# JOIN US TO CELEBRATE 20 YEARS OF COMMUNITY GARDENING IN WEST ANDERSONVILLE GARDENS



West Andersonville Gardens turns 20 this year. Yes, 20 years of bringing beauty to the community; 20 years of hard work; 20 years of creating an ever changing work of art. Everyone who supported and enjoyed the community garden during those 20 years is invited to join us for a celebration: Saturday, June 20 at 12:30 in the garden at Ravenswood and Summerdale, north of the big cottonwood tree. We'll enjoy drinks, food and pictures of the garden over the years.

Make the celebration even more meaningful by joining us between 9:00 and noon as we replant the area south of the pedestrian tunnel at Berwyn. We'll be creating a new design using plants purchased with the railroad's reimbursement for plants destroyed during the track construction. We'll have lots of plants and we'll need lots of helpers. Please join us for this fun project. Absolutely no gardening experience is necessary. We have tools and gloves for your use; feel free to bring your own as well. In the event of storms, the planting and celebration will be held Sunday, June 21.



# LAND USE AND ZONING COMMITTEE **OUARTERLY REPORT**

Recently, the Alderman's office has posted news regarding two of the most important LUZ topics in the neighborhood: Trumbull and the EMC site. On May 26th, the alderman mentions in his e-newsletter, regarding the Trumbull School, "The only thing holding up the RFP now is the fact that the Chicago Board of Education is contemplating using the building for a school purpose." While that exact purpose is not disclosed, it is implied by the overall tone of the newsletter it would not become a charter school. News of the EMC site was headlined on May 15th. Renderings of a 141 unit complex utilizing some of the existing buildings and some new structures were posted via a link on the newsletter. # EDGEWATER HISTORICAL SOCIETY FOUNDER RECEIVES PRESTIGIOUS DAUGHTERS OF THE AMERICAN REVOLUTION AWARD


The National Society Daughters of the American Revolution presented the DAR Historic Preservation Medal to Kathy Gemperle, founding president of the Edgewater Historical Society on June 13 at the Roosevelt Branch of the Chicago Public Library. The award goes to individuals who have done extraordinary work in historic preservation over a long period of time. Members of the Culper Ring Agent 355 Chapter of the National Society of Daughters of the American Revolution are proud to recognize Kathy's work with the Edgewater Historical Society and the Lakewood Balmoral Historic District.

Kathy's efforts in historic preservation began in the early 1980s with historic walking tours and educational programs about neighborhood history that she brought to various neighborhoods in Edgewater. For 27 years she has chaired the Edgewater Historical Society Home Tour which features a different neighborhood each year with a focus on history and preservation of historic homes. Kathy has commented "All my efforts in preservation have focused on a sense of community and a sense of place that community history gives to all its residents. I am thrilled to be honored in this way for the work that I love doing in Edgewater."

# A HISTORY OF WEST ANDERSONVILLE GARDENS:

The area which is now the garden was for many years a weedy trash heap. WANT organized a clean up each spring and occasionally neighbors moved the grass. Then a woman started planting near Berwyn. This inspired WANT members to contact Alderman O'Connor to see if the city could offer help with beautifying the space. That help came in the form of participation in the GreenCorps program. This program offered training, plants and manpower to community organizations. We were one of the very first GreenCorps gardens. Four of us spent the winter of 1995 attending classes which covered topics such as community organizing, garden design and choosing plants. We spent the spring and summer organizing folks to clean up the area and publicizing the project. Then in September, GreenCorps arrived with truckloads of trees and shrubs and trained folks to help us plant. We supplied the community volunteers and lots of good food. Our plan was to create a strolling garden featuring trees which are seldom seen in the city such as Kentucky Coffee, Gingko and Paper Bark Maple. The number of folks who stroll through the garden each week are proof of the success of that plan!

In the 20 years since, we've had other assistance from GreenCorps and the Chicago Botanic Garden for major project such as the trellis and raised bed at Summerdale and the benches. But our community volunteers and the support of WANT have always been and continue to be what make West Andersonville Gardens a place of beauty for all to enjoy.
