# Land Use & Zoning

Co-Chairs Susana Darwin & Phil Casagrande

Repair work is under way to on the leaking storm drain at 1616 W **Rascher**, and crews have prepared the roadway at **1730 W Rascher for** major work on a pavement collapse. Residents and WANT LUZ have been working to get Streets & Sanitation to address the **pavement** collapse at 1768 W Balmoral, but no action on that has occurred yet.

After negotiating among Alderman O'Connor's office, WANT LUZ, and neighborhood residents, the City granted an outdoor patio license to the Ravenswood Pub, 5455 North Ravenswood, in late September. New landscaping will enhance noise abatement for the outdoor space, and Neumann's parking lot will serve for overflow in the evenings.

48th Ward Ald. Mary Ann Smith has proposed changes to traffic in Andersonville area streets, apparently based on a wreck in which a teen lost control of her car and drove it into Smith's across-the-street neighbor's house. The full list of changes, as we understand them, are:

- · making Catalpa, Balmoral, and Berwyn two-way streets
- · creating a cul-de-sac at Balmoral and Broadway
- · creating a cul-de-sac at Catalpa and Ashland
- · turning the stretch of Berwyn between Ashland and Clark into apermanent car-free plaza

#### The WANT Land Use & Zoning Committee opposed the proposal, based on the following concerns:

- **1.** Cul-de-sacs are safety/security hazards for residents, because where police can't get their squad cars through, they don't patrol.
- 2. The proposed changes would funnel traffic north to Bryn Mawr and south to Foster, and both are already sorely congested. Traffic is like water in that it will find its way, and especially given the proposed streetscaping on Lawrence that will reduce traffic to one lane each way between Western & Ashland (and possibly farther east, as well), surface streets need to be as widely available for travel as possible. The current one-way pattern serves to control but not choke traffic flow. Further, the proposal would create difficulty for drivers on Clark who wish to make their way past where a cul-de-sac might be.
- **3.** The proposal poses a **threat to businesses** on the streets in question that depend on stop-through sales, like Ranalli's and Starbuck's.
- **4.** Some Committee members are concerned about the process by which the proposal has been presented to neighborhood groups-as a fait accompli rather than as a dialogue about balancing the relationship between car, bicycle, and foot traffic.

- · Leave your name & phone number · Exact address/location of the property
- A description of what the required permit says
- Describe the changes in use, size or if the construction is new.
