### Many Helping Hands Keep West Andersonville Garden Beautiful

Enjoy a stroll this spring through West Andersonville Gardens, our community garden, which runs along Ravenswood from Berwyn to Balmoral. When you do, you'll enjoy the newly "rechipped" strolling path which unites the garden from north to south. Please also note the newly replanted area south of Balmoral which features variegated red twig dogwoods. And of course the trees, shrubs and ground covers which grow more gorgeous every year.

All of this is made possible by the work of community volunteers like you. A total of over 75 volunteers came to help on five different workdays this spring. (Those of us who came on all 5 days count as



"5" in this total!). Some saw our signs and came to help. Others were part of groups who volunteered their help. Special thanks go to the manager of Walgreens at Clark and Catalpa. She saw our sign posted on their community bulletin board, called to see what help we needed and followed up by organizing a crew to come help us. Walgreens also donated refreshments and yard waste bags. Employees at Target on Broadway north of Montrose contacted us to participate as well.

Students at St. Gregory's High School played an important part in our spring renewal as well. They came with their instructor on a specially organized Wednesday workday to delineate the garden path by digging out the grass which had narrowed the path. This is a task for which the strength of a group of young men was much appreciated! Another energetic group were the Brownie Scouts of Troop 23008. Their leader saw our signs and brought a group of girls to help.

Donations from community members are also an important part of keeping the garden beautiful. The planting of dogwoods was supported by an anonymous donation made to the garden last year.

We need your help as well to keep West Andersonville Gardens beautiful. If you enjoy the garden, please follow the example of the wonderful volunteers who made possible our spring rejuvenation and join us at one of our upcoming workdays or work evenings. Just an hour of your time will help. We'll be weeding, pruning and sometimes planting. No gardening experience is needed; instruction and tools are available.



### Midsommarfest 2012

Opens Friday, June 8!

Andersonville's Midsommarfest 2012 kicks off on June 8! For the first time, Midsommarfest now will include a small Friday evening kick-off that benefits the Andersonville Development Corporation (ADC) and eco-Andersonville.

ADC is expanding its partnership with local schools. Pierce, Trumbull, St. Gregory, and Rogers Park Montessori will all receive a portion of beer sales from the event. Parents and supporters of the schools will be around during the weekend volunteering at the Chamber beer booths. Ten percent of net beer profits will go to the schools.

Midsommarfest this year also includes a promotion for retail businesses: shoppers who make a \$30 or greater purchase at any Andersonville retailer or personal service provider (hair care, chiropractic, massage, ect) during the Friday, Saturday and Sunday of Midsommarfest will receive a coupon for a free beer or soda at the event. Purchases from restaurants and bars are not redeemable, but retail purchases can be combined to meet the \$30 minimum. Limit one per person.

At Clark & Balmoral, the Out Rock Stage makes its Midsommarfest debut, showcasing local singer/songwriters. Cultural performances will be held at the Swedish Stage (Clark & Foster) and the Summerdale Stage (Clark & Summerdale).

The Swedish American Museum is sponsoring the Swedish Stage at Foster and Clark. Celebrate Midsummer with traditional dancing around the Maypole and music; beginning at Saturday at 11:30. 


