## at the time of Jesus

Pharisees	Sadducees
means the "separate ones"	from aristocratic, wealthy families
upheld tradition and Scriptures	controlled Temple worship
usually middle class, artisans	accepted only written Law (Torah)
• teachers and preachers of the Law (Torah)	rejected oral law and prophets
controlled every phase of Jewish daily life	<ul> <li>denied existence of angels and saints</li> </ul>
• taught in the synagogues	denied resurrection or any afterlife
<ul> <li>hoped for Messiah, King and Kingdom</li> </ul>	held power in the Sanhedrin
<ul> <li>believed in the prophets' writings which nourished a Messianic hope</li> </ul>	hostile to Jesus' movement
<ul> <li>believed in resurrection and future world</li> </ul>	• "high priest" of the Temple came only from this sect
<ul> <li>often arrogant, pious, self-righteous, hypocritical, spiritually dull</li> </ul>	rigid, narrow-minded, conservative
plotted Jesus' death	wanted to keep status quo
Paul, Nicodemus, and Jairus were Pharisees	<ul> <li>maintained their position as long as they worked with the Romans (chief priests belonged to this party)</li> <li>this sect died out with the destruction of the Temple</li> </ul>
