing comprehensive environmental studies at Plants 2, 3 and 6 for nearly three years under the oversight of the Michigan Department of Environmental Quality (MDEQ). As RACER was finishing its environmental investigations last year, it detected 1, 4-dioxane in groundwater on a portion of Plants 2 and 3. Local residents in the area obtain drinking water from a municipal water supply, which is not impacted by the compound from the site.

The compound 1, 4-dioxane is typically used as an additive in cleaning solvents, The State of Michigan has identified 1, 4-dioxane as a compound of concern.

The discovery of 1, 4-dioxane prompted the need for additional investigations to delineate the impacted area and allow for development and evaluation of possible remedies. The additional investigations prevented RACER from submitting a remediation plan to the MDEQ last summer, as originally outlined when it briefed Westside Neighborhood residents in June 2013.

Working closely with MDEQ, RACER has completed the additional investigations and has finalized its report on the findings and remediation recommendations for the all three properties.
