DAY 1 - THURSDAY, MARCH 31: DEPART U.S.A. FOR ISTANBUL

We embark upon our journey to the land of ancient treasures and Christian history with an overnight flight to Istanbul. Prepare yourself for a life-changing experience. DAY 2 - FRIDAY, APRIL 1: ARRIVAL ISTANBUL, TURKEY

We arrive in **Istanbul** (Constantinople), the city which straddles two continents. Istanbul was once the capital of the Byzantine Empire for more than one thousand years and capital of the Ottoman Empire for more than five hundred years. Istanbul is famous for many beautiful places and museums, which we will have the opportunity to see the next day. We are met by our tour guide and transfer to our hotel. Dinner and overnight are in Istanbul.

DAY 3 - SATURDAY, APRIL 2: ISTANBUL HIGHLIGHTS

We begin our "Istanbul City tour" with the **Blue Mosque**, the most splendid mosque in the city, which is distinguished by six slender minarets and the interior decorated with blue Iznik tile. We continue with a walk through the **Hippodrome**, the center of Byzantine civic life, housing three ancient monuments: the Obelisk of Theodosius, the Serpentine Column and the Column METEORA, DELPHI of Constantine. Visit St. Sophia (Divine Wisdom), one of the greatest churches in the world, built by the Byzantine Emperor Justinian. After the conquest of the city in 1453, it was transformed into a mosque by Mehmet the Conqueror and into a museum by Ataturk in 1934. In the afternoon, visit the famous **Topkapi Palace**, where the rich collection of Ottoman Treasures can be seen. This palace, with a base area of 700,000 sq. meters, is spread over the promontory called the Seraglio Point. View the Bosporus, the Golden Horn and the Sea of Mar- er to build the original wooden mara. This legendary maze of buildings was the residence of the Ottoman sultans and the administrative heart of the Empire. Nowadays, it is one of the world's greatest museums. Dinner and overnight are in Istanbul.

DAY 4 - SUNDAY, APRIL 3: ISTANBUL, TURKEY / KAVALA, **GREECE**

After breakfast, we leave Istanbul and are transferred to the Turkish-Greek borders. After the necessary procedure at the check point there, we say good-bye to Turkey and continue to Greece. We will be met by our Greek guide and driver and continue to **Kavala** (Neapolis), a picturesque city-port where we view the Byzantine Castle and the Roman Aqueduct. Dinner overnight are in Kavala.

DAY 5 - MONDAY, APRIL 4: PHILIPPI, THESSALONIKI, **METEORA**

This morning we start our day by visiting the site of **Philippi**. There, we visit the **Baptistery of Lydia** near the river where Paul

soil. We also visit the ruins of the Forum of Philippi, the Christian Basilicas, the "Prison of Paul," and the **Theatre**. Then we continue to **Thessaloniki** and see the **White** Tower, the Rotunda, the Roman Arch of Galerius, and the Byzantine Acropolis. Our journey will continue to Kalambaka, in central Greece. Here we find scenery of unique and striking beauty. On top of huge granite pinnacles, we see the ageless Meteora Monasteries, which are full of treasures of Christian art. We have dinner and overnight in Kalambaka.

DAY 4 - TUESDAY, APRIL 5:

This morning we see the world famous Byzantine monasteries that are perched on summits of gray rock peaks of varied and beautiful shapes. Their history goes back to the 14th century when the monks sought refuge in the cliff-side caves, then fled high-

shelters, which were later transformed into monasteries. We will include a special visit to **Delphi**, this mountainous city which today is both an archaeological site and a modern town. For the ancient Greeks, Delphi was labeled the "omphalos" (navel) of the earth and it is here that the eternal flame burned in the Temple of Apollo. Delphi was the site of the Delphic oracle, the most important oracle in the classical Greek world. It was also here beginning in 586 B.C. that athletes from all over the Greek world competed in the Pythian Games, one of the precursors to the modern Olympics. On our way up to Delphi, we'll have time to stop and enjoy the small scenic villages that cling to the mountainsides. Dinner and overnight are in Athens.

