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Gone West Brings Together Western Artists in World Premiere Production

A world premiere creation by Wonderbound Artistic Director Garrett Ammon featuring new music by Denver musician Ian Cooke and original poetry by Lighthouse Writers Workshop Michael J. Henry, Gone West will take you on a true Western journey - April 4-13

DENVER (February 24, 2014) - This April, Wonderbound invites audiences to experience a brand new creation that is best described as a cross between Shakespeare's *The Tempest* and a KOA campground. A collaborative work featuring the choreography of Garrett Ammon, music of Ian Cooke and poetry of Michael J. Henry, *Gone West* will close Wonderbound's 2013-2014 season.

"Each time I have worked with Michael J. Henry, he has pushed me to new and unexpected places. *Gone West* is no exception. Mike has brought a collection of beautifully flawed humans to life in these new poems," said Ammon. "Having Ian Cooke and his band join us on this adventure is adding an entirely new dimension. Ian's music is as layered as Mike's characters, creating a richness and depth that is utterly inspiring. It is a privilege to work with such dedicated and honest artists."

In 2008, Ammon and Lighthouse Writers Workshop Executive Director Michael J. Henry embarked on a creative relationship that has produced two celebrated works, *When the Power Goes Out* (2009) and *Intersection* (2009), that meld dance with the written word. This third full-length collaboration will feature 11 new poems by Henry.

"Poets don't usually collaborate or even consider their audiences," said Henry, "we just write something and hope that people read it. This production is more dynamic, fun and ambitious than anything else I have done to date. Garrett and the dancers are able take my writing and make it come alive, adding depth and nuances that I had never even thought of. Working with Garrett is truly the highlight of my career as a writer."

Gone West will feature Denver musician Ian Cooke and his band live, and Cooke has composed 10 new

songs for this production.

"My inspiration for Gone West comes from the relationships humans have with each other, and with the earth. I think periodical exposure to raw, unfiltered nature gives us clarity and helps us sort out our issues." Cooke said, "Nature can be harsh, but even when it causes traumatic events, it helps us evolve. Developing this theme with Wonderbound and Michael J. Henry is a joyous process. I feel that telling this story together through dance, poetry, and music is one of the best, most human ways to do so."

As always, the public is encouraged to experience the performers, not only at the official shows throughout the season, but in their rehearsal space in the heart of Denver. Visitors are asked to call to confirm rehearsal schedules.

Gone West will take place April 4-6 at the Performing Arts Complex at Pinnacle Charter School and April 12 and 13 at the Parker Arts, Culture and Events Center. Garrett Ammon is an acclaimed choreographer who began his tenure as artistic director of Wonderbound (formerly Ballet Nouveau Colorado) in 2007. Ammon has been honored as a Bonfils-Stanton Foundation Livingston Fellow (2011); named one of Denver Westword's "Ten People to Watch in 2013" and is the recipient of the 2013 Mayor's Award for Excellence in the Arts.

A prolific dancemaker, serial collaborator and self-professed tech geek; Ammon has created over 50 dance works over the past fourteen years. He has conspired with artists across an array of disciplines and developed a trademark aesthetic that seamlessly blends tradition with adventurous new ideas. Ammon's deep creative relationship with poet Michael J. Henry has produced When the Power Goes Out (2009) and the multimedia, evening length production Intersection (2009). In 2014, Ammon and Henry will work with musician Ian Cooke to create the all new full length piece Gone West.

In 2013, after the successful creation of *Vagabond Hill* (2011), Ammon and Denver Singer/Songwriter Jesse Manly again joined forces this time, with Illusionist Professor Phelyx, to create the full-length piece *A Gothic Folktale*. Other recent works include, *Odessa with* Ofer Ben-Amots and Colorado College; the Klezmer-fusion piece, *Memories and Well Grounded Hopes* with Hal Aqua and The Lost Tribe; and an international collaborative work with Israel's Liat Dror Nir Ben Gal Dance Company along with the Mizel Arts & Culture Center.

Ammon lives in Denver, Colorado with his wife and muse Dawn Fay. They have worked alongside each other continuously since they first met in 1999.

lan Cooke has appeared in SPIN magazine, Finished #1 in the Denver Post Music Poll in 2009, and has been voted Best Avant-Pop for 3 years by Westword Magazine. He also plays cello on Crooked Fingers' album Forfeit/Fortune and his two songs appeared alongside Billy Bragg, Owen Pallett, and M Ward on 'Versions of Joanna' – a Joanna Newsom covers-album.

He has toured in the US and Australia playing with: The Dresden Dolls, Crooked Fingers, Built to Spill, The Decemberists, The Flaming Lips (Monolith Festival), Blonde Redhead, Devotchka, Rasputina, Wovenhand,

Michael Henry is co-founder and Executive Director of Lighthouse Writers Workshop, an independent literary center located in downtown Denver. His poetry and nonfiction have appeared in places such as 5280 Magazine, Georgetown Review, Threepenny Review, Pleiades, Copper Nickel, and Rio Grande Review. Over the years, he's received fellowships from the Colorado Council on the Arts and PlatteForum. He has an MFA in creative writing from Emerson College an undergraduate degree in English from University of Rochester, and currently teaches poetry and nonfiction writing at Lighthouse and University of Denver.

A collection of poetry, *No Stranger Than My Own*, was published by Conundrum Press in 2010, and a new book of poems, *Active Gods*, is due out in early 2014. Since 2008, Michael has developed a creative partnership with Garrett Ammon, award-winning choreographer and artistic director at Wonderbound, and together they've created two verse narrative ballets, *When the Power Goes Out* and *Intersection*.
