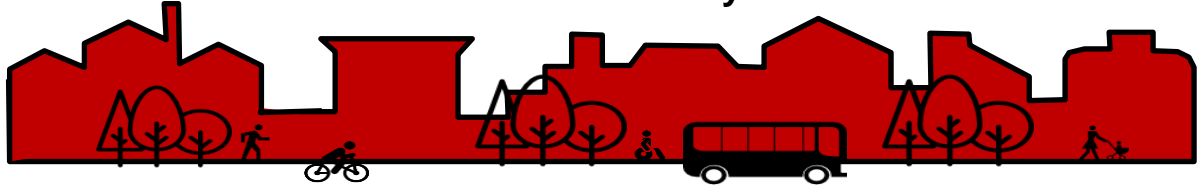

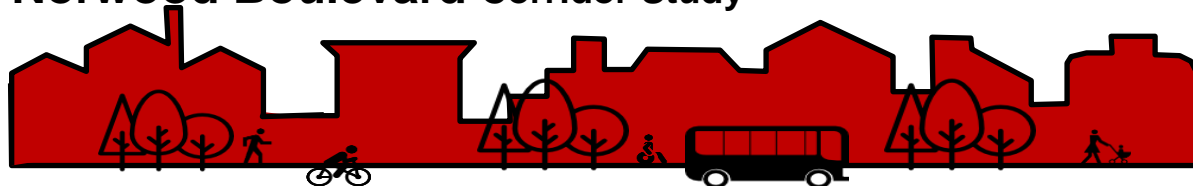

More about the study

In recognition of the importance of the diverse needs of all of those who use Norwood Boulevard, the City of Edmonton is undergoing a design process to recreate Norwood Boulevard. This work will follow the City's Main Street Guidelines, along with public input, to develop a new vision for Norwood Boulevard between 109 Street and 82 Street.

The study will focus on:

- establishing a unified vision for the future of Norwood Boulevard
- updating current land use policies
- improving transportation (particularly for pedestrians and cyclists)
- promoting new design policies and other changes to help create a street of exceptional quality for all people to work, live, learn and play.

Project Goal

To recreate Norwood Boulevard into an innovative, vibrant and relevant **streetscape** that will strive to balance the needs of the community, commuters, businesses and visitors, and meet the Main Street Guidelines.