DAY 7 - WEDNESDAY, APRIL 6: ACROPOLIS, MARS HILL, **AFTERNOON AT LEISURE**

In the morning, we admire the architectural miracles of ancient Athens, as we follow our guide to the world-renowned Acropolis. There we see the Propylea, the Erectheum and the Parthe-

> non. We visit Mars Hill where Paul delivered his speech on the "Unknown God." We also see the Agora, the ancient center of the economic and public life of the city where Paul preached to the sceptical Athenians. During the bus tour, we see Constitution Square with the House of Parliament, the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier, the Temple of Zeus, the Old Olympic Stadium and the Neoclassical **buildings** of Athens. Afternoon is at leisure to explore on our own the famous Plaka area for shopping and enjoy a typical Greek meal at one of the many side-Athens.

DAY 8 - THURSDAY, APRIL 7: ANCIENT CORINTH, AFTERNOON AT LEISURE

We continue our trip to Ancient Corinth. This is the once glorious city near the Isthmus, where Paul met Aquilla and Priscilla and spent a year and a half preaching the Gospel. We visit the Archaeological Museum, the Forum, the Temples and the famous Bema, where Paul stood before Gallio, accused by the Jews of Corinth. Then, we drive to **Cenchreae**, the little

harbour from which Paul sailed back to Asia, thus ending his second missionary journey. We travel back to Athens, remainder of the afternoon at leisure. Why not visit the new Acropolis Museum, which is built to scale of the world-renowned **Acropo**lis – Parthenon. Dinner and overnight at our hotel.

DAY 9 - FRIDAY, APRIL 8: ARRIVE U.S.A.

For those not taking the cruise, we transfer in the morning to Athens Airport for our return flight back home with a new insight into Paul's life and teachings.

DAY 9 - FRIDAY, APRIL 8: START OUR 3-NIGHT **MEDITERRANEAN CRUISE**

We sail this morning from Athens to the quaint isle of **Mykonos**, called the island of windmills. We arrive at Mykonos, where we disembark and have time to experience the waterfront lined with shops and cafes. We stroll the charming walkways through a maze of white-washed buildings before returning to the ship for dinner and evening activities. No excursions are included today, as we will visit the island at our leisure.

DAY 10 - SATURDAY, APRIL 9: KUSADASI, PATMOS

In the morning we arrive in Kusadasi, Turkey. Excursion Included: A short drive takes us to **Ephesus**, where Paul spent three years during his ministry. The impressive remains of Ephesus walk restaurants. Dinner and overnight in include the Agora, the Theater, the Stadium, the Library of Celsus, the ruins of the Temple of Diana (one of the "Seven Wonders of the Ancient World") and many more. Later, we sail for the island of Patmos. Excursion Included: Here we visit the Monastery of St. John, on one of the island's highest points. From there, we walk down to the Grotto of the Apocalypse, the site of the apocalyptic Revelations of St. John the Divine.

DAY 11 - SUNDAY, APRIL 10: HERAKLION, CRETE / SANTORINI

In the morning, we arrive at Heraklion, **Crete** and disembark. **Excursion Included:** You can visit the Minoan Palace of Knossos, home to king Minos and his legendary beast the Minotaur. At the Archaeological Museum of Heraklion, you can find the unbelievable works of art (pieces of sculpture and pottery, jewelry, arms, frescoes) that have been found in a number of Minoan sites all over Crete. In the afternoon, we cruise to the isle of Santorini and disembark. Excursion not included: Santorini is often referred to as the most breathtaking of all the Greek islands. The exquisite whitewashed villages, including the town of Fira, or Thira, cling to volcanic cliffs, accessible by cable-car, or mule.

DAY 12 - MONDAY, APRIL 11: ATHENS

We disembark the cruise this morning in Athens and transfer to the airport for our return flight to the U.S.A.
