

Check Out Our New Look West Andersonville Gardens

West Andersonville Gardens, our community garden along Ravenswood, has a new look. Please take a stroll through the garden from Balmoral to Berwyn (or vice versa) and check it out. We've redesigned and replanted the area east of the path at Summerdale, and new shrubs and groundcover will give the area a unified look once they settle in. In addition we planted ground cover at the north end of the garden in front of two areas that were redesigned last year.

All this was possible because of the hard work of our wonderful volunteers who came on March 23rd and raked up bags of leaves (as well as composting some) and on April 28 to prune, weed and prepare one of the areas for planting. Our planting was completed on



May 19th. A special thanks goes to the manager of **Walgreens** at Clark and Catalpa, who organized associates to volunteer and donated leaf bags and refreshments.

Another special thanks goes to the students and faculty of St. Gregory the Great High School. In fulfillment of their community service hours they spent the afternoon of May 9th digging up areas to be replanted, digging out compost to enrich those areas and turning the compost pile, as well as digging out some pesky dandelions. All this was done with enthusiasm and good humor while saving us older volunteers from aching backs!

West Andersonville Gardens was created in 1995 with a grant from Greencorps, a program of the City of Chicago Department of Environment. We're in our 18th year!! The garden has been maintained



and improved for those 18 years by community volunteers with occasional assistance from Greencorps and the Chicago Botanic Garden. We always need new (and returning) volunteers to keep the garden beautiful. PLEASE JOIN US!

Trumbull School to Close

In a mass vote on May 22, the Chicago Board of Education voted unanimously to close Trumbull Elementary School (corner of Foster and Ashland), along with 48 other schools. Reasons initially given were high maintenance costs and under-utilized classrooms. The school has been undergoing a turnaround, though, with a new principal, newly elected local school council and dramatically increasingly test scores.

Local School Council member Ali Burke was part of the fight to contest the Chicago Public Schools' characterization of Trumbull as half empty; rather, she said, it's at more than 80 percent capacity when you account for the special-ed kids. The large Special Education (SPED) program (33%, according to the CPS) was inadequately taken into account in the utitilization assessment for Trumbull: when its SPED program is accounted for, the school is at 80% utilization. Months ago, CPS said it would not close schools that were at a capacity of 70 percent and higher. Further, federal and state regulations mandate strict class size limits of 7 or 13 per room, Burke said, as quoted in the *Chicago Sun-Times* on April 14, 2013, so by being "compliant with state and federal mandates, we're being punished."

According to LincolnSquarePatch.com on May 22, Alderman Patrick O'Connor spoke against the school's closure. O'Connor argued that the figure quoted by CPS on maintenance of the building was largely exaggerated.

A group of parents — backed by the Chicago Teachers Union — want to delay the closures and pursue this fight in court. They say in two class-action lawsuits that black and disabled students will be unfairly affected by the closures. Judge John Z. Lee declined request to issue a preliminary injunction against the closures before the school year ends, but he said he would hear evidence at a hearing starting July 16.



St. Gregory the Great Woman of the Year 2013 Frieda Mkrtschjan

Long time West Andersonville resident Frieda Mkrtschjan has been named "Woman of the Year" by the Catholic Council of Women of St. Gregory the Great Catholic Church.

On Saturday May 11th, several members of St. Gregory the Great Catholic Church attended a banquet hosted by Catholic Council of Women at White Eagle Banquet Hall in Niles, Illinois,



to honor fourteen "Women of the Year" nominated by their respective Chicago area parishes. Also in attendance were ten members of Mrs. Mkrtschjan's family.

Frieda Mkrtschjan, mother of seven, was recognized for her dedicated service on the Social Care Committee of St. Gregory which provides visits to shut-ins

and Thanksgiving and Christmas care packages for those in need. She was presented with a pin and a plaque which was inscribed with these words: "A Woman of Distinction in a Journey of Faith with Love." We are all very proud of her and inspired by her service to others.

Get to Know WANT's Business Members Dream Big's Lisa Lang

Since 4th grade, Lisa Lang knew there were two things she wanted to be: a teacher and an actor. Family and friends were always asking. why not put the two things together? Lang didn't foresee creating Dream Big Performing Arts Workshop, an Andersonville-based business that now teaches students ages 2-18 in afterschool classes, in-school residencies, camps, birthday parties and performance opportunities.

Lang started as an elementary school teacher, but before long, she created a K-4th grade drama program at her school. Within two years, Lang's success inspired her to offer more classes to the larger community, and her company, Dream Big, was born. Her first class in January 2006 in Andersonville had just four students. The first years

were a slow struggle, but steady growth in interest, enrollment and enthusiasm convinced Lang to stick to it. In 2007, she implemented programming at Peirce School, which, shortly after, grew into more schools. In 2008, she added week-long drama-themed summer camps and she's been adding opportunities ever since.

Lang credits much of Dream Big's success to partnerships. First Free Church in Andersonville is a popular summer camp location. First Free also hosted Dream Big's collaborative effort during last fall's teacher strike to provide emergency childcare. Chase Park nearby has allowed Dream Big to offer additional classes at a lower cost. Source 4, a consortium of four separate businesses, provides day-long and week-long camps in which students rotate through activities.

Lang concludes, "Not only do we make sure we are delivering the best drama programming around through best practice and hiring teachers who work amazingly well with kids to develop character, confidence, and collaboration skills, but we focus on what really

matters by listening to the needs and interests of our students and parents, building relationships, and staying flexible.... All the other things have a way of falling into place."

Today, Lang employs around 20 teachers a session, teaching over 30 classes to approximately 300 students per week, all while running Dream Big out of her home in Andersonville. Follow all the company's new partnerships and plans at http://www.dreambigperformingarts.com.


There has been no new development with the Edgewater Medical Center. The Waveland Partner Group, which submitted a plan acceptable to the city, has not yet found a developer to proceed with the plan.

As noted in the last WANT newsletter, the LUZ committee did approve a plan for the former Ravensweed Pub. A building permit has been posted on the site describing the three story, six unit condo building. As of this date, construction has not begun.

Traffic congestion on Ravensweed during Montessori School dismissal was discussed at the last WANT general meeting, and a solution has not yet been resolved. A modified dismissal plan by the school failed to relieve the congestion. The WANT board continues to work with the school and the Chicago Police Department to solve the problem.

The Trumbull School will be closed June 24th. The building cannot be a charter school this coming school year. It will be vacated and locked up
