

Annette Robert Thomas, founder of Gym Kidsport in Georgetown, Texas began her gymnastics career at age 14 when she was inspired by Olga Corbit. She was coached by Rudy Magdaleno at the Tyler School of Gymnastics and she began coaching in 1981. She taught gymnastics at the Christian Athletic Camp Kanakuk in Branson, Missouri and she coached in Tyler, Texas. She went on to teach preschool through elite level athletes in Cheshire Connecticut at CATS Gymnastics before moving to Austin in 1987. She was employed at Capital Gymnastics, serving as Manager of five Capital facilities until 2003.

Annette was the founding Director for the original Gymnastics Association of Texas Instructor Training Program covering preschool and recreational gymnastics topics in 1997. Her efforts led to the establishment of multiple Gymnastics Association of Texas' Instructor Training Programs, two of which she co-authored: Instructor Training Program Preschool and Instructor Training Program Recreational. She has presented at the Gymnastics Association of Texas Conventions for over 20 years. Additionally, She is the co-author for the USA Gymnastics Hands-on Training Program (R103) for recreational gymnastics (HOTSA).

Annette has served as a National Instructor for USA Gymnastics, presenting at state, regional and national congresses covering preschool, recreational and business topics. She served as one of the National Instructors for USA Gymnastics Kinder Accreditation for Teachers (KAT,) USA Gymnastics Movement Development and Lesson Plan Development (MELPD,) and currently serves as a National Instructor for the USA Gymnastics Preschool Fundamentals, Hands-on Training and the USA Gymnastics Hands-on Training for School-Aged (HOTSA) courses for preschool and recreational gymnastics.

Annette was among the first group of coaches certified under the USA Gymnastics Kinder Accreditation for Teachers (KAT) program in 1996. She also holds certification in the Movement Education and Lesson Plan Development (MELPD) program and she has published multiple articles in Technique Magazine.

She is a previous recipient of the Gymnastics Association of Texas Distinguished Service Award, and she was honored by USA Gymnastics as the 2015 National Instructor of the year.

She attended the University of Texas and Texas Women's University with emphasis in Physical Therapy. Annette has 3 children, Westin, Abbi, and Colin and two grandchildren. Abbi was an Elite Level Athlete who competed for Oregon State University and Texas Women's University, finishing her career with Division II NCAA title. Elected 2015.

DIANE CALLISON: has served the gymnastics community for more than 35 years. During those years she has worked as administrative assistant, competition director and Texas State and Regional Chairperson. She has poured her heart into supporting the aspirations of the athletes, coaches, judge's and club owners in Texas and the region.

Under her leadership the athlete and coaches banquet increased from 250 to more than 1000 attendees. Another significant achievement during Diane's tenure was the defeat of the Texas Senate bill that would have required all gymnastics clubs in Texas to become licensed childcare centers. Diane lead the charge to have the legislation changed to allow competitive gymnastics programs to be exempted from the rigid requirements, which are mandated for child care operators. Over the years, Diane has directed countless compulsory, state, regional championships, international competitions, as well as JO Nationals, many of the invitational competitions welcoming up to 2500 athletes.

As a nationally rated judge she has officiated numerous competitions, including JO Championships. It is impossible to share all of the ways Diane has positively and deeply impacted the sport of gymnastics in our state and region. But more importantly she has been a friend, a supporter and an encourager to innumerable coaches, judges and athletes, club owners and parents that have themselves gone on to proudly represent the great state of Texas on the world and national stage. I (along with my wonderful husband Wally) have been involved in gymnastics as a collegiate gymnast – then collegiate coach – then age group club owner/coach – then gymnastics judge. My family relocated to Texas in 1990 where everything really is bigger and better! I received my National judges rating many years ago and have enjoyed judging Texas athletes from Level 1 to Level 10 ever since and also continue judging our awesome NCAA athletes at our own TWU and others across the country. I was the TX Judges Education coordinator for several years, served on the TX USAG State Board as North Competition Chair and went on to become the state chair for USAG Texas, a job which both enriched and educated me in many ways.

In 2008 Wally and I started a tiny school called GymTricks Gymnastics in Whitney Texas and it became our outlet for working with athletes once again, teaching skills in the sport we both so loved and leading us to a better place in the education of the whole athlete's mind, body and character – something we clearly failed to do as well as we could when we were young coaches. Since we train so few hours we chose to start our gymnasts in the TAAF (Texas Amateur Athletic Association) program as it was a gentle lead in to competition levels in the USAG arena, if and when the talent and opportunity presented itself, but most important, it provided for our gym size and athlete abilities. As a five year member of the TAAF Advisory Council I helped to organize the first annual TAAF Athlete Banquet and Training Camp which was a great thing for our athletes and coaches. TAAF gymnastics membership has nearly quadrupled since 2008 and has proven to be a valuable addition to all the wonderful aspects of gymnastics Texas has to offer.

Even though I will never be a native Texan, this is my home – I love it here - and clearly, here resides the best gymnastics family I could ever have imagined. Though you are honoring me with this award I am thanking you for a fabulous experience that has enriched my life.

As a boy, I was always tumbling around Austin with an occasional trip to Crenshaw's gym to jump tramp. I moved to Houston as a young teen and became a member of Bartosch Bounders Gymnastics Team in Bellaire, Texas. A couple of my teammates at the time were Beau Biron, Charlie Teas and Gerald Bartosch. We did Clown Diving and local parades. Later, I moved to Austin and continued to tumble and trampoline during my high school years with Gerald Bartosch.

My military duty from 68 to 72 / USMC – Marines took me on one tour in Vietnam. I was the only US serviceman to build a trampoline in a combat zone – Marble Mountain, Vietnam 1970. Soon after getting out of the service, I took a full-time job at the Laguna Beach Boys Club as the Program Director for Fitness and Sport, and started a tumbling and gymnastics program there. I got married, and went on to coach gymnastics at the Vista Parks and Recreation Department and the Vista Boys Club.

In 1976 Gerald and I opened Gym-an-I Gymnastics in North Houston. Some of the coaches there were Ann Paschal Rangle, Rick Newman, Jim and Cheryl Jarrett, Jim Culhane, and Jeff Martin.

I later went to Switzerland and began to coach the Jr. National team there in the Luzern area with Lilo and Stephan Oberli. Many of the girls I trained made the 1985 World Championship Team in Montreal. After Switzerland, I took a head-coaching position at Santa Fe Gymnastics in New Mexico with Glenn and Betty Herring. I later took a job as head-coach on the Big Island of Hawaii with the Waimea Gymnastics Club. It was on the Big Island that my "Games of the World" business took root.

After I left the Big Island, I came back to Texas where I continued doing workshops and trainings with schools, YMCAs, Boy and Girls Clubs, Experiential Learning groups, Day Care programs and the like. My Games of the World business eventually lead into Summer Camp Counselor Trainings. I have been presenting these trainings for over 20 years now and they seem to be very well received.

My current project is what I call my Stackrobats or Gym Stackers. I still do a lot of training, but find time to make these little, wooden stacking gymnasts for all to play with. I like to think that at one time I made good gymnasts while coaching and now I'm still making fun gymnasts at the age of 67.

It has been my joy to be a part of the Texas gymnastics family for the last 57 years. I have made so many life-long friends in this sport. My life has been enhanced due to gymnastics and if I had it all to do again – yes I would change a few things, but for the most part, I would do it all over again.




