# West Andersonville Gardens Grows More Beautiful

# Spring is just around the corner.

(Yes, it really is!) When the crocuses pop up, enjoy a stroll through West Andersonville Gardens, our community garden along Ravenswood from Berwyn to Balmoral.

When you do, you'll see a new garden centerpiece at Summerdale Avenue.

This centerpiece includes a raised bed constructed with flagstone slabs, accent plantings and a wooden trellis covering the fence. The renovation of the center of the garden began in 2006 with a grant from the Chicago Botanic Garden and was completed in 2007 with assistance from GreenCorps, a project of the City of Chicago. As you stroll, you'll be able to sit and relax on a bench and listen to the bird songs. Our work in 2007 also included planting some new types of trees – you'll love the river birch – along with removal of diseased trees. We also invested many "person hours" in opening up the area just north of the sidewalk at Berwyn and making a pedestrian path through that area. Please enjoy it all!


West Andersonville Gardens was created in 1995 with a grant from GreenCorps and has been maintained and improved for the 13 years since by community volunteers. Our proven track record of maintaining our garden is what allowed us to receive these recent grants. We always need new (and returning) volunteers to keep the garden beautiful. If you've enjoyed strolling through the garden, walking your dog, even just driving by, we hope you'll join us to help keep the garden beautiful. We always start our gardening year with a "Spring Clean-Up" – picking up trash; raking and bagging leaves and sticks; and weeding and pruning. 

# Land Use & Zoning

For those new to the neighborhood and/or paying more attention to the development and construction in our area, here are the guidelines the Land Use & Zoning committee uses:

#### If the work being done:

- · Changes the USE of land and/or buildings (i.e. from residential use to commercial use, or vice versa), and/or
- · Increases the SIZE of an existing building, and/or
- · Is NEW construction

#### Call WANT at 312.409.0141 with the following info:

- · Leave your name and phone number
- · Exact address/location of the property
- · A description of what the required permit says (it's legally required to be posted on the property)
- · Describe the changes in use, size or if the construction is new.

This information will be forwarded to the Land Use & Zoning Committee for review. *Don't assume someone else has called it in!* 

Please let us know so we can work together.

# Land Use & Zoning Committee Report

Philip Casagrande & Susana Darwin, Co-Chairs
On the evening of February 11, LUZ co-chairs Phil Casagrande and Susana Darwin
met with Alderman O'Connor for our regular quarterly check-in.

Things are fairly quiet in our neighborhood regarding development. The weather had delayed building all across the Chicago area, but the folks at **In Fine Spirits** are putting the finishing touches on their wine bar at 5418 Clark, and WANT LUZ approved the addition of a beer garden to the west of **Marty's** at 1511 Balmoral on January 21. The licensure of this area of service is separate from that of the sidewalk seating area.

We were told us that development of a nature preserve area along the western edge of Rosehill Cemetery is proceeding slowly.

We have a good deal of pedestrian traffic in our neighborhood, so LUZ reminds residents to remove snow from sidewalks. Chicago Municipal Code requires that "every owner, lessee, tenant, occupant or other person having charge of any building or lot of ground in the city abutting upon any public way or public place shall remove the snow and ice from the sidewalk in front of such building or lot of ground . . . The snow which falls or accumulates during the day (excepting Sundays) before 4 PM shall be removed within three hours after the same has fallen or accumulated. The snow which falls or accumulates on Sunday or after 4 PM and during the night on other days shall be removed before 10 AM" (section 10-8-180)

Last, we pose the question, "What value might WANT area residents and residents who live on Balmoral between Ravenswood and Ashland specifically see in adding traffic control devices to Balmoral?" Devices include speed humps, roundabouts, or curb treatments to affect drivers' speed.

# IRS News Release: Beware of SCAMS

**WASHINGTON** - The IRS today warned taxpayers to beware of several current e-mail and telephone scams that use the IRS name as a lure. The IRS expects such scams to continue through the end of tax return filing season and beyond. Their goal is to trick people into revealing personal and financial information, such as Social Security, bank account or credit card numbers, which they use to commit identity theft. Beware of these scams listed below.

#### "Rebate" Phone Call

In this scam, consumers receive a phone call from someone identifying themself as an IRS employee and is told that he is eligible for a sizable rebate for filing his taxes early. He then states that he needs your bank account information for the direct deposit of the rebate. If you refuse, you are told that you cannot receive the rebate. **This phone call is a scam!** The IRS does not provide advance payments to taxpayers or force taxpayers to use direct deposit. Those who opt for direct deposit do so by completing the appropriate section of their tax return, with bank routing and account information, when they file; the IRS does not gather the information by telephone.

