

Land Use & Zoning

For those new to the neighborhood and/or paying more attention to the development and construction in our area, here are the guidelines the Land Use & Zoning committee uses:

If the work being done:

- Changes the USE of land and/or buildings (i.e. from residential use to commercial use, or vice versa), and/or
- Increases in the SIZE of an existing building, and/or
- · Is NEW construction

Call WANT at 312.409.0141 with the following info:

- · Leave your name and phone number
- · Exact address/location of the property
- · A description of what the required permit says (it's legally required to be posted on the property)
- · Describe the changes in use, size or if the construction is new.

This information will be forwarded to the Land Use & Zoning Committee for review. Don't assume someone else has called it in!

Please let us know so we can work together.

Land Use & Zoning Committee Report

Pedestrian Safety

The WANT Land Use & Zoning Committee is coordinating with the Andersonville Chamber of Commerce, Alderman O'Connor's office, and Alderman Smith's office to have better traffic control signals installed at Clark and Balmoral. The current configuration does not indicate on all four corners in all directions for pedestrians, creating serious hazards in a high foot-traffic area. We're told that improvements should take place in '09, but we encourage area residents to weigh in on the matter via fax or e-mail to the 40th Ward (fax: 773.769.3804; ward40@cityofchicago.org) or the **Chamber** (fax: 773.728-6488; eshepard@andersonville.org).

The LUZ Committee recently agreed to lobby to have the pedestrian crosswalk at Ashland and Gregory moved from the south side of the intersection, where those on foot must cross a left-turn lane in addition to the rest of traffic, to the north side of the intersection. Pedestrians are safter crossing with the light at Bryn Mawr, but for those who don't have the time or inclination to go out of their way, this would seem to be a reasonable improvement.

Traffic control lights for the Ashland/Catalpa intersection are still slated, but it's up to the County now to perform the installation.

Ravenswood Repaved! The City resurfaced Ravenswood south of Balmoral earlier in the fall. Enjoy the smooth ride, everyone.



Worms Ate My Garbage!

In September, I had the opportunity to contribute to the beautiful West Andersonville Gardens. A bucket of my worm compost castings has been added to the soil around the newest plants at Summerdale & Ravenswood. Using my kitchen scraps to revitalize the soil in my own neighborhood feels great. The efforts I am making to recycle my kitchen waste and feed it to my composting worms seem so small and yet so important. The cycle of life continues and I am a part of it as well as a part of my local community and the community of the earth.

My home composting began after a visit to California where I learned about the amazing process of vermiculture (composting with worms). Though I was aware of the important role worms play in aerating our soil, I was not aware of their amazing skills as "composters".

Seeing them at work in a bin kept in my friends home fascinated me. Clean, easy to maintain and virtually odorless! Well the earthy smell of the castings actually smelled great! Upon my return, I searched for the right bin to begin my composting here in my Andersonville apartment.

I had always assumed that I could not compost in the city. Little did I know that there were methods other than the traditional backyard tumbler that work great in urban settings.

Working together with the worms shows us the interconnectedness of all beings. What we often consider trash is a meal for the worms. While reducing our waste, we return much needed nutrients to the earth in their castings. Using less plastic bags minimizes landfill. Being mindful of the worms diet, we may even become aware of our own dietary choices. We see that chemicals used in some inks, and pesticides on produce may be harmful to us as well as to the worms. Our growing awareness is essential for the health of the earth and future generations. "Worms Ate my Garbage" and keep eating and eating! Do worms eat your garbage?
