GENERAL INTERVIEW TIPS

- Ensure all your questions are open-ended and go over them in advance.
- Spend a few minutes making small talk with the interviewee before starting. This helps interviews feel more natural.
- Coach the person being interviewed to respond in a full statement. If the question is "What's your favorite color?," they should respond, "My favorite color is..."
 - Talk to them about using terms (like "my counselor" or "the nurse") instead of names.
- Find a pretty but not busy background and invest in a mic.
- Go off-script when the opportunity comes. Ask follow-up questions.
- Start with asking the person's name, their role, and how long they've been at camp. Ask the person to spell their name.
- Think through questions you get frequently during the year and ensure you have at least one person answering them.
- Have interviewees look at someone just off to the side of the camera.
