Little League World Series

August 18-28 (ABC, ESPN, ESPN2)

A future generation of baseball stars will be on display at the 65th Little League World Series. After more than 45,000 games among 7,000 teams throughout the summer, the field has been narrowed down to 16 squads that will make the trip to the tournament in South Williamsport, Pennsylvania. The Little League World Series (LLWS) has been a launching pad for a number of professional athletes, such as these three stars:



Rasmus was the starting pitcher for Phenix City
(Alabama) when it won the U.S. championship in
1999. Because pitchers are not allowed to throw
in consecutive games at the LLWS, Rasmus
played first base in the final game, a 5–0 loss
to Osaka, Japan.



Drury wasn't always just a star on the ice. He grew up playing both hockey and baseball. In the 1989 Little

League World Series championship game, he pitched a complete game and drove in two runs to lead his team, from Trumbull, Connecticut, to a 5–2 victory over a squad from Kaohsiung, Taiwan.



Varitek led his team, from Altamonte Springs, Florida, to the 1984 Little League World Series final. (Altamonte

Springs fell to Seoul, South Korea, 6–2 in that game.) The catcher is one of only two players to play in the Little League World Series, the College World Series, and the major league World Series. — Eric Levenson
