A popular misconception about missions ministry in Europe is that it is easy. In reality, there are many challenges. Consider the Balkans. Nations like Macedonia and Romania lie at the juncture of Eastern and Western cultures and religions and have long histories of conflict. One missionary in that region is also facing opposition from radical Islamic groups.

As for presenting the gospel to Muslims, we see our greatest opportunity materializing through the floods of refugees coming into Europe. They are

want to go beyond assisting with immediate physical needs in the camps and move in Spirit-anointing to powerfully impact these people. More Muslims are coming to Christ among these refugees than in many years of outreach across the Muslim world.

I really pray our AG worldwide family can learn to look beyond all the geopolitical arguments over the threat of radical Islam and the marginalization of these refugees and begin to intentionally work at fulfilling the Great Commission among them and establishing sustainable church plants to serve them.

We are reaching out to refugees at seven locations across Europe and working to develop a long-term sustainable plan to plant churches with our AG national partners. We

We continue to have great success in sharing the gospel with Europe's other immigrants and expatriate communities, particularly through the establishment of international churches. But the growth of our international churches only brings into greater light the deep spiritual need among the native European majority



that is primarily secular and agnostic in its beliefs.

The largest mainline "religion," if you will, is secularism. We are working on a strategy to reach and connect with the estimated half-billion secularists who want nothing to do with religion and at best have only a marginal interest in spiritual things. 🙏