#### "Refund" e-Mail

There are several variations of a refund-related e-mail which falsely claims to come from the IRS, tells the recipient they are eligible for a tax refund for a specific amount, and instructs them to click on a link to access a refund claim form. The form asks the recipient to enter personal information that the scamsters can then use to access the e-mail recipient's bank or credit card account.

The current version of the refund scam includes two paragraphs that appear to be directed toward tax-exempt organizations that distribute funds to other organizations or individuals. The e-mail contains the name and supposed signature of the Director of the IRS's Exempt Organizations business division. This e-mail is a phony. Filing a tax return is the only way to apply for a tax refund; there is no separate application form. Taxpayers who wish to find out if they are due a refund from their last annual tax return filing may use the "Where's My Refund?" interactive application on the IRS Web site.

#### The only official IRS Web site is located at www.irs.gov.

#### "Audit" e-Mail

This e-mail notifies the recipient that his or her tax return will be audited. It may contain a salutation in the body addressed to the specific recipient by name. Most scam e-mails seen by the IRS are sent using the same technique used by spammers, in which hundreds of thousands of messages are sent to potential victims based on Internet address. Because of the volume, the typical scam e-mail is not personalized. This e-mail instructs the recipient to click on links to complete forms with personal and account information, which the scammers will use to commit identity theft. **This e-mail is a phony.** The IRS does not send unsolicited, tax-account related e-mails to taxpayers.

#### "Changes to Tax Law" e-Mail (a virus)

This e-mail is addressed to businesses, accountants & "Treasury" managers. It instructs them to download information on tax law changes by clicking on a series of links to publications on businesses, estate taxes, excise taxes, exempt organizations and IRAs and other retirement plans. The IRS believes that clicking on a link downloads malware onto the recipient's computer. Malware is malicious code that can take over the victim's computer hard drive, giving someone remote access to the computer, or it could look for passwords and other information and send them to the scamster. The urls contained in the link are not legitimate IRS Web addresses. All IRS.gov Web page addresses begin with http://www.irs.gov/.

#### "Paper Check" Phone Call

A caller claims to be an IRS employee who is calling because the IRS sent a check to the individual being called. He states that because the check has not been cashed, the IRS wants to verify the individual's bank account number. In reality, the IRS leaves it entirely up to the individual to choose to cash or not cash a paper check. The IRS does not ask for bank account information, except when taxpayers indicate on their tax return that they are opting for direct deposit of their refund. It is the individual's responsibility to provide the IRS with the correct bank routing & account numbers on the tax return; the IRS does not contact taxpayers to verify the information.



# Hndersonville

Part II (1850-1905)

Transportation was crucial to the growth of West Andersonville. In the earliest days, local truck farmers used Green Bay Road (now Clark St) to drive to the Water Street market in horse drawn wagons. Stables dotted the area and a few residents owned horses and carriages. Deliveries, even groceries, were by horse drawn wagons. The advent of the bicycle made some local transportation possible, such as the delivery of newspapers.

The first major advance affecting West Andersonville was the construction of the "Summerdale" depot just north of Foster on the Chicago and North Western Railroad's Milwaukee division in early 1875. Prior to that, West Andersonville residents would have to walk to the Rosehill depot at Cemetery Drive or to the Ravenswood depot at Wilson for a train.

Trains ran at ground level until sometime in the late 1899s when the tracks were elevated to just north of Balmoral. In 1908-09 they were elevated through to Evanston. By 1894, 44 weekday trains stopped at Summerdale! The stop was eliminated in 1958.

The next advance was the streetcar line along Clark Street. It began in 1889 or 1890 as a horse car shuttle between Lawrence and Devon. To travel to the downtown business district, patrons would board the horse car and then transfer to another horse car at Lawrence for the journey south to Diversey, where they would transfer again to the cable car for the final leg. And they had to pay two nickel fares for the privilege. It was cheaper by half to walk to Lawrence. The transfer to the cable car lasted until the fall of 1906 when the journey could be made on an electric powered streetcar. Buses replaced streetcars on Clark Street in the late 1950s.

Most of the development of West Andersonville and Clark St. followed after 1905. Clark developed into a Swedish business district with bakeries, a newspaper, jewelry, clothing and grocery stores, which were built alongside the original pubs and pharmacies. Eventually, the Clark Street Businessmen's association was formed.

In the late1950s, Grant Johnson, one of these businessmen, suggested that the district reestablish the name Andersonville for the street. In the early 1960s, the organization changed its name to the Andersonville Chamber of Commerce. Closely following this change, many neighborhood residents began to organize and work together for community improvement. In the 1970s, the West Andersonville Neighbors Together W.A.N.T. community organization was born.
